In Consideration of HOUSE BILL 630 RELATING TO DROUGHT MITIGATION

House Bill 630 proposes to appropriate \$4,000,000 of general revenues for drought mitigation measures and projects in each county of the State for Fiscal Year 2017-2018. This measure also proposes to establish a full-time Planner IV position within the Commission on Water Resource Management to carry out the purposes of House Bill 630 and appropriates \$52,000 in general revenues in Fiscal Year 2017-2018 to fund this position. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this initiative as long as it does not replace our priorities requested in the Executive Budget.

The Department recognizes the need to mitigate the effects of drought and this need is acknowledged in the Hawaii Drought Plan. Droughts have severely affected Hawaii in the past, and as part of a natural climate cycle, droughts will impact the State in the future. In addition to agriculture and livestock industries, drought-induced impacts will also affect other sectors of the community, such as water supply, business, the environment, and public health and safety.

The Department concurs with the importance of drought planning and the effective implementation of mitigation measures and strategies. The Department strongly suggests that funding for drought mitigation projects be provided directly to the respective counties in order to streamline and expedite the implementation of drought mitigation projects.

TESTIMONY ON HB 630 RELATING TO DROUGHT MITIGATION

Aloha Chair Yamane, Vice Chair Kong, and Members of the Committee:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawaii Farm Bureau strongly supports HB 630, which expands the capacity of the State of Hawaii to address drought mitigation.

We have seen extremes during the past years, ranging from extreme droughts to severe storms. Long range forecasts all predict extremely variable weather in the future with severe rainfall periods followed by extended droughts. It is very likely that on "average" there will be enough water, however, looking at annual rainfall and averaging it through the year, will not provide a true picture of how much water is available to meet our needs.

Drought mitigation efforts will facilitate our capacity to persevere through extended droughts. This is critical not only for the safety and well-being of society but to ensure that agriculture is sustainable through extreme droughts to meet the needs of our people.

Recently at the meeting of the National Association of Conservation Districts, Brian Richter, Chief Scientist for the Water program of The Nature Conservancy, an international conservation organization, where he promotes sustainable water use and management with governments, presented a thoughtful presentation about Water and the future. He emphasized the need for collaboration and taking from one to meet the needs of another is not in the long term interest of society. He cited California where water from agriculture is shifted to population centers. He asked, where will our food come from? He emphasized that conservation alone is not the solution. Populations are growing and so needs are expanding. Weather is dynamic so access to water is not constant. He gave examples of projects capturing storm waters for future use.

Hawaii has already embarked on that journey but we have not maintained our progress in this area. In 2007, HB 400 (Act 238) was passed resulting in significant projects across the State. Maui was able to line a reservoir in the Kula Ag Park while Oahu made strides in water conservation toilet fixtures.

The Hawaii Drought Council has proposed projects. At the same time the changing weather patterns may warrant a review of priorities and begin implementing the proposals. Focused efforts to this end is needed. This measure will provide that direction.

HFB respectfully requests your strong support of this measure to strengthen Hawaii's resilience to periods of drought.
