In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1578, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO CLIMATE CHANGE

House Bill 1578, House Draft 1 proposes to establish a carbon farming task force which would identify agricultural or aquacultural practices beneficial to the mitigation of climate change, to the sustainability and climate resilience of Hawaii's agriculture, as well as to water quality and reef protection. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this initiative and provides the following comments.

The Department kindly requests that forest ecosystems and agroforestry systems are added to the range of land uses and mitigation options considered by the carbon farming task force, and that a Department forestry representative be included as a member of the carbon farming task force.

The Department is charged with the stewardship and management of the State's terrestrial and aquatic areas including its natural resources. Climate change poses an imminent threat to these natural resources. As shown by research and as already practiced around the world, climate-smart agriculture can have multiple environmental and economic benefits.

Among the different land uses, forest ecosystems and long rotation systems such as agroforests, permaculture, home gardens, and boundary plantings have the capacity to sequester greenhouse gases in plant biomass and in long-lasting wood products. Many agroforestry systems can also increase below-ground carbon storage, both in plant biomass and soil organic matter. In addition

to higher rates of carbon storage, agroforestry systems provide benefits such as improved soil protection and ameliorated microclimatic conditions due to their wind break effect, improved soil fertility through higher content of soil organic matter and higher biological activity, improved nutrient cycling, reduced soil toxicities, more efficient use of solar energy, and reduced pests and diseases, by integrating trees and shrubs into agricultural practices. These benefits are consistent with the objectives of this measure.

This type of forest stewardship and management sequesters carbon and is a core responsibility of the Department's Division of Forestry and Wildlife.

Chairs Wakai and Gabbard, Vice Chairs Taniguchi and Riviere, and Members of the Senate Committees on Economic Development, Tourism, and Technology, and Agriculture and Environment.

HB 1578, HD1 establishes a carbon farming task force to identify agricultural or aquacultural activities and best practices that provide carbon sequestration benefits that may be used to establish a carbon farming certification, and establishes the task force within the Office of Planning (OP) for administrative purposes and makes an appropriation. The Director of OP or the Director's designee shall serve as chairperson of the task force.

The Office of Planning (OP) supports the intent of HB 1578, HD1, which includes consideration of OP's prior comments made on past versions of the measure, and offers the following comment for the Committees' consideration:

OP respectfully requests that an appropriation amount of \$100,000/year be inserted for both fiscal years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 in order to fully address the scope of work of the carbon farming task force. OP estimates that the proposed amount would provide for:

- a. Salary and fringe for one (1) personnel at 0.50 FTE to serve as the task force coordinator;
- b. Services related to subject matter experts to provide the task force with an understanding of the components of a carbon farming certification program;
- c. Travel funds covering task force members' reimbursable costs to attend meetings;
- d. Other administrative costs as needed: phone conferencing, office supplies, photocopying meeting materials, etc.
