HOUSE BILL NO. 455 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chairperson Gabbard and Members of the Committee:

Thank for the opportunity to testify on House Bill 455 HD1, which proposes to prohibit the department from charging agricultural producers for the costs of food safety certification activities conducted by the department. The department has concerns with this bill, for it may have unintended consequences.

This bill prohibits the department from charging an agricultural producer for the department's cost of conducting any and all food safety certification activities under title 11, HRS. This includes all fee-for-service activities performed by the department, which are related to food safety certification, and related activities **under cooperative agreements with the USDA**. The department performs USDA Good Agricultural Practices audits, in which a portion of the fees collected by the department are paid back to the USDA for audits performed. In addition, the Department performs fee-for-service USDA shell egg resident grading activities which include plant sanitation and wash water and sanitizer monitoring, all of which are related to food safety. This bill will jeopardize our existing cooperative agreements and long standing relationship with the USDA.



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If this bill moves forward, the department will need additional funding to offset the fees owed to the USDA for fee-for-service food safety related activities.

Sections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the bill is related to the Meat Inspection Program, which the department ended in 1995 and relinquished the program back to the USDA.

HFB supports the intent of HB 455, HD1, which prohibits the Department of Agriculture from charging agricultural producers for the costs of food safety certification activities conducted by the department.

HFB appreciates the support by the legislature in our past efforts to help Hawaii's farmers achieve compliance with the FDA Food Safety and Modernization Act. As the actual rule has been rolled out by FDA the immensity of the task is becoming evident.
