SENATE BILL NO. 643 RELATING TO IRRIGATION

HOUSE BILL NO. 643 RELATING TO IRRIGATION

Chairperson Gabbard and Members of the Committee:

My name is James Nakatani, Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development Corporation ("ADC"). The ADC strongly supports House Bill No. 643 which provides additional funding for improvements to the Waiahole irrigation system.

The Waiahole irrigation system ("system") was constructed in 1915 to irrigate thousands of acres of sugarcane. The system collects groundwater from the windward side of Oahu and transports the water via tunnels to the leeward side of Oahu, where it is conveyed through ditches and siphons by gravity flow. Currently, the system supplies vital irrigation water for lands between Waipio and Kunia.

The ADC seeks to improve the efficiency of the system to reduce water loss which can be attributed by several factors including seepage, leakage, soil attributes, evaporation and transpiration, illegal withdraws, structure conditions, operational practices and climate patterns. The ADC's goal is to save 50 million gallons of fresh water annually and ensure water availability for farming.

The additional funding will go towards building more water storage capacity and a backup well system to ensure water security for farming in the central plains of Oahu should the system become temporarily inoperable. Constructing additional reservoirs at the upper end of the conveyance sections of the system will increase the capacity of the system without additional water allocation. The additional reservoirs will also provide storage so the amount of water in the delivery portion of the system can be more efficiently controlled. Additionally, a back-up well used for emergency purposes to fulfill water demand should water be unavailable or curtailed will greatly increase the security and reliability of the system.

In closing, the funding provided in this bill will enhance the implementation of the improvements to the system. Making these investments will ensure the system can deliver a reliable source of water in Central Oahu for the next 100 years.

The Land Use Research Foundation of Hawaii (LURF) is a private, non-profit research and trade association whose members include major Hawaii landowners, developers and a utility company. LURF's mission is to advocate for reasonable, rational and equitable land use planning, legislation and regulations that encourage well-planned economic growth and development, while safeguarding Hawaii's significant natural and cultural resources, and public health and safety.

LURF appreciates the opportunity to express its **support of HB 643**, and of the various agricultural stakeholder groups who defend the goals of viable agricultural operations and the conservation and protection of agriculture, including important agricultural lands (IAL) in Hawaii.

HB 643. This bill authorizes the director of finance to issue general obligation bonds to finance capital improvements to the Waiahole Irrigation System to ensure a dependable supply of water for Hawaii's crops.

LURF's Position. The purpose of this measure is to provide funding needed for improvements to the Waiahole Irrigation System, one of the most important irrigation systems in the State, which services many agricultural producers in central Oahu. Since large amounts of prime agricultural lands and irrigation systems became available for conversion to diversified agriculture because of the plantation closures in the 1990s, the State has had the opportunity to strengthen and expand Hawaii's diversified agriculture industry. Agricultural lands, however, require significant quantities of water to support and maintain productivity. In order to ensure that local agricultural producers may continue to receive a dependable supply of water for crops, as well as research and development

operations, sufficient funding is necessary to improve, repair and maintain Hawaii's irrigation systems.

Local farmers and ranchers who rely on irrigation systems to service their agricultural lands consider such resources critical to conduct their agricultural operations and to sustain their businesses. These agricultural stakeholders believe measures such as HB 643 will greatly assist by providing funding necessary to make improvements to irrigation systems for the long-term betterment of the State's agricultural industry, and depend on legislation such as this to help them work toward the expansion of diversified agriculture; promote the agricultural self-sufficiency of the State; and to protect water as an important resource.

For the above reasons, LURF **supports HB 643**, and respectfully urges your favorable consideration.
