# WRITTEN TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL NO. 1245, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, RELATING TO CEMETERIES.

TO THE HONORABLE GILBERT S.C. KEITH-AGARAN, CHAIR, TO THE HONORABLE JILL N. TOKUDA, CHAIR, TO THE HONORABLE KARL RHOADS, VICE CHAIR, TO THE HONORABLE DONOVAN M. DELA CRUZ, VICE CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEES:

My name is Catherine Awakuni Colón, Director of the Department of Commerce

and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA" or "Department"). DCCA appreciates the opportunity to

submit testimony in support of House Bill No. 1245, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, Relating to

Cemeteries.

House Bill. No. 1245, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, proposes to address the issues that

continue to negatively impact the condition and operations of the privately held Sunset

Memorial Park Cemetery ("Sunset Memorial"). The proposed solutions in this measure

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include the creation of specific volunteer liability protections under Chapter 662D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for those persons and organizations providing voluntary upkeep and maintenance of privately owned and operated cemeteries, and also the requirement that DCCA develop both short- and long-term strategies for the upkeep, repair, and maintenance of Sunset Merorial.

The Department appreciates the Legislature's continuing leadership and support – and, in particular, the leadership of area legislators – in finding both short- and longterm solutions to the issues affecting Sunset Memorial. While DCCA continues to work on carrying out a number of solutions identified and pursued during the interim of 2016, we fully support the provisions of this measure that will reinforce ongoing efforts. In particular, the Department supports the bill's creation of a special cemetery volunteer liability protection law, which is intended to encourage members of the public who have expressed a desire to volunteer on the Sunset Memorial grounds to do so without fear of liability resulting from their charitable activities.

The Department is committed to continuing to work with area legislators, the affected community and businesses, and all others interested in finding a practical, sustainable way forward for Sunset Memorial. Accordingly, DCCA does not object to the portion of this measure that would have the Department continuing to work on developing short- and long-term strategies for Sunset Memorial in collaboration with the Department of Accounting and General Services ("DAGS"). Further, the Department appreciates the amendments made by the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health to clarify the kinds of issues that DCCA and DAGS would review

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when looking at short- and long-term solutions, and we would respectfully ask the

Committees to retain those amendments should this measure move forward.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support of this measure. I

am happy to answer any questions the Committees may have.

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To members of the Committees on Commerce, Consumer Protection and Health, Judiciary and Labor and Ways and Means, regarding Sunset Memorial Park HB1245 and SB1113:

As one of the many families affected by the conditions and mismanagement of Sunset Memorial Park, our primary concern is the maintenance of the cemetery. "Maintenance" involves four aspects: SAFETY, AESTHETICS, PLOT DIRECTORY and SECURITY.

SAFETY – The grounds are unsafe, especially for the elderly, as the terrain is extremely uneven and full of holes and is often overgrown with weeds to the extent that it's difficult to see where one is stepping.

AESTHETICS – The cemetery just looks terrible, especially in comparison with a typical cemetery. It is in nearly constant need of mowing and raking. The trash bins are virtually always overflowing, with excess trash just in piles on the ground. Numerous plots have out-of-control shrubbery and/or monuments. This is likely due to no management to establish and enforce park regulations.

PLOT DIRECTORY – It would be of great value to create and maintain a directory of the plots and niches. Out of town relatives, or even local residents, who don't visit gravesites very often have no way of quickly determining where their loved ones are buried. This is a "nice to have", but would be most welcomed.

SECURITY – There is a transient population that has taken up residency in the park. They are likely not a threat to visitors, but they do create an aura of concern, create waste and use park water. A gated/secure entry and exit points that close at sunset and a security fence around the entire perimeter would be very useful in combating the homeless, vandalism and theft problems.

I suggest the concerned families create a nonprofit organization that would support and interface with any state run entity to ensure sustained maintenance of the cemetery. This volunteer group would need to be shielded from liability from onsite injuries and accidents and also any lawsuits stemming from disgruntled families with loved ones interred.

A nonprofit group (along with all concerned families) has no knowledge, experience or desire to manage cemetery operations, such as digging graves, interment, exhumations, etc.

As a concerned family member who is willing to serve on a nonprofit organization, I respectfully request that the Legislature do everything within its power to create a mechanism to restore the dignity of Sunset Memorial Park and ensure its maintenance into perpetuity.

I've traveled from Las Vegas to Hawaii to find homeless building their tents over my father Tenisio Olive, Uncle Sani Olive and Aunt Nora Olive's grave. It was a horrific and heartbroken scene to see. I could not believe what I witnessed and how horrible the condition of the Cemetery was in as well.

The homeless had built their tents over my loved ones grave, used their graves as their bathroom. They've also built a fire pit over my father's grave where they were cooking food over it. This has caused their monument to split in half. This is disrespectful and inhumane! Their graves has sunken in and also has foul odor that lingers from within. The grass is over grown and several graves has a slap of wooden board covering where the grounds had caved in.
