I support SB 1317 which would appropriate funds for the renovation of the former KHET/PBS facilities and future home for the Academy for Creative Media at the University of Hawaii at Manoa.

In sending this email to Associate Professor Joel Moffett, I declare my support for the University of Hawai'i Mānoa (UHM) honoring its commitment to fully move the Academy for Creative Media (ACM) into 2350 Dole Street. Since 2006, UHM has consistently supported the ACM's intent to move into this facility. This formal support is evidenced in ACM's BA proposal (specifically calling for ACM to move into 2350 Dole Street), which was approved by UHM Interim Chancellor Bley-Vroman.

Since it's formation in 2004, the ACM has developed into a robust and successful program. Yet since its inception, the ACM has been hampered and constrained by temporary and inadequate facilities spread throughout the UHM campus. The ACM has consistently articulated the need for vital facilities to maintain its program, as is evidenced by ACM's 2011 ACM Assessment Report. Towards solving this issue, the ACM has consistently articulated the intent to move into this facility as is evidenced by the ACM Visioning Plan.

ACM was an integral force in the launching of my own career in broadcast television. Without ACM, I would have never learned of a job opportunity at KITV and without ACM I would have never had the skills I needed to thrive there. From that one opened door, more opportunities would come. After two years at KITV, I then went on to become a Director at KHON. I spent three years there, where I directed countless primetime newscasts and also was put in charge of directing a new show called "Cover 2: Hawaii High School Football Weekly"

In Cover 2, I was away from the stiffness of news for the first time in years and I found a place to be creative again. It was on that show that I really got to apply everything that I had learned in ACM. Lighting, sound, cinematography, directing actors- all my lessons came back to me and were extremely relevant more than they had ever been before.

Cover 2 has now gone on for four successful seasons and has been a platform of hope for the high school football community across the state. It is even watched by college recruiters outside of Hawaii, as they have come to know it as a showcase of our state's athletic talent.

This show opens doors for others, just as ACM once opened a door for me.

While my professors worked hard to arm myself and my classmates with the knowledge we needed to succeed, I always felt that the facilities of our major were severely lacking.

Necessary tools of our industry remained solely on the pages of our textbooks and in the words of our professors, rather than being available for us to use and see firsthand.

We never had a proper sound stage to shoot in, we never learned to truly mix sound because of not having a mixing stage, and we never learned to properly color correct our films because of not having a color correction studio.

Beyond that, I was amazed that we did not have computers and a lab readily available to work on our projects in the post production stage- but rather, we had to live and die by our own laptops.

I also fighting over limited shooting days with my classmates because of our limited camera, lighting, and sound equipment- making our projects nearly impossible to complete at certain points of the year.

I also remember us working forever on our projects only to have them screened in a classrooms that can barely make a powerpoint presentation shine, let alone a work of art.

And lastly, I remember my classrooms beings scattered throughout the campus because we never truly had a building to call home. It was simply hard to traverse to my classes, when I should have been able to stick to the same locale.

I hope show that ACM has been and still is doing great things for the kids of Hawaii, all the while suffering with not enough resources. I'm a Hilo boy that fell in love with a video camera. My parents couldn't afford to send me to college anywhere. My only hope was finding an in-state program that would allow me to follow my dreams. ACM was my hope and it absolutely transformed my life for the better.

I'm now a Director at KTVU FOX 2 in the Bay Area.ssor I still pull from the lessons I learned back on campus from my great professors. I owe a lot to them. They were the ones who opened the door.

With full support, the Academy of Creative Media Student Association (ACMSA) hopes that ACM will gain an adequate facility for students to collaborate. This will provide a betterment towards creative work and Hawai'i's unique voices of artists.

I ask President Lassner to honor the institutional memory of UHM's support and agreement to move the ACM into the KHET facility, which clearly fits student, faculty and program needs.

And I don't believe that I would have discovered this about myself if not for ACM.

I have taken the confidence and the skills that I learned in ACM and translated that into a successful Hollywood career where I hope, in the coming years to use my success as a way to expand the boundaries of "Hollywood story-telling" to include thoughtful and honest depictions of Pacific Islanders in both film and television.

I attended ACM in it's first years of existence and while we had tools and equipment at our disposal, it was nothing compared to what major competitive film programs across the country have access to. By renovating the KHET/PBS facilities, ACM will not only be able to offer students a broader spectrum of experience, I believe it will be easier for the program to train storytellers that will be more competitive in the industry at large. And the success of Pacific Island storytellers means that our stories have a greater chance of reaching a broader audience. And to me, that is what ACM is all about. It is about training the next generation of filmmakers, writers, directors and animators to go out into the world and share our island cultures with a world that rarely sees more than pristine beaches and tourist traps.

And I'm not the only one. There are hundreds of filmmakers hailing from the ACM, learning to tell stories in the truest of ways, rich of authenticity of our island home. At the ACM we learn and strive to bring Hawaii's rich culture and mighty voice to the stage of the world, the podium of the nations, and a seat at diversity's table.

On a personal note, my family came to Hawaii as refugees and immigrants after the Vietnam War. The hopes and dreams to find safe harbor became a reality after weeks of deadly seas, pirates, and our shipwrecking in Malaysia. Being born and raised in Hawaii to immigrant parents wasn't and still isn't easy. My dad's a pastor, mom's a seamstress, I have 4 siblings and like many others, we lack in many ways, but we triumph in many ways, none of which is without dedication and sacrifice from each member of the family. Regardless, we still have to make it work. But without a home, opportunity, and the good nature of kind neighbors we wouldn't have succeeded.

In our nation today we are in fervent discussion about the state of our country and what it means to be a good neighbor. We juggle safety with hospitality, wondering what our future will be like for the next generation. I imagine some of the same questions of safety and wellbeing are being asked by leaders of our nation and our university on comparatively different situations. But I assure you, thematically they are parallel. As with many outsiders welcomed into a home, they more often than not, find belonging into their new home. That "they" and "us" mentality becomes, "we". It was the case for my parents, many others, and the same for students and faculty of the ACM who I'm sure once said, "if only someone understood me, if only they'd give me a chance." As you hear from others on the life of ACM so far and the struggle we have trying to find a physical home, please keep in mind ACM is a small, but growing family, one that seeks the best for its members, its friends, and its community. It's a family that is comprised of artists and dreamers, many of which grew up longing to be understood and have been seen as misfits, outcasts, and oddballs; so, for us to find a place we belong, a place that we call home, a place that we feel welcomed has been an endeavor etched into our DNA. It is here that we found encouragement to chase aspiration and achieve the impossible, it's a place we learned to live our truest selves. And in light of recent events in our nation, it is ever so much more imperative that the State support us as artists. With the the National Endowment for the Arts hanging precariously in a storm of policy, one can only imagine the repercussions to follow if artists weren't protected now. Imagine the stories of hope that transcends barriers, lost because of fear we'd lose money for other things. Imagine the films that inspired you, touched you, comforted you because someone out there felt the same way you did, lost. My name is Henry Mochida and because of my education through ACM I have worked on over 100 film productions, screened films at dozens of film festivals, traveled internationally, founded a community media organization for under-represented communities, produced media for entertainment facilities, managed media labs, innovated the use of filmmaking for social research, and worked for major media organizations.

I have been able to consistently tap into this knowledge base and skill-set in seeking gainful employment and meaningful community while living on the mainland. I am writing in support of SB-1317 that appropriates funds for the renovation of the former KHET/PBS facilities and future home for the Academy for Creative Media at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa.

I attended ACM while it was in its fledgling stages. We were a tight knit community with a passion for storytelling and only basic tools to make the magic come to the screen. We scrapped equipment together and stretched resources between students often relying on personal finances to improve production value. We trucked and lugged our gear from the KHET/PBS building to classroom spaces scattered across campus and provided students with limited access to studio environments on rented time.

Despite these early on restrictions ACM has consistently grown to be a key figure in the film industry in Hawai'i, the Pacific, and beyond. Yet, through our partnerships we are often working with peers and colleagues in other universities who have access to state-of-the-art facilities including sound stages, green screen studios, color correction suites, film processing and projection houses, as well as film archives. In fact, it would surprise many of our partners to know that we do not have a permanent facility on campus in Honolulu.

An investment in such a space for our department is the necessary next step to meet our hard earned reputation. Our world-class faculty requires the security of a facility to teach without one arm tied behind their backs. Such a facility would allow ACM and the University of Hawaii to better foster the future leaders and talent in storytelling, media technology, and the film industry. The passage of this bill will be a game changer for our students. I applaud your astute and steadfast efforts to pass it.

As a senior at the University of Hawai'i's Academy for Creative Media (ACM) program at Mānoa, (specializing in digital cinematic production), I was thrust into the life of a filmmaker two years ago and haven't looked back. My knowledge for crafting stories into cinematic art has grown immensely. But as far as learning the techniques to produce a quality film goes, there are crucial aspects of that I will, presently, never be able to learn at the ACM.

One thing that separates a good short film from a "student film," is good sound recording. Having the ability to design sound is essential to any quality film, especially when the sound can't be practically produced on-set, i.e. swords clashing, bone breaking, explosions, gun fire. Not being able to produce quality, original sound has been the bane of many student films I've seen and produced at ACM Mānoa, which would otherwise be, in my opinion, film festival winners.

To be a filmmaker is to be a storyteller, and for better or worse, it's probably the most technically demanding form of storytelling. But our stories must be told, and they

will be told. I only wish that I had the ability to convey them in a matter that it would impact others, in that, if my films were to look and sound like the real world, they would have the chance to change the real world, like all good art is supposed to do.

Please pass SB 1317, and help secure our future as the storytellers of Hawai'i, and all of Polynesia.

Comments: My name is Benjamin Menor and I am a former graduate from the University of Hawaii at Manoa. I am here to testify on behalf of the Academy for Creative Media to show my unwavering support and to help elucidate the Academy's glaring need for governmental support after years of neglect and empty promises from the University. Through my years as a student in the Academy for Creative Media, I received outstanding instruction from my wise and compassionate professors. However, I observed a clear lack of resources and funding. Furthermore, I was deprived of receiving a proper education. The absence of a sound stage, sound mixing studio, and color correction studio, or for the laymen, imperatives for completing any quality film, ultimately hampered me from fulfilling my potential as a student. It is unconscionable that the University has chosen to neglect the Academy for Creative Media in favor of other departments. I understand that art may be overlooked or deemed impractical by some. However, as someone who believes wholeheartedly that art and filmmaking saved my life, it is crucial that we enrich, empower and embolden students who want to make a life out of making films and telling stories. This can only be achieved if students are properly and adequately equipped with the necessary resources. As I speak before all of you distinguished and prominent individuals, I humbly ask that you consider giving the Academy a chance to thrive and flourish. You all have the power to incite great change. As you proceed with this legislation, please consider people like me who possess a burning passion to do the same. Thank you.

Hawaii State Legislature SB1317 - Relating to Academy for Creative Media



Aloha,

My name is Kayla Mae Abalos and I am currently a student attending the University of Hawaii at Manoa. I am majoring in the Academy for Creative Media (ACM) under the Animation track and my class standing is an undergraduate senior. I support the proposed bill that appropriates moneys to ACM in renovations for ACM's future home, the KHET/PBS building.

I believe that the ACM program deserves a suitable building to call its own, and within the Manoa campus, the KHET building is the most ideal to meet the student's needs. As an animation student, it is undeniably necessary and important to have access to a computer lab with many different relevant programs as well as space for equipment such as drawing tablets and light tables. Since entering the program in Spring 2015, my class has moved our main animation classroom a total of three times. There was no suitable lab space available for students to use after-hours for my first year within the program, and for all the students before me. We currently have a lab space at another building for the first time since the program started. However it is not ideal for the students as it is on an admin floor and has limited hours. Having an accessible lab space and facilities available at the KHET building will allow more hours for the students to complete assignments within the confines of ACM's own space and not another department's building. It will also allow the space for teaching and experimentation with different types of animation such as stop-motion which is currently not available as a fall or spring semester course for students. ACM cultivates creative local talents but is undervalued by not having facilities to support its students. The program offers opportunities to our students such as the Hawaii International Film Festival x ACM night and a Student Media Art exchange with Shanghai University. These are only some among the many film internships available. Recently within the animation track, recruiters from PIXAR visited to explain internships at PIXAR and look over student works. Local voices here want to be heard and major parties such as PIXAR are interested, but without the sufficient support for the students they cannot grow as filmmakers and as artists. Media interplays with other departments as well, opening even more opportunities for both parties involved. Previously, the Information and Computer Sciences (ICS) department has held a video game class and a data visualization class in conjunction with ACM Animation students. The KHET/PBS building contains facilities that are majorly beneficial not only to ACM but possibly to other departments such as ICS or communications, opening up even more learning options for the students.

The many different departments at the University of Hawaii at Manoa have their own building or space to act as a home base for their students and faculty; it is time that the Academy for Creative Media are allowed a home building to call its own, which is why I support the bill to appropriate moneys for the program's move to the KHET/PBS building.

My name is Jesse Macadangdang. Filmmaking has always been a passion of mine. In 1993, I would borrow my parents' Hi8 camcorder, get together with my cousins at my grandparents' house in Whitmore Village, and try to bring to life any and every idea that popped into our heads. We wrote comedy skits, and choreographed kung-fu action sequences. We wanted to emulate that one shot they use in horror movies, and Google didn't exist back then, so we spent a day experimenting until I figured it out. Years later, Google would tell me it was called a dolly zoom.

After collecting enough random silliness to make a feature-length film, I figured out how to edit everything together with two VCRs and an RCA cable. I hand-drew my own titles and credits, and over-dubbed audio. I was in the 6th grade.

I graduated high school in 1999, and my first thought was film school. Except, I didn't have the money to go to the mainland. I barely had enough to go to college here at home. I quickly joined the workforce to pay my tuition while trying to earn an education degree instead. I had no choice. My passion would have to take a backseat. Meanwhile, one of those cousins graduated from high school in 2001, went through the USC film program, and has since worked on shows like Ugly Betty and The Mentalist. While I was happy for him, I kept wondering what it would have been like to follow my dream too. Then, the ACM was created, and it became the education degree's turn to wait.

In 2005, I was accepted into the ACM. Over the next half-decade, I would enroll in as many ACM classes as my money allowed, taking semesters off to work. Under the tutelage of professors like Joel Moffett, I learned how to better hone my raw skills. I learned about the business. Most importantly, I was given the confidence I needed to stay on the path and believe in my abilities. Upon leaving the ACM, I took any video gig I could get. I shot weddings. I edited graduation slideshows. I've even shot funerals. In 2011, I started a short-lived YouTube channel with a few friends that went somewhat viral and opened a few more doors. I shot fashion shows and food truck rallies. Finally, in 2014, KHON2 came calling. I was offered a producer/editor position. My name is Jesse Macadangdang. Filmmaking has always been a passion of mine. In 1993, I would borrow my parents' Hi8 camcorder, get together with my cousins at my grandparents' house in Whitmore Village, and try to bring to life any and every idea that popped into our heads. We wrote comedy skits, and choreographed kung-fu action sequences. We wanted to emulate that one shot they use in horror movies, and Google didn't exist back then, so we spent a day experimenting until I figured it out. Years later, Google would tell me it was called a dolly zoom.

After collecting enough random silliness to make a feature-length film, I figured out how to edit everything together with two VCRs and an RCA cable. I hand-drew my own titles and credits, and over-dubbed audio. I was in the 6th grade.

All those years ago, Joel made me believe that I didn't have to go to Hollywood. With the ACM, he convinced me that I could stay home, in Hawaii, and carve out a living doing the thing I love the most.

And that's exactly what I did.

Not many people can say they get to live their dream, but I do. And I owe it all to the ACM. I often think about the people I met in my classes at the ACM, many of them far more talented and capable than I could have been. I wonder how many doors opened for them because of the ACM, as they had opened for me, and I wonder where we'd all be forced to end up without it. Whenever I can luck out and score a ticket, I still attend the ACM Nights at the HIFF. The pride I feel for every student that gets their name and hard work up on that screen is indescribable, knowing they are realizing their dreams, just as I had. All we needed was an opportunity. That is what the ACM is, and that is what the ACM should continue to be.
