TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL 1129, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO SPECIAL DUTY FOR DEPUTY SHERIFFS

Chair Luke, Vice Chair Cullen, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) **supports** House Bill (HB) 1129, House Draft (HD) 1, which proposes to statutorily authorize what is commonly known as "special duty" services, wherein deputy sheriffs serve the community by providing off-duty law enforcement services for monetary compensation to persons, organizations, and government entities other than the State Department of Public Safety (PSD). HB 1129, HD 1 further proposes that PSD update and revise its policies and procedures governing the processing of special duty requests and establish a compensation schedule for law enforcement services provided by deputy sheriffs performing special duty work.

Deputy sheriffs have long provided off-duty law enforcement work as a service to the community in a wide variety of areas. For example, deputy sheriffs routinely provide security presence at the State Department of Tax and Labor Relations building during business hours; collegiate and high school sporting and extra-curricular events at the University of Hawaii, Aloha Stadium, Department of Education school fields, and private school venues; the State Capitol during the Testimony on HB 1129, HD 1 House Committee on Finance February 28, 2017 Page 2

primary and general elections; as well as privately sponsored events enjoyed by the public such as the Sony Open, to name a few.

PSD now comes before the Legislature to request the statutory authority to continue this service. We stand ready to update and revise our policy and procedures governing the processing and of such requests and our compensation schedule.

Finally, we request one revision to include in the proposed section 353C-______ (b), at the end of line 11, page 2 of HB 1129, HD 1: <u>"Department" as defined in</u> <u>section 353C-1</u>. This will provide clarity that it is PSD that shall develop the special duty policy and procedures.
