HOUSE BILL NO. 889 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chairperson Creagan and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill No. 889 that proposes to

increase the pesticide licensing fee and requires annual renewal of the license.

This bill requires an MOU between the Hawaii Department of Agriculture and University

of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources, and establishes an

environmental toxicologist and pesticide extension specialist positions with funds

appropriated out of the pesticide use revolving fund.

While the department is in support of this measure to increase the licensing fees, and to add an environmental toxicologist to the department, the department has these reservations about appropriating out of the pesticide use revolving fund in that this bill will:

- Eliminate support to the agricultural pest control and structural pest control industries and support to the general public that also uses pesticides.
- Will eliminate a funding source for conducting pesticides branch staff training workshops held twice a year.



The department currently has 6 Environmental Health Specialist (EHS) positions that provide outreach and education to the Agricultural and Pest Control industries, and other pesticide applicators on pesticide safety and the federal Worker Protection Standard trainings. Our EHS staff have independently created education materials and already work with the Cooperative Extension agents on each island.

The change from a 3-year licensing schedule to an annual licensing period will be a burden to current staff (3) in the licensing/registration section without providing for funds to hire increased staffing to address the proposed licensing renewal period. The 3-year cycle allows them to process about 3,000 renewals per year versus the proposed 9,000 renewals annually. Additionally, requiring that all new licenses expire on the same day and are then renewed on the same day will be very difficult to manage with existing staff.

The development of an electronic data collection system may be cost prohibitive and we note that only a small number of states, with far more fiscal resources, have any type of pesticide reporting requirement of this nature due to the enormous time and inputs involved in managing such a system.

Chair Cregan, Vice Chair DeCoite and Members of the House Committee on Agriculture:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on House Bill 889, a proposal to increase pesticide registration fees to support the Department of Agriculture pesticide registration functions.

The Consumer Specialty Products Association (CSPA) is the premier trade association representing the interests of companies engaged in the manufacture, formulation, distribution and sale of more than \$100 billion annually in the U.S. of familiar consumer products that help household and institutional customers create cleaner and healthier environments. CSPA member companies employ hundreds of thousands of people globally. Products CSPA represents include disinfectants that kill germs in homes, hospitals and restaurants; air fresheners, room deodorizers and candles that eliminate odors; pest management products for home, lawn and garden, and pets; cleaning products and polishes for use throughout the home and institutions; products used to protect and improve the performance and appearance of automobiles; aerosol products and a host of other products used every day. Through its product stewardship program, Product Care[®], and scientific and business-to-business endeavors, CSPA provides its members a platform to effectively address issues regarding the health, safety and sustainability of their products.

Consumer protection and health benefit products include disinfectants, sanitizers, germicides, antibacterial products, and insect and rodent control products. Chair Creagan and Members of the House Committee on Agriculture:

I am Paul Oshiro, testifying on behalf of Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. (A&B) on HB 889, A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PESTICIDES. We support this bill.

Pesticide use in Hawaii is extensively regulated by both the Federal Environmental Protection Agency and the State Department of Agriculture under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) and the Hawaii Pesticide Law (Chapter 149A, HRS). Depending upon the pesticide and its intended use, the EPA and the State impose mandatory conditions and requirements that are science based and designed to protect the pesticide applicator, the general public, and the environment. These requirements may include, but are not limited to, maximum application rates, using only specified application methods and equipment, application only under specified weather conditions, the observation of buffer zones, and, in the case of restricted use pesticides, allowing use only by or under the direct supervision of certified pesticide applicators.

All certified pesticide applicators are presently required to keep records of all restricted use pesticide applications and to make these records available for inspection by the State Department of Agriculture for two years. In addition, records of all restricted use pesticide sales must be submitted, and made available to the State Department of Agriculture. These disclosures enable the State Department of Agriculture to cross check applicator inventory and use records with vendor sales records.

Pesticide labels contain specific instructions such as what the pesticide may be used on, how much of the pesticide may be used, how often the pesticide can be used, and worker protection requirements. Federal Law states that the pesticide label is the law, and that use of the pesticide that is not in conformance with the label is a violation of Federal Law.

This bill increases pesticide licensing fees, modifies authorized uses for the pesticide use revolving fund, and appropriates funds for various pesticide related positions and activities. We support this bill as it provides additional non-general fund revenue to enhance the ability of the State Department of Agriculture and the U.H. College of Tropical Agriculture & Human Resources to monitor and regulate pesticide use throughout the State of Hawaii. In that pesticide distribution, sales, and use are presently heavily regulated at both the Federal and the State levels of government, the establishment of new positions for an environmental toxicologist and pesticide extension specialist along with additional appropriations for certification activities, compliance monitoring, electronic data collection, educational materials, integrated management technologies, and pesticide disposal will further strengthen the State's pesticide oversight and enforcement capabilities. Thus, we believe that this bill will further protect and safeguard employees, the general public, and the environment from negative impacts resulting from improper pesticide use.

Based on the foregoing, we respectfully request your favorable consideration on this bill. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

Dear Chair Creagan, Vice Chair DeCoite and members of the committee,

My name is Dr. Ashley Lukens and I am the Director for the Hawaii Center for Food Safety (CFS). CFS is a nationwide public interest, sustainable agriculture nonprofit organization whose mission centers on furthering the public's right to know how their food is produced, through labeling and other means. We have over 820,000 farmer and consumer members across the country, including nearing 11,000 in Hawai'i. On behalf of CFS and our members, I thank you for the opportunity to speak to you today regarding this important bill.

I am writing in strong support of HB889 which increases the pesticide licensing fee and requires annual renewal of the license. We cannot expect appropriate capacity at the regulatory level if we chronically underfund our agencies.

Additionally, I would suggest that this committee revise the bill and relevant provision (HRS §149A-13.5) of Hawaii pesticide law to allow some of the monies to be directed to Department of Health for staffing and monitoring capacity in the areas of toxicology and epidemiology. Insofar as the increasing community advocacy around pesticides is directly related to their impacts on human health, and assuming this bill is a response this pressure, it seems prudent to ensure that the DOH is also sufficiently resourced to respond to these concerns. Having the pesticide users, through their licensing fees, cover the cost of their externalities is just common sense economics.
