Dear Representative Luke and Members of the Committee:

SUBJECT: HB 1299 HD1 – Relating to Health

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities (DD) **appreciates the intent of HB 1299 HD1, however, does not feel the passage of the bill is necessary**. The bill authorizes a pharmacy to provide a customized patient medication package to any patient of an institutional facility or any member of the general public, subject to certain conditions.

Last year similar measures (HB 1757 and SB 2390 – Relating to Health) were heard about customized patient medication packaging. With the support of Senator Rosalyn Baker, Chair of the Senate Committee on Consumer Protection and Health, the Council worked closely with Peter Oshiro, Department of Health Environmental Health Program Manager (Sanitation/Food and Drug) to assure such packaging was possible without further legislation. We learned that the driver of the measures was a pharmacist-owner who wanted to amend Hawaii Revised Statutes, Chapter 328, Section 328-15 (7) and 328-16 (a) to explicitly allow for a pharmacy to package and dispense medication for a patient that contains one or more different drugs prescribed by the patient's doctor.

Although it was with all good intentions to benefit the consumer, based on information from DOH, and their willingness to disseminate a Memo clarifying the interpretation of the Chapters mentioned above, the Council felt that there was no further need to advocate for enabling legislation. DOH created an Informational Notice dated March 17, 2016, that clarified the practice of customizing patient medication packaging.

The Council was able to share the Informational Notice with individuals who wanted their medication in customized packaging. We found Aiea Medical Center, Tamura's Pharmacy at Waianae, and Times Supermarket Pharmacies were able to offer such customized patient medication packaging.

Based on the Informational Notice from the Department of Health, and the fact some pharmacies are able and willing to provide such customized patient medication packaging, we do not feel further legislation is needed.

The Hawaii Medical Service Association (HMSA) appreciates the opportunity to testify on HB 1299, HD1, which would authorize pharmacists to provide a customized patient medication package ("package") the institutionalized patient or member of the general public. HMSA has concerns with this Bill.

HMSA's goal in the provision of pharmacy services is to ensure our members have access to affordable, high quality medication. We believe that optimal drug therapy results in positive medical outcomes, which helps to manage overall health care costs. To that end, HMSA appreciates the intent of HB 1299, HD1 - to help our members with their medication compliance.

The safety of our members is paramount. Processes must be in place to ensure the quality and safety of the pharmacy packaging process in order to decrease the potential of errors and unintended adverse events affecting our members. The process of packaging the medications also meets the highest standards. Customized patient medication packages must meet the U.S. Pharmacopeia standards and National Formulary standards.

Ensuring a sufficiently designed and staff process will involve an investment, and this will impact the cost of healthcare. Given that, we would want to ensure that this measure does not contemplate a mandate for customized patient medication packaging.

Dear Chair Luke and Members of the Committee on Finance:

We submit this testimony on behalf of Walgreen Co. ("Walgreens"). Walgreens operates stores at more than 8,200 locations in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In Hawaii, Walgreens now has 20 stores on the islands of Oahu, Maui, and Hawaii.

Walgreens **supports the intent** of HB 1299, H.D.1 which authorizes a pharmacy to provide a customized patient medication package to any patient of an institutional facility or any member of the general public under certain conditions.

Walgreens utilizes customized medication packaging in its specialty pharmacy setting in working with higher needs patients. Walgreens believes that allowing pharmacists with the ability to provide customized packaging to patients provides a convenience that will ultimately help patients with adherence to their medication.

We would note that we believe that the existing law already permits for the use of customized medication packaging in Hawaii. In addition, if the Committee moves this bill, there are technical amendments needed to ensure that the bill comports with existing language in HRS Chapters 328 and 461.
