Ms. Moy is a member of the Hawaii Business Roundtable and serves on the boards of directors of Bank of Hawaii, Aloha United Way and the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii.

Ms. Moy's extensive experience in the energy industry in the private sector make her a valuable resource to the WDC as energy has been identified as an in-demand industry for next several years.
