ALOHA COMMITTEE CHAIR TOKUDA, VICE CHAIR DELA CRUZ, AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS ON WAYS AND MEANS:

I am Peter Ganaban, Business Manager/Secretary-Treasurer of the Hawaii Laborers Union, Local 368. Local 368 represents over 5000 men and women both working and retired throughout the State of Hawaii and we stand in <u>OPPOSITION</u> to <u>HB 637</u>, <u>HD2, SD1</u>.

HB 637, HD2, SD1 proposes to expedite review and adoption of the Universal Plumbing Code (UPC) ahead of all other codes, and fund the State Building Code Council (SBCC). We are opposed for two main reasons:

We see no reason that the UPC should be put ahead of the other building codes for review and adoption. All modern and up-to-date building codes are equally as important as they all relate to the general welfare and safety of the public and the construction of the structures that they govern.

In light of an increase in the frequency of hurricane threats and "close calls" in the recent years, the case can be made that codes such as the International Building Code and International Residential Code are even more important than the UPC as

This bill also requests funding of the State Building Codes Council. This proposal is redundant and duplicative. HRS 107-23 (b) already requires the Department of Accounting and General Service to fund the SBCC¹. The real issue with regard to funding has already been addressed by way of statute, the question is why hasn't DAGS funded the SBCC as required?

In light of the above-mentioned reasons, the Hawaii Laborers Union stands in **OPPOSITION** to **HB 637**, **HB2**, **SD1**.

On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i STRONGLY SUPPORTS HB 637 HD2 SD1 to direct adoption of the Uniform Plumbing Code and thereby improve our conservation and re-use of water.

For nearly 50 years, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i has helped people explore, enjoy, and protect the Hawaiian Islands. The work of our volunteers spans the spectrum of community engagement, including outdoor education, lobbying, and elections. Our volunteers participate in the several task forces and consultations related to state building codes and specifically the uniform plumbers code.

The Sierra Club strongly supports adoption of the most up-to-date versions of the Uniform Plumbing Code issued by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials. The IAPMO is the gathering of global experts in the area of plumbing — it is not trade association nor an advocate for development — and it is focused on the technical aspects of implementing sound building and construction practices around the world. This is the body that we should be listening to when it comes to setting reasonable, protective standards for our buildings.

We support adoption of the Uniform Plumbing Code today because it would allow for the systematic re-use of graywater in Hawai'i. Re-using non-potable water in homes and businesses is one of the most significant steps we can take to protect our drinking water resources for the future. The UPC outlines exactly how to install purple pipes to maximize water re-use while also protecting public health and safety.

As this Committee knows, water is life. And for an island community like ours, we cannot import our water from other places. RE: HB 637 HD2 SD1 – Relating to State Building Codes

Chairs Baker & Tokuda, Vice-Chairs Nishihara & Dela Cruz, and members of the committees:

My name is Gladys Quinto Marrone, CEO of the Building Industry Association of Hawaii (BIA-Hawaii). Chartered in 1955, the Building Industry Association of Hawaii is a professional trade organization affiliated with the National Association of Home Builders, representing the building industry and its associates. BIA-Hawaii takes a leadership role in unifying and promoting the interests of the industry to enhance the quality of life for the people of Hawaii.

S.B. 634 HD2 SD1, Relating to State Building Codes, would require the State Building Code Council to adopt provisions of an updated Uniform Plumbing Code within one year after it is published by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials. The bill would also require the various county councils to act within one year of the updated uniform plumbing code is adopted by the State Building Code Council. Current statutes allow the Council to review and adopt any changes as appropriate to new model building codes within eighteen months of publication by the various associations that review and adopt model codes.

BIA-Hawaii is opposed to the passage of this measure, as it will require the State Building Code Council (SBCC) to give preference to adoption of plumbing and water code amendments over any other pending reviews of other model codes. The SBCC has no staff or funding, and meets infrequently. The current review process of eighteen months is already short, given the number and complexity of codes that the SBCC reviews and adopts. Also, the SBCC has no staff or funding, and meets infrequently.

My name is Reginald Castanares; I have the privilege to represent the Plumbers and Fitters Local 675.

Our testimony in support of this critical measure is on the record. We appreciate the opportunity to restate, perhaps the most important argument in support, "Public Health and Safety."

You have received arguments in opposition, which essentially state that water safety is no more important than electrical or other codes regulated on a State wide basis. Those arguments ignore the very basic element of what provides all of us "Life" which is water. Without it there is no Life, thus every effort must be put forth to assure our citizens that not only will they be able to access water but that the water we depend upon is delivered with the highest level of protection against any form of degradation, i.e., from intrusive foreign substances and more importantly the incorrect handling and processing of it for consumption.

We are fully supportive of every effort which expedites the modernization of our plumbing code and the objectives of increased efficiency in our potable water systems as well as the increasing need for strict standards for the handling and use of grey water.

Standards as developed by professional organizations such as the Uniform Plumbing Code are truly the first line of defense in the delivery of potable water to the public. As such Hawaii needs to maintain the most current version of those codes, such as is intended under the purpose of HB 637 HD2 SD1
