4 **Fiscal Implications:** This measure does not have fiscal implications as the position is federally

8 **Purpose and Justification:** The LTC Community Living Program Specialist position is critical

9 to sustain successful implementation of home based participant directed supports to individuals

10 at risk of nursing home placement.

11 Participant directed programs are an objective of the federal Administration for Community

12 Living's 2013 – 2018 strategic plan to promote the integration of person-centered planning and

13 participant directed supports into publicly administered programs and services. EOA is

addressing this objective by integrating it into Goal 3 of the Hawaii State Plan on Aging, to 1 2 develop a statewide Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) system for older adults and their families to access and receive long term services and supports throughout the State. The 3 Participant Directed Supports and Services Model empowers participants to direct their long-4 5 term services and supports (LTSS) to meet their needs. It also addresses challenges that rural areas in the State often face in trying to provide support services needed with limited availability 6 7 of providers by allowing participants to hire their family, friends, and members of their personal support system to provide care that meets their needs. 8 9 Participants eligible for the program are assessed utilizing a person centered planning approach, 10 then provided with a support team including financial management services and a coach to guide 11 implementation of their support plan and to assist with employer related responsibilities. The LTC Community Living Program Specialist position coordinates operational activities 12 13 related to participant directed supports and Veterans Directed Home and Community Based Services (including screening of participants, reviewing referrals, assessments, and support 14 plans; determining eligibility of potential participants, determining monthly allotment amounts; 15 16 and routing referrals to the appropriate contracted provider for assessment and coaching 17 services). **Recommendation:** EOA respectfully requests your support of HB0434 to convert the exempt 18

19 position to civil service to support individuals within our State to direct their LTSS.
