Chairperson Tokuda and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on SB 352, which appropriates funds into the agricultural loan revolving fund. The Department strongly supports this bill.

This bill seeks to expand the Department's Agricultural Loan Program by providing additional funds to support the start-up capital in generating the State's next generation of farmers. The Galbraith lands on Oahu are now becoming available for production agriculture and farmers will be able to take advantage of these lands to fully mechanize production, utilize new technologies and achieve greater economies of scale. Access to affordable capital will be vital in helping these new operations to develop.
