The Hawaii Government Employees Association, AFSCME Local 152, AFL-CIO opposes the purpose and intent of H.B. 347, H.D. 2, S.D. 1 which changes the employment security law for independent contractors by requiring the use of twenty factors by the Department of Labor Industrial Relations. Independent contractors do not have the ability to claim for workers compensation nor can they collect unemployment insurance. Passage of this legislation will adversely affect many workers and we respectfully request the Committee to defer this measure.
