Good morning Chair Keith-Agaran, Vice Chair Rhoads and members of the Committee on Judiciary and Labor. Ms. Okinaka has been serving as Chair of the Council's Finance Committee, on an interim basis. She works with the fiscal staff to review the financials and reports at the quarterly board meetings. Ms. Okinaka's extensive experience in finance and management information systems in the private sector make her a valuable resource to the WDC.

I respectfully urge you to confirm Ms. Okinaka as a member of the Workforce Development Council where her financial acumen would help to maintain the fiscal health of the Council.
