Comments: Urge committee members to strongly oppose this bill as it will take away opportunities from island residents to apply and be appointed to positions for which they may be fully qualified for. As a Native Hawaiian, I have seen many qualified individuals who otherwise would've been passed over for public service and this requirement has objectively kept it fair and competitive. Our appointed authorities must do more to provide more diversity in hiring their department heads, deputies, assistants, etc. The one-year requirement gives island residents a fighting chance and it provides a unique perspective once an individual resides here and to fully appreciate the kuleana they will be given, once appointed.

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
