### In consideration of HOUSE BILL 14 RELATING TO KEKAHA KAI STATE PARK

House Bill 14 proposes to appropriate funds for the employment of lifeguards and for life-saving equipment at Kua Bay within Kekaha Kai State Park on the island of Hawaii under the jurisdiction of the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department). The Department supports this measure provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact our priorities requested in the Executive Budget.

Lifeguards serve an essential function in a state surrounded by the ocean. Due to the increasing popularity at Kua Bay, it has come to the attention of the Department that there is a growing need for lifeguard services based on the increase in water safety incidents. The State does not have its own lifeguards, and contracts with the counties for those services at selected State Parks beaches. Currently, each county provides lifeguards at one State Park beach.

Two of the lifeguard contracts come out of the existing general fund allocation to State Parks and the other two contracts are paid for out of special fund income. Therefore, it is essential that any new lifeguard contract receive a new and general fund appropriation.
