Subject: House Bill 1536, HD2 Relating to Irrigation

We support House Bill 1536, HD2 as it relates to the Board of Water Supply and take no position on the substantive provisions of this bill relating to the Board of Agriculture. This measure, in relevant part, excludes from the definition of "public utility" in Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), the various boards of water supply statewide and thereby cures an ambiguity regarding the chapter's application to these boards.

As the definition of "public utility" includes "the production, conveyance, etc. of water..." (<u>see</u> page 6, lines 7 to 9) this could be interpreted to mean that the various boards of water supply could subsequently be within the jurisdiction and oversight of the Hawaii Public Utilities Commission. Whereas, statewide, our management, control, and operation of the water systems are embodied in chapter 54, HRS, and on the island of Oahu, Article VII of the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu, we believe the word "water" in the definition of public utility may lead to this unintended result.

The proposed amendment on page 14, lines 11 to 15, excludes the boards of water supply from the definition of "public utility" and remedies any ambiguity regarding the chapter's application to the various boards of water supply.

Aloha Chairman Gabbard and Chairwoman Baker, and members of the Joint Committee,

The Sierra Club of Hawai'i strongly opposes HB 1536, which seeks to broadly exempt nonpotable water suppliers from PUC regulation.

Exempting nonpotable water suppliers from PUC regulation would abdicate the State's public trust duty to protect water resources. The State is mandated by the Hawai'i Constitution to ensure the conservation of all water resources and to safeguard the public's interest in water resources.¹ The State has an "affirmative duty to take the public trust into account in the planning and allocation of water resources".² Public trust obligations require that the State "recognize enduring public rights in trust resources separate from, and superior to, the prevailing private interests in the resources at any given time".³

The nonpotable water provision in this bill would allow former sugar plantation companies now controlling water resources to avoid being rightly regulated as public utilities. This means historic water diverters like Wailuku Water Company and Alexander & Baldwin (doing business as East Maui Irrigation) would not be subject to oversight by the Public Utilities Commission. PUC oversight is crucial for ensuring the state's interests in maintaining the public trust are well-protected. Residents have already raised concerns that about the mishandling of water resources.⁴ Public confidence, as well as public natural resources, would benefit from more PUC oversight of companies that distribute nonpotable water.

Thank you very much for this opportunity to provide testimony on this important issue.
