In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1173 RELATING TO A WATER IRRIGATION PILOT PROJECT

House Bill 1173 proposes to establish a one-year pilot program requiring DAGS, DOT, and DLNR to implement irrigation water conservation best management practices, as established by the Landscape Industry Council of Hawaii. Requires DAGS, DOT, and DLNR to each submit a report regarding the results of the pilot program. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) appreciates the overall concept of this bill and offers the following comments.

The Department's Division of State Parks (State Parks) would be considered by most people as the main user of water irrigation within the Department, however, as Hawaii has seasonal wet and dry climes, the vast majority of our parks do not utilize an irrigation system. As directed by State Parks' mission to preserve cultural and natural resources, when State Parks develops new areas, we make all attempts to utilize native plants adapted to the local climate which, once established, do not require supplemental irrigation.

There are four parks located on the dry side of their island that utilize an irrigation system (Hapuna Beach State Recreation Area on Hawaii, Waimea State Recreation Pier on Kauai, Sand Island State Recreation Area and Diamond Head State Monument on Oahu). These parks maintain some of the best practices as indicated in this measure. They run their irrigation systems either in the early morning or at night. Some are controlled, when able, either on a

timer, via remote, manually or some combination of both. Furthermore, it is worth noting that State Parks often simply decline to irrigate areas at all due to operational funding constraints.

While the Department appreciates the concept of the measure, currently, we would not be of benefit to a pilot program as we do not intend to increase or implement any new irrigation projects and our current practices appear to already align with the best practices.
