# **RE: HB 1389, HD1, RELATING TO LIVESTOCK HARVESTING FACILITIESE (SUPPORT)**

Aloha Chair Gabbard, Vice Chair Riviere and Members of the AEN Committee:

On behalf of Hawaii Farmers & Ranchers United we collectively represent 97% of all agricultural revenue on Hawaii Island; \$194 Million out of a total of \$202 total agricultural revenue, and almost 3,000 farmers and ranchers working on 630,000 acres of land.

HFRU Strongly supports HB 1389, HD1, which makes an appropriation for the planning and design of scalable livestock harvest facilities to be expended by HDOA.

This bill is designed to provide not only needed capacity but also allow a new plant to incorporate new technologies to enhance energy and waste management, food safety and animal welfare. This also provides the potential for new certifications required by retailers and for export certification, which would open foreign markets for Hawaii beef.

By Supporting this bill, Hawaii Legislators show their Support to grow Hawaii Agriculture and create a more food secure Hawaii.
