

SB1307 RELATING TO LAND USE

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) Beneficiary Advocacy and Empowerment Committee will recommend that the Board of Trustees <u>COMMENT</u> on SB1307, which may foster community-driven strategies that can effectively represent the interests local residents, in the realization of much-needed or much-desired infrastructure improvement, economic development, and other revitalization activities. OHA believes that the benefits of this measure may be particularly needed by a number of Native Hawaiian communities, who have long-sought infrastructure and other much-needed improvements to their neighborhoods.

OHA appreciates this measure's recognition of the potential for on-the-ground grassroots engagement, to facilitate the planning and implementation of community-appropriate improvements at the neighborhood level. The neighborhood revitalization boards proposed in this measure may serve as vehicles for neighborhoods to assemble their interests and amplify their concerns, to obtain the resources and government response needed for locally-tailored neighborhood improvements.

OHA notes that this measure does give "preference" to neighborhoods that fall under certain criteria relating to transit-oriented development and the Housing and Urban Development neighborhood revitalization strategy area program. However, OHA believes that this bill could serve a number of other neighborhoods in need of revitalization. **OHA has a vested interest in the health, safety, and well-being of Native Hawaiians, which includes the status of those neighborhoods with large populations of Native Hawaiians – like Wai'anae and Waimānalo - that could greatly benefit from revitalization.** Residents of Wai'anae and Waimānalo neighborhoods have long been concerned with deficiencies in their current neighborhood infrastructure, particularly with ever-growing population demands – traffic and traffic safety being among the most vocalized concerns. OHA believes that the neighborhood revitalization boards established through this measure could provide an effective mechanism for these neighborhoods and communities to finally get the support they need.
