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## TESTIMONY OF SCOTT E. ENRIGHT CHAIRPERSON, BOARD OF AGRICULTURE

HOUSE BILL NO. 455 HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chairperson Luke and Members of the Committee:

Thank for the opportunity to testify on House Bill 455 HD1, which proposes to prohibit the department from charging agricultural producers for the costs of food safety certification activities conducted by the department. The department has concerns with this bill, for it may have unintended consequences.

This bill prohibits the department from charging an agricultural producer for the department's cost of conducting any and all food safety certification activities under title 11, HRS. This includes all fee-for-service activities performed by the department, which are related to food safety certification, and related activities **under cooperative agreements with the USDA**. The department performs USDA Good Agricultural Practices audits, in which a portion of the fees collected by the department are paid back to the USDA for audits performed. In addition, the Department performs fee-forservice USDA shell egg resident grading activities which include plant sanitation and wash water and sanitizer monitoring, all of which are related to food safety. This bill will jeopardize our existing cooperative agreements and long standing relationship with the USDA.



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Sections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the bill is related to the Meat Inspection Program, which the department ended in 1995 and relinquished the program back to the USDA.
