TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF HOUSE BILL 491

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SIDEWALKS

Honorable Chair Aquino, Vice-Chair Quinlan and Members of the Committee on Transportation, the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Hawai'i submits the following testimony in support of House Bill No. 491.

This measure establishes and funds a two-year pilot school side walk maintenance and repair program that requires counties to maintain and repair sidewalks in school zones or other related areas of significant school related pedestrian traffic. Requires each county to report on the status of the pilot program.

Some schools in Hawai'i County are built around small plantation towns with narrow streets, boardwalks and stairs. An example would be the town of Pahoa, where numerous buildings are nearing a century in age. Since some afterschool programs are not on school properties, students must walk about a quarter of a mile along the main street in town to get to their afterschool programs.

Students and their parents in school zones in rural areas walk on undersized sidewalks, some in serious disrepair and sorely in need renovation. Children with physical disabilities who are unable to use dilapidated sidewalks are forced to use the street as a means to get to and from after-school programs. With the most recent fire that destroyed a portion of student-transited sidewalks in Pahoa, students are now forced to walk along the busy street causing potential serious accidents and/or injury.

Having the school side walk maintenance repair program will enable students and their families to transit in a safe and comfortable manner to their afterschool programs, stores, recreation programs or home without the worry of getting injured or impeding traffic.

The Office of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Hawai'i supports the passage of House Bill No. 491. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this matter.

Thank you for the opportunity to offer testimony in support of HB 491, which would pilot a twoyear program for the maintenance and repair of school sidewalks.

Created by the legislature in 2012, the Obesity Prevention Task Force is comprised of over 20 statewide organizations, and works to make recommendations to reshape Hawai'i's school, work, community, and health care environments, making healthier lifestyles obtainable for all Hawai'i residents. The Hawai'i Public Health Institute (HIPHI) convenes the Task Force and supports and promotes policy efforts to create a healthy Hawai'i.

HB 491 fast tracks the repair and maintenance of our school sidewalks. Having complete sidewalks allow all children, including those with disabilities, to walk and bicycle to school safely. Many communities in Hawaii struggle with traffic congestion around schools and motor vehicle emissions polluting the environment. At the same time, children engage in less physical activity, which contributes to the prevalence of childhood obesity.

Making routes safer for children to bike and walk to school benefits the entire community and environment. Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony.

Comments: I am a 78 year old woman with a mobility impairment. I have to come to Pahoa every day and I find walking along Pahoa Village Rd. very difficult. The right-of-way is dangerously narrow in many places, and much of it is loose gravel. When we have heavy rains, it floods badly and leaves behind deposits of slippery mud. I recently had a bad fall: I tripped while crossing the road and landed on my palms, which were shredded and embedded with dirt (in front of 7-11). I had to go the the urgent care clinic and incur a co-pay. Because of arthritis in my hands, the fall made my manual dexterity even worse than usual. So yes, the students need a safe way to walk, but so do the handicapped and seniors. Please support this request. mahalo, Rene Siracusa
