DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) appreciates the intent, offers comments, and proposes an amendment.

PURPOSE: The purpose of the bill is to require all limited service pregnancy centers to disclose the availability of and enrollment information for reproductive health services; establishes privacy and disclosure requirements for individual records and information; authorizes civil penalties and civil actions for enforcement and remedy.

DHS appreciates the intent of the bill to ensure that regardless of where a woman seeks information about reproductive health, there should be information about the full range of options, including how to obtain health insurance coverage should they be uninsured. We appreciate the amendments made to the bill thus far. DHS highly recommends that applications for Medicaid insurance coverage be processed through the online application as it is more efficient and eligibility may be processed in as little as 24 hours. The paper application process, while available, requires manual entry and more time to determine eligibility. For these reasons, we respectfully request the committee delete the phrase "contact the appropriate Med-QUEST division eligibility office or" at lines 8-9, page 4. Directing women to apply for benefits online at mybenefits.hawaii.gov is the most efficient way for people to apply for health insurance coverage via Medicaid.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.

Thank you for this opportunity to testify in strong support of SB 501, SD1, HD1, which would ensure women in Hawaii are provided medically accurate information regarding their reproductive health, including information on how to access the full range of healthcare services and programs available to them.

Anyone seeking health care deserves to be provided with medically accurate, unbiased, and comprehensive information about their health and their choices. When individuals have a full range of information and are able to provide informed consent, they make better health choices for themselves and their families.

Limited Service Pregnancy Centers, also called "crisis pregnancy centers", often utilize misleading and false information about reproductive health. Additionally, these centers are under no obligation to inform "patients" that they are not actually licensed health care providers or practitioners, and that they have no duty to safeguard medical information provided to them. These centers are commonly tied to religious organizations with stanch positions on contraceptive use and reproductive health care.

SB 501, SD1, HD1 provides common sense regulations and reasonable enforcement for these centers, which operate under the guise of helping vulnerable women and girls. The Commission strongly supports this measure. Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony in support.

The Office of Language Access ("OLA") appreciates the opportunity to testify on **S.B. 501 S.D.1 H.D.1** - Relating to Health. My name is Becky Gardner, Legal Analyst for the Office of Language Access (OLA).

OLA does not take a position on this measure, but offers the following **comments** regarding the language access provisions on lines page 4, lines 1-12; and page 6, lines 1-2, which require the distribution of notices to clients about family planning and women's reproductive health services "in other languages as required by [Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS)] section <u>321C-3</u>." (Underlining added.)

OLA has received an inquiry as to how these provisions might work, and into which languages these notices would need to be translated. OLA is here to say 'it depends'; and to highlight some issues this Committee may consider should it seek to clarify these translation requirements in an HD2.

<u>The Proposed Translation Requirements Expand the Reach of Existing Language</u> Access Law Beyond Government-funded Agencies to Private Entities

Our state language access law is patterned after Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title VI), its related case law, and subsequent executive action through President Clinton's Executive Order 13166 in 2000, and its implementing regulations.

A defining feature of this body of law is the prohibition of national origin discrimination by **government and government-funded agencies**. If a federal or federally-funded agency is found in violation of Title VI because of its failure to provide oral interpreter services or

translation of vital documents, that agency may lose its federal funding. The stakes are not as high for state and state-funded agencies, but HRS §321C imposes similar civil rights obligations on the state and counties, their vendors, as well as state-funded non-profits.

This bill would greatly expand the reach of language access to the **private entities** considered "limited service pregnancy centers".

Closest Model: Section 1557 of the Affordable Care Act Similarly Expands the Reach of Emerging Language Access Law to Private Entities

Similar to this bill, the recently promulgated rules under Section 1557 of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) impose upon some private health care entities similar multilingual 'notice' requirements (regarding the ACA's non-discrimination provisions and the availability of free language services). In addition to health programs or activities that receive funding from or are administered by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the "covered entities" under the ACA also include the Health Insurance Marketplaces and all plans offered by issuers that participate in those Marketplaces – many of which are presumably 'private entities'.

However, it's worthy to note that these private insurers are considered to benefit from federal financial assistance through advanced premium tax credits and cost-sharing reduction subsidies. Conversely, the limited service pregnancy centers in SB501 SD1HD1 need not benefit from *any* governmental financial assistance, directly or indirectly.

Should this committee decide to limit or expand the scope of limited service pregnancy centers subject to these obligations, whether based on its level of government funding or any other criteria, the definitions of "covered entities" under federal and state language access law may be helpful to consult in defining or qualifying what a limited service pregnancy center is.

There is No Bright Line Obligation to Provide Language Access Under Hawaii Law

HRS §321C-3(a) imposes an obligation on state and state-funded agencies to provide oral and written language services based upon a "<u>reasonableness</u>" standard to ensure "<u>meaningful</u> access to services, programs, and activities by limited English proficient [LEP] persons, which will be determined by <u>a totality of circumstances</u>, including the following factors:

- (1) The number or proportion of [LEP] persons served or encountered in the eligible service population;
- (2) The frequency with which [LEP] persons come in contact with the services, programs, or *activities;*
- (3) The nature and importance of the services, programs, or activities; and
- (4) The resources available to the State or covered entity and the costs." (Underlining added.)

Even strict adherence to the language of HRS 321C allows for flexibility and an analysis which may allow a limited service pregnancy center to forego this requirement if it determines that the "*nature and importance*" of the service does not warrant the translation and/or distribution of the notice; or if it does not have the "*resources*" to do so.

Accordingly, if the intent of this measure is to create a per senotice requirement, a general reference to HRS chapter 321C-3 may not suffice.

Hawaii Law Provides a Brightly Outlined 'Safe Harbor' for the Translation of "Vital Documents"

In light of the flexible "reasonableness" standard, which employs the 'four-factor analysis' described above, this Committee may instead wish to amend this language so it references the more specific 'safe harbor' provision in **HRS§321C-3(c)**, which outlines this numerical guide that may be easier to both comply with and monitor:

"[E]ach state agency and covered entity shall provide written translations of vital documents to limited English proficient persons who seek to access services, programs, or activities, as follows:

(1) Written translations of vital documents for each eligible limited English proficient group that constitutes five per cent or one thousand, whichever is less, of the population of persons eligible to be served or likely to be affected or encountered; or

(2) If there are fewer than fifty persons in a limited English proficient group that reaches the five per cent threshold in paragraph (1), written notice in the primary language to the limited English proficient language group of the right to receive competent oral interpretation of those written materials, free of cost."

Section 1557 of the Affordable Care Act Simply Requires 'Tagline' Notices be in the State's Top 15 Languages

Alternatively, an even more simple requirement might resemble the ACA's obligation its "covered entities" alert LEP individuals to the availability of free language assistance services in the top 15 languages spoken in the State. These top 15 languages have already been determined by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and can be found on their website here: <u>https://www.hhs.gov/civil-rights/for-individuals/section-1557/1557faqs/top15-languages/index.html</u>

Summary

To reiterate, OLA takes no position on this bill, but offers comments with respect to its language access provisions to: (1) note that this proposal greatly expands the reach of existing language access obligations from government-funded entities to those within the private sector; (2) caution that the current reference to Hawaii's Language Access Law may not ensure the proposed notice will be translated by limited service pregnancy centers because of its flexible standard; and (3) suggest alternative model language that will be more likely to ensure language access compliance consistent with the spirit of this bill.

Fiscal Implications: S.B. 501 S.D. 1, H.D. 1 would require regulatory oversight of "limited service pregnancy centers" not limited to civil penalties and civil actions for enforcement and remedy which would include fiscal costs.

Department Testimony: The Department of Health (DOH) acknowledges the importance of 4 patients understanding their options for public programs that provide immediate free or low-cost 5 access to comprehensive family planning services. This amended version broadens the definition 6 of a "limited service pregnancy center" and now includes all family planning/pregnancy service 7 providers, all federally qualified health centers (FQHC), community health centers, hospitals, 8 9 clinics, and private physician offices/practices. The DOH contracts with 14 health care providers for family planning services with over 25 sites statewide. This new definition may also require 10 11 redundant actions by current health care providers and facilities to comply with federal laws and 12 regulations, including the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and 45 CFR 164. 13

Dear Chairperson Scott Nishimoto, Vice Chair Joy San Buenaventura and members of the House Committee on Judiciary, thank you for the opportunity to **testify IN OPPOSITION to SB501**.

My name is Ana Schaetzle, I'm an MD licensed in Brazil, who has lived in Hawaii for 13 years. I am the executive director of The Pregnancy Center (TPC) in Kona, Big Island, Hawaii.

TPC is of tremendous value to our local community on the Big Island. We are pro-woman and provide a safe, confidential place to those facing an unplanned pregnancy. Since all of our services are free, we do not benefit financially from a woman's reproductive choice as other agencies may. We empower men and women to make informed choices. Many women in unplanned pregnancies will tell you that they feel an abortion is their only choice. Whether you consider yourself pro-life or pro-choice that should never be. TPC provides, for free, needed support, services, material assistance and medical screenings so no woman needs to ever feel that abortion is the only choice. The abortion lobby is wrongfully attacking Pregnancy Centers with SB501.

TPC has been serving men, women and families for 25 years and we are the only pregnancy center on the Big Island. We serve an average of 400 families each year. Our services are 100% free and they include pregnancy tests, ultrasound exams and a vast video and book library of educational resources, with reward gift certificates. This is one way through which we can give small financial help for the low-income families in our communities. Very close to 100% of the families we serve are in that category.

TPC is a small faith-based ministry and it is precisely our faith what motivates us to do what we do: help others. It motivated me to leave a successful career in Brazil, as a doctor, to come here and serve the less privileged among us.

SB501, forcing pregnancy centers to refer for abortion, violates our First Amendment rights of freedom of speech and freedom of religion. The additional regulations this bill creates will have to be monitored and enforced. This will create a cost to the state.

I would also like to bring to your attention that here in Kona, 70% of the patients we serve are NOT seeking an abortion. They are happy moms who come to us because it's faster to schedule an ultrasound with us than to get a doctor's appointment for prenatal care as we have a shortage of doctors on this island. We help them by confirming their pregnancy, determining gestational age, due date and viability. We also help by giving them information on how to start off their pregnancy in a healthy way.

We are 100% privately funded, 95% volunteer based and have been doing our job with the sole motivation of helping our communities.

With all due respect I urge you to vote NO on SB501. I believe you would truly be helping the communities of our islands.

May the Lord richly bless and keep you.

Chair Nishimoto, Vice Chair San Buenaventura and Hawaii House of Representatives, my name is Faith Nickelsen, Volunteer Nurse Manager and Sonographer for A Place for Women in

Waipio (APFWIW). Thank you for the opportunity to testify. I am a registered nurse licensed with the State of Hawaii. I received my Bachelor's of Science in Nursing Degree from the University of Hawai'i at Manoa in the Spring of 2004. I am employed with Kaiser Permanente Hospital, work on a specialty unit, Labor and Delivery, as a staff nurse. I have retained this position for the past twelve plus years and am a Charge Nurse on the same unit. I received Certificates of Completion in Limited Obstetric Ultrasound in the first and second trimester from Sonography Now and Soundview Imaging Partners. These two companies strictly follow the guidelines from the Association of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses (AWHONN) and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), and American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine (AIUM) for training in limited obstetric ultrasound. My competencies in this area of practice is renewed every two years and my certification is posted in our ultrasound room.

I have served as a volunteer at APFWIW for the past seven years. I have been volunteering as a nurse sonographer and have performed ultrasounds on clients for a total of eight years. At APFWIW, my duties as a nurse include obtaining history of health and physical assessments, performing preliminary ultrasound scans (if the client meets our policy criteria), client teaching, counseling, updating our policy and procedures, and training to our volunteers regarding the subject matter, (i.e. Fetal Development, Sexually Transmitted Infections, Hepatitis B exposure, Exposure to blood-borne infections, etc.) and oversee other nurse volunteers. I also serve as a medical resource for our clients and volunteers, which is in my scope of practice. I fall under the direction of a Medical Director, Dr. Vivien Wong, a radiologist licensed in Hawaii and California and Executive Center's Director Suzanne Skinner. All medical staff adhere to policy and procedures, which have been in place prior to performing ultrasounds. Our clients perform "self-administered" pregnancy tests. APFWIW is "self-regulated" and do provide confidential, private, safe and secure services. Our center provides references/referrals to Health providers for health services, directing them to DSSH for programs such as WIC and Med-quest, other resources such as Catholic Charities for their programs. The center receives no government funding, is Donor-Funded, is non-profit, and all of our volunteers work for FREE. APFWIW's volunteers, including myself, are driven by compassion, love, sincerity, and integrity.

We at APFWIW serve the community by providing women and men the necessary information needed to make an informed decision. The information provided to our clients are current and are referenced on all of our pamphlets, handouts, and videos. The clients APFWIW encounter are women and men looking for answers. We at APFWIW provide options other than abortion. Our mission is to uphold LIFE, not destroy it. APFWIW is a "faith-based" organization and is a Ministry of Calvary Chapel Pearl Harbor. Some of our clients feel abortion is the only way out. These are people ranging on average 15-35 years old most times. Some are married, married with children, teenagers, single, divorced and military. The clients leave empowered with education to aid in their **own** decision-making process. As part of APFWIW ministry, baby items and mommy items which have been donated are given to our clients who decide to parent/carry as a gift from our ministry. There are other services APFWIW provide for our clients who decide to parent/carry at NO COST to them, (i.e. Child birthing classes and newborn classes). APFWIW also provides a Post-Abortive Recovery Bible Study 10-week course for those wounded by past abortions for both women and men.

SB501, SD1, HD1 will be violating our **1st Amendment rights**, by forcing us into directing our clients to places that perform abortions and to provide family planning contraceptives. Whether spoken or posted, this is a **violation** of our "**Freedom of Religion**" and **Freedom of Speech**." We are not, and should not be government mandated! If we are compelled to speak, post signs directing women to places that perform abortion or provide contraceptions, what then of the "Pro-choice"community? Will they be compelled to post signs or verbally direct women and men who've been hurt by abortion to seek counseling through our "faith-based organizations"? Remember this, they are government-funded and make a profit on abortions, our organizations profit nothing but provide a non-judgmental place where these clients share their hurts and fears. I say, stop wasting taxpayers monies.

Statement of the Hawaii Section of the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists SB 501: SUPPORT with CPH/JDL Amendments

The Hawaii Section of the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (HI ACOG) supports SB 501 and other legislative proposals that increase the transparency of healthcare services and promote the provision of medically acute information to patients. As a Section of the Nation's leading group of physicians dedicated to improving health care for women, HI ACOG represents more than 200 obstetrician/gynecologist physicians in our state.

<u>Limited Service Pregnancy Centers (Crisis Pregnancy Centers) Mislead Women and Delay</u> <u>Important Reproductive Healthcare</u>

- Limited service pregnancy centers, also known as crisis pregnancy centers, are a growing threat to women's health. These centers exist in order to dissuade and prevent people facing unintended pregnancy from accessing safe abortion care and other reproductive health services.
- Limited service pregnancy centers often provide medically inaccurate information and perform medical exams without a licensed or qualified clinician. They target women who are faced with unintended pregnancy and lack access to care by offering free pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, counseling, or prenatal care to vulnerable women without providing clear information about the limits of services offered or medically indicated referrals to qualified healthcare providers.
- Visits to limited service pregnancy centers often result in delays in accessing prenatal care, sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment, appropriate care following sexual assault, an other medically indicated reproductive health services, particularly for women with language barriers, limited financial resources, or limited health literacy.
- Personal health and other sensitive information disclosed to personnel at limited service pregnancy centers are not legally protected as is similar information provided to licensed healthcare providers.
- Several states and municipalities have proposed legislation to protect the public from the deceptive practices of limited service pregnancy centers. Most notably, California recently enacted the Reproductive Freedom, Accountability, Comprehensive Care, and Transparency (FACT) Act. Similar to SB 501, the FACT Act requires that licensed pregnancy-related clinics disseminate a notice stating the existence of publicly-funded family-planning services, including contraception and abortion. The FACT Act also requires that unlicensed clinics disseminate a notice stating that they are not licensed by the State of California. The FACT Act was upheld by the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in October of 2016. The Ninth Circuit also maintains appellate jurisdiction over Hawai'i.

Therefore, **our ACOG section strongly supports SB 501 with the amendment suggested by CPH/JDL that further inform and protect the public, as below**.

• We recommend amending the required written notice to include language informing potential clients that the clinic does not provide abortion services or abortion referrals, and that only ultrasounds performed by qualified healthcare professionals and read by licensed clinicians should be considered medically accurate.

We stand ready to provide you with factual information on women's health issues that come before the Legislature and hope you will contact us at any time.

Good morning members of the House Committee on Judiciary:

As we are met with troubling times of the potential of female reproductive rights repealed and funding revoked, Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies Coalition of Hawaii (HMHB) strongly supports S.B. 501 S.D.1 H.D.1, which would ensure all women seeking information regarding pregnancy/family planning services receives the information she needs to make the decisions regarding her pregnancy, including:

- require all Limited Pregnancy Centers to notify clients of all available publicly-funded family planning services, including contraception and abortion
- require the centers to protect privacy of health care information collected from patients seeking services
- require the centers to provide pregnancy test results without delay to the client
- require the centers to disclose that they are not licensed as health care providers by the state of Hawaii

Currently, Limited Service Pregnancy Centers, also known as Crisis Pregnancy Centers, often offer misleading pregnancy information to clients seeking information, such as:

- administering misleading and even false pregnancy health care information
- withholding test results and medical records from patients for an unreasonable amount of time
- providing inaccurate ultrasound imaging
- leading pregnant women to believe that they are farther along in their pregnancy, than they actually are
- denying patients from needed referrals for vital reproductive health care
- not protecting patients' private medical information

Often, vulnerable women visit these centers in times of crisis, in need of supportive care and family planning information. The unsafe actions committed by these centers can potentially endanger a women's pregnancy and her right to safe and effective family planning methods. Our mission, at HMHB, is to improve Hawaii's maternal, child and family health through public education, advocacy and partner development. We strongly support S.B. 501 S.D.1 H.D.1 so that all women can have fair, accessible and private care.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify IN OPPOSITION to SB501 SD1 HD1.

Pregnancy Resource Centers are a tremendous value to our local communities in Hawaii. They are **pro-woman** and **provide safe, confidential places to those facing an unplanned pregnancy**. CPCs NEVER "force" any clients to watch anything they don't want to watch AND clients sign documentation stating they have been given a "choice" to say yes or no to any kind of video presentation. Opposition to SB 501 SD1

Aloha members of the Judiciary Committee,

As a concerned citizen of Hawaii, a pastor of Emmanuel Lutheran Church, and board member of the Malama Pregnancy Center of Maui, which falls directly under consideration by SB 501, I state our strong opposition to this bill, and ask all of you to vote against this measure so that our state is not saddled with an unconstitutional law and attempts to enforce bad legislation.

First of all I would like to give testimony to the positive good that Pregnancy Centers, such as Malama Pregnancy Center (MPC), provide our community. Secondly, to state our objections to this legislation.

- MPC is a reputable, religious non-profit; privately funded; it receives no government funds.
- MPC serves the recognized need of women and girls who may be facing an unplanned pregnancy and feel unprepared and alone.
- MPC was established specifically to help women and girls to choose life for their children, and provide the encouragement and practical material support to do so.
- Services are strictly confidential, free of charge, and non-judgmental.
- It is our standard of integrity not to coerce, bully, or mislead any clientele.
- Both our website and forms <u>clearly disclose</u> that MPC <u>does not perform or refer for abortion</u>.
- We do provide medically accurate information regarding all choices that our clients have regarding their pregnancy decisions.
- MPC provides care and compassion to all women including those who are post-abortive.
- MPC provides prenatal, parenting, and life skills classes to walk alongside mothers and families.
- All clients served by MPC receive services voluntarily, and with transparency about the nature of our services. Limitation of services is clearly communicated when each client requests services.
- MPC provides material assistance to families and referrals to medical doctors, licensed professionals, and helpful community agencies. In addition, MPC provides referrals for clients to obtain health insurance.

Our objections to SB 501 are summarized as follows:

- The mandated notice in SB 501 constitutes a referral to how one may obtain abortion services, which violates our right to define and pursue a life-affirming mission.
- The Senate modified the required notice to state that a center does not refer for abortions, and yet follows with information about how to obtain state funded abortion services. This is inherently contradictory.

- MPC is not an agency of the state or funded by it, such that MPC could be required to promote a government agenda.
- Provisions for lawsuits against pregnancy centers punish them for being pro-life, or not advertising or advocating for abortion services.
- The government must not restrict freedom of speech or freedom of religion.
- Information on abortion is far more widely accessible than awareness of pregnancy centers. The government does not need to enlist pregnancy centers for advertising.
- The same level of scrutiny and enforcement of alternative care options is not being applied to Planned Parenthood (PP) and other abortion providers in the state, which makes it disingenuous to say this is simply about women's health; it's narrowly targeted legislation.
- PP profits from abortion services, and has a financial interest in both providing abortions and harming the reputation of pregnancy centers. Their website attacks pregnancy centers as "fake clinics" that don't give women all their options. This bill seems to track with their messaging.
- Pregnancy centers make no profit from any decision made by our clientele.
- How can the government compel a private non-profit or even a business, for that matter, to advertise services that are contrary to their beliefs? Such compulsion takes away the freedom of a faith based non-profit organization to operate according to its principles.
- The government has the responsibility to protect the rights of all citizens including those that adhere to a religious life-affirming conviction. Life-affirming pregnancy centers should not be punished for their beliefs.
- This legislation targets <u>5(!)</u> centers in Hawaii, and similar legislation has been struck down in other states, or is currently tied up in costly legal battles. This will undoubtedly be a costly measure for the state to adopt, and to accomplish very little, beyond interfering with a small number of religious non-profits.

For all of these reasons, I urge our Representative to uphold your ethical obligation to discard laws that do not apply equally and fairly to all, and that infringe on freedoms and principles guaranteed by the United States Constitution. Mahalo for listening. Vote NO on SB 501.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify IN OPPOSITION to SB501 SD1 HD1

I've been DISAPPOINTED by all of the Senators and Representatives who have voted in favor of this legislation in the committees that have moved this bill to your committee. These legislators have shown no concern for the **unconstitutionality** of this bill, and continued to move this bill forward with no concern for the First Amendment. I'm hopeful that this committee, who's scope includes "constitutional matters," will finally see the **unconstitutionality** of this bill, **based on actual court cases**, not just opinion, and will stop this bill from moving forward; thus, properly **protecting the First Amendment rights of Hawaii citizens** affected by this compelled speech bill, and **protecting the tax payers of Hawaii** from the high legal costs that will occur when this bill is challenged in court (if passed).

If this committee fails to stop this bill from moving forward, why even have a judiciary committee? This bill has been **attempted by the abortion industry in several locations** on the mainland, and **it has failed, or is still being legally challenged in <u>every</u> case. There is <u>not a single successful</u> unchallenged version of this bill anywhere! It is reckless for any representatives on THIS committee to vote yes on this bill, knowing its legal history, as it is the job of this committee to avoid these very issues. Thus, any representative on this committee who votes yes should not only be removed from this committee, but should also lose their seat in 2018, as they lack the level of judicial discernment needed to represent the people of Hawaii.**

I am hopeful that this committee will understand this important fact: The impacted **pregnancy centers targeted by this bully bill offer their services for <u>free</u>**. Legal minds understand that **commercial and professional regulations** <u>do not</u> **apply**, and thus attempts like this are considered <u>compelled speech</u> and thus **unconstitutional**. This was **confirmed by 4th Circuit Court** when they shot down similar legislation in Montgomery County, MD.

Please take the time to review below the legal history of this bill being pushed by the abortion industry on the mainland:

• Montgomery County, MD

- A federal judge in Maryland struck down a county law that mandated signage at limited service pregnancy centers. (*Centro Tepeyac v. Montgomery County*)
- The opinion of the court noted that "when core First Amendment interests are implicated, mere intuition [of a problem] is not sufficient. Yet that is all the County has brought forth: intuition and suppositions."
- The decision was affirmed by the US Court of Appeals for the 4th Circuit. In that ruling the court made the following comments:
 - "Because the dangers of <u>compelled speech</u> are real and grave, courts must be on guard whenever the state seeks to force an individual or private organization to utter a statement at odds with its most fundamental beliefs."
 - "In Wooley v. Maynard, 430 U.S. 705, 715 (1977), the Court quite explicitly noted that state action 'which forces an individual . . . to be an instrument for fostering public adherence to an ideological point of view' was <u>unacceptable under the First Amendment</u>."
- After losing the case, Montgomery County paid \$375,000 in attorneys' fees, costs, and nominal damages to the plaintiffs, and additionally incurred 4 years of legal expenses defending this unconstitutional law.

• <u>New York, NY</u>

- U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York issued an order that prohibited the city from enforcing its ordinance, which threatened pregnancy centers with heavy fines and possible closure if they didn't provide printed notices crafted by the city that emphasize abortion. (*Pregnancy Care Center of New York v. City of New York*)
- The city appealed that loss, and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 2nd Circuit affirmed most of the ruling, but the court did approve a settlement on one aspect of the law. However, the section of the law still in effect does not apply to the pregnancy centers since these centers already use licensed nurses and doctors to provide specific medical services like ultrasounds.
- The city of New York incurred 5 years of legal expenses defending the unconstitutional portions of this law.

• <u>Austin, TX</u>

- The Austin City Council passed an ordinance that required pregnancy centers post two signs about not performing or referring abortions. (*Austin LifeCare v. City of Austin*)
- Austin's ordinance was permanently enjoined from enforcement by the United States District Court in June 2014.
- The city of Austin had to pay \$100,000 in attorney fees and incurred 4 years of legal expenses defending this unconstitutional ordinance.

<u>California</u>

- A California law mandates that medical pregnancy centers post a notice in their waiting room on how to obtain a state funded abortion. (*NIFLA v. Becerra [Harris]*)
- The 9th Circuit Court, the most overturned circuit in our country, has denied an injunction request.
- An appeal to the US Supreme Court was recently filed. Given the 9th Circuit ruling was inconsistent with the 2nd Circuit and 4th Circuit rulings, the Supreme Court will decide the constitutionality once and for all.

• <u>Illinois</u>

- A new law forcing pregnancy resource centers to discuss abortion benefits and refer pregnant women for abortions despite their conscience-based opposition to abortion went into effective on January 1, 2017. This law is being challenged in Circuit Court of the Seventh Judicial Circuit. (*NIFLA v. Rauner*)
- This case has years of litigation ahead.

If this law is enacted in Hawaii, NIFLA (National Institute of Family & Life Advocates), our national affiliate, is prepared to file a lawsuit (NIFLA President's Update, February 2017, Vol. V No2):

Regarding the proposed Hawaii Law, "NIFLA will, as we have done with the California and Illinois laws, file a lawsuit in federal district court seeking an injunction to prohibit the enforcement of this law if it is enacted. We are working with our friends and fellow attorneys with the Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) to prepare such a law suit, if necessary."

What is not listed in this letter are the countless city and state governments who also reviewed this legislation proposed in their jurisdictions and **correctly decided to oppose it because they could easily see it was unconstitutional and wisely avoided a court battle**. I hope this committee will add Hawaii to this long list of wise legislators, and will avoid adding Hawaii to the list of legal battles.

Given the Constitutional issues with this bill, <u>and the history of case law defeating similar laws</u>, please consider the following:

- It would be fiscally and judicially prudent for the State of Hawaii to wait for the constitutionality ruling of the California law and Illinois law before preceding. It would be reckless for the judiciary committee to vote yes on this bill.
- As a completely free service to the community, our opposition to this bill is strictly constitutional. We are fighting for our freedom of religion and freedom of speech, as protected by the US Constitution.
- Supporters of this bill are financially motivated. This one-sided bill targets pregnancy centers specifically since these centers are pro-information. Meaning, they share "the complete story" with women, including abortion procedure information, potential complications, medical research regarding risks, and they actually let women see the ultrasound screen, something many abortion clinics hide from women in fear they will change their mind, and thus lose revenue for the abortion clinic. The abortion industry supports this bill since they view pregnancy centers as a threat to their business model.

I hope this committee will fulfill its responsibility to protect the people of Hawaii from this unconstitutional and costly bill, and that you will responsibly oppose SB501 SD1 HD1.

SB501 Judiciary Committee Chair Nishimoto and Committee Members:

My name is Tracey Clay-Whitehurst and I work at the Aloha Pregnancy Center in Kaneohe. I am asking you to vote no on SB501. This proposed bill is a violation of our constitutional rights of freedom of speech and freedom of religion. Pregnancy centers are pro-life, faith based organizations - why should we be required to provide information on how and where to receive abortions?

Pregnancy Centers are there to help women choose life for their babies, not to tell them where they can go to have those babies killed. We are there to tell women that they are strong and able and that we will help them in any way we can; whereas Abortion Centers tell women they are too weak, too young, too poor and that they can't. We speak life to the women who enter our Pregnancy Centers, whereas Abortion Centers speak death. We offer all of our services free of charge whereas Abortion Centers charge \$500-\$5,000 per abortion.

The pretense of full-disclosure in this bill is a falsehood. If it was true, then you would be requiring Abortion Centers to post a notice on their walls that they have limited services, such as: no pre-natal care; no adoption referrals; no parenting classes; no post-abortive care; and limited ultrasounds which they refuse to let the pregnant woman see, as they are only used to direct the abortionists in making sure they have removed all of the baby's body parts.

This proposed law would mandate that we violate our religious convictions, which is a violation of the 1st Amendment. This bill also amounts to compelled speech which is also a violation of the 1st Amendment. Similar bills in Maryland and New York have already failed to pass and the one in California is going to the Supreme Court for a decision. I volunteer at the Malama Pregnancy Center of Maui as a Board member. Please visit our website <u>www.mpcmaui.org</u> for more information on what services are provided and how they are provided. Also, if you have time I would be glad to provide a tour of our Center or answer any questions. We have provided many services to the public for almost 3 years now on Maui and the vast majority of our clients are very happy with the services they received. Services are confidential, honest, caring, accurate, not misleading and at no charge to the client. To emphasize, the reproductive health information given is accurate, thorough and detailed because it is written by experts in the magazine which clients read through titled "Before You Decide".

Basically this measure SB501 directly affecting our Center is unnecessary, extremely intrusive, violates our constitutional rights and should be voted down. This measure would mandate us to provide abortion referrals, a notice of how one may obtain abortion services, which violates our right to define and pursue a life-affirming mission. Both our website and forms clearly disclose that we do not perform or refer for abortion, and our right not to offer referrals for abortion is a constitutional right.

This measure's mandate is similar to the **Hobby Lobby** case's mandate. The Supreme Court ruled in favor of Hobby Lobby in 2014, that is was their right to exercise religion (under the constitution and the Religious Freedom Restoration Act) which struck down the "contraceptive mandate" in that bill. Similarly, our Center also exercises religious liberty and the Supreme Court would definitely rule in the Pregnancy Center's favor. This SB501 measure is very "restrictive" to only 5 Centers in Hawaii. This measure is certainly a limitation on our religious exercise right. Definitely the general public interest is NOT threatened considering there is full disclosure at these Centers and the information given is accurate.

All women, if they want abortion services know they can look it up on their cell phone and get that information instantly. There is no lack of resources to get abortion service information in Hawaii.

How can the government compel a private non-profit or even a business, for that matter, to advertise services that are contrary to their beliefs?

For example: If it wished, could the government force organic health food stores to post notices that GMOs were not proven harmful to health, and widely available at other stores? What about practitioners of homoeopathic or alternative medicine? Could the government force notices in their offices, recommending traditional Western alternatives, available elsewhere?

This takes away the freedom of a business or non-profit to operate according to its principles, and to engage in voluntary transactions with clients who are properly informed about the nature of services offered.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in opposition to SB 501 SD1.

As the Executive Director of a pregnancy resource center, The Malama Pregnancy Center of Maui (MPC) that values the sanctity of life and the unborn I have serious concerns about this bill. One concern is that the proposed bill would effectively censor the voice of MPC to compelled speech which is a violation of the First Amendment. The First Amendment of the United States Constitution protects MPC from a law of this nature. The government is prohibited from compelling a nonprofit faith-based organization to give a message which is in direct opposition and violation of its fundamental principles.

In addition, the proposed bill also violates First Amendment guarantees of freedom of religion. The Malama Pregnancy Center of Maui (MPC) is a faith-based ministry that is life-affirming and is opposed to abortion. The Malama Pregnancy Center's opposition to abortion simply translates that as a matter of religious principle and conviction we do not perform or refer for abortion. This law, if enacted, would mandate that our faith-based ministry violate our religious convictions and become an abortion referral agency.

The Malama Pregnancy Center of Maui is a tremendous value to our local community in Hawaii. We are prowoman and provide a non-judgmental, safe, and confidential place to those facing an unplanned pregnancy. We do not take away a women's right to choose, our mission is to provide more than one choice. We care about each woman deeply, and we care about her unique situation that she is facing. Since all our services are free, we do not benefit from a woman's reproductive choice as the abortion industry does. The abortion industry makes money aborting children. Why else would the abortion lobbyists and industry want to force others, even pro-life pregnancy centers to provide free abortion advertising?



The Malama Pregnancy Center of Maui empowers women in Hawaii to make informed choices. Many women faced with an unplanned pregnancy will tell you that they feel an abortion is their only choice. Whether you consider yourself pro-life or pro-choice, that should never be. Women are smart and deserve the opportunity to be informed with accurate information regarding pregnancy decisions including the choice to carry the preborn to term and to parent. MPC clearly communicates that we do not perform or refer clients for abortions. Thus, the client is not mislead regarding services offered. Pregnant women and girls need a place where they can find help and hope for themselves and for their babies. MPC exists to offer help and hope to our community.

The Malama Pregnancy Center's services are strictly confidential and free of charge. All our information is accurate and clearly communicated in a caring and compassionate environment. We care about women's health. The earlier a woman seeks medical care in her pregnancy the better. At MPC we offer early confirmation of pregnancy to help women take timely steps in their medical care. MPC offers women who believe they may be pregnant, via self-administered onsite pregnancy test, a positive pregnancy test verification form for her to obtain medical services and insurance. In addition, we refer her to a prenatal care provider. Our services help to streamline medical care. Please understand that all the Malama Pregnancy Center's services and paperwork are clear and confidential at every stage of the client experience beginning with our Limitation of Services form.

I feel that **SB501 SD1 HD1** is a one-sided bill clearly targeting Christian life-affirming nonprofit privately funded pregnancy resource centers.

- SB501 SD1HD1 does not truly meet its intended goal set forth in Section 1 of SB 501 SD1 HD1, of making "every possible effort to advise women of all available reproductive health programs". SB 501 SD1 HD1 does not require abortion providers to notify women and refer women to pregnancy resource centers for accurate information regarding the choice to carry and or parent (often women feel coerced into having an abortion), and for information regarding post abortion health related issues. This bill is one-sided and lacks health equity for all women seeking reproductive health programs.

-This one-sided bill violates the rights of those who operate pregnancy centers by violating our deeply held religious views of the sanctity of life by forcing pregnancy resource centers to promote abortion by posting or handing out the government's favored view. Forcing pregnancy resource centers to refer for abortion in any manner violates our First Amendment rights of the freedom of speech and freedom of religion.

Given the obvious disregard for the First Amendment rights of the religious organizations affected, I can only assume we will fight this law to the highest court. I am the current president of The Pearson Foundation of HI, Inc. and we all (24 members) stand in strong opposition to this bill.

We were founded in 1970 by Robert Pearson and his wife, Mary Jane who began encouraging young women to give birth to their unborn children as they believed abortion an intrinsically evil act that kills an unborn child and is detrimental to the mother as well. They adopted some of these babies that they saved and they are now successful, contributing members of American society. The Pearsons along with the help of the Knights of Columbus established the Mary Jane Home to provide housing for pregnant women in need of it. When the Pearsons left Hawaii, The Pearson Foundation of HI, became incorporated in 1986 as a private, non-profit 301c , and continued the Mary Jane Home until it came under the auspices of Catholic Charities where it continues today .

We are an all-volunteer organization and accept no funds from any government agencies. We rely on donations from a few churches, the Knight of Columbus and many personal donors who believe and support our cause. Presently we have two centers, one in Pearl City and one in Kalihi.

We have visibly posted in our centers that we are not a medical facility.

Upon entering our Pregnancy Centers, our clients are given a "Limitation of Services" sheet that discloses "we do not perform nor refer for abortion". See attachment.

We provide a **self-administered** free pregnancy test and non-judgmental confidential counseling and **documented** educational materials to our clients as well as referrals to doctors, adoption agencies, and state agencies like Medquest, WIC, Kalihi Palama for prenatal and child health needs and the Mary Jane Home for housing. If they have no insurance, we refer them to Waikiki Health and Kalihi Palama for STD testing or unrecognizable health problems and blood tests to confirm their pregnancy. We have new baby clothing and blankets, diapers and will provide a stroller or infant seat when needed at no charge to clients.

We are there donating our time and energy in order to give our clients the full and truthful information needed to make an informed decision regarding their pregnancy. Abortion clinics, for some strange reason, do not have to disclose the dangerous side-effects that abortion can cause. That is a requirement for all other medical procedures. In this way, we are doing a service to women regarding their overall health. Women's health is not all about contraception and abortion. Many times, these devices are what lead to physical illness and or depression and Post traumatic stress. Abortion has led many women to become alcoholics and/or drug users. There has been independent research and personal testimonies to this. Since abortion has been legalized, there has been more child abuse, not less as it was supposed to prevent, with the disproven theory that a wanted child would not become an abused child. Due to abortion, human life has less value. It has become a commodity that can be disposed of at will. Example fetal organ sales.

This bill to force our organization to advertise where our clients can obtain an abortion is totally against our personal beliefs. It is not advantageous to women but actually harmful. It does not serve the purpose it is intended to. Also, similar legislation forcing anyone to go against their religious or personal beliefs has been proven unconstitutional in the Supreme Court. See Wooley v. Maynard, 430 US 705 (1977).

The organization and businesses you might better be addressing legislation to is Planned Parenthood and other money making abortion clinics. Former managers and personnel of Planned Parenthood have told of their having monthly quotas to meet for abortions; in order to stay solvent. They are rewarded with a pizza party or other prize if they meet or surpass their quota. So they are actually encouraging women to have an abortion. There is no regard to personal health in this. You want us to recommend a client here??

I hope you will look into this matter further before enacting into law something not only detrimental to women's health but unconstitutional as well. I ask you to please oppose this bill.

I am writing on behalf of A Place for Women in Waipio. I have worked as a volunteer for over a year answering phone calls, sitting with clients, and performing ultrasounds. I am a registered nurse (RN) in the states of California and Hawaii with a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree.

Certifications

In response to accusations that we do not have medically certified staff, I would like you to consider that our facility has licensed nurses that are overseen by Dr. Vivian Wong. In addition, I have received training in ultrasound sonography through Sonography Now. The credentials and training certificates are displayed in our medical room. All my scans are reviewed by our MD, and we are HIPAA compliant even though we do not bill for any of our services. I would not put my nursing license on the line if I was not 100% sure that I was practicing within my scope of practice.

Clients

In response to how we obtain our clients, I have personally answered phone calls, and we offer our services that are appropriate to their needs. These clients are notified on the phone that we do not offer or refer for abortions. Most clients find us through our website where it also indicates that we do not offer or refer for abortions. In addition, all medical questions are referred to our medically licensed staff. I am thankful to be able to volunteer my time at A Place for Women to serve women in our community facing difficult situations, no matter what their final decision.

Please vote NO on SB501 so that we can continue offering our free services to the community without compromising our mission. Help defend our freedom of speech and religion.

Hawaii Family Forum is a non-profit, pro-family education organization committed to preserving and strengthening families in Hawaii. We oppose this bill because (1) it is a direct violation of freedom of speech, and (2) a similar law in California is on current appeal to the United States Supreme Court that will determine its constitutionality of law.

(1) SB501 HD1 will force pro-life pregnancy centers to promote abortion and contraception services that, in many cases, are a direct violation of their conscience and freedom of speech.

The government is prohibited from compelling a faith-based organization to give a message which violates its fundamental principles. Not only is this bad public policy, but it is also an unjust and dangerous public policy.

(2) This bill is identical to a law (AB775) passed in 2015 by the California legislature and was appealed in *National Institute of Family and Life Advocates v. Harris*. Although the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit upheld AB 775, it is currently on appeal in the United States Supreme Court. Our understanding is that it is expected that the high court may accept the appeal and, if so, argument on the merits of the law could be made this fall.

We simply ask that the Hawaii legislature not move ahead on this bill until the current litigation is completed and the courts have determined the constitutionality of the law. We respectfully ask that you hold this bill in committee.

The Hawaii Catholic Conference is the official public policy voice for the Roman Catholic Church in the State of Hawaii. SB 501 HD1 would require licensed covered facilities that provide family planning or pregnancy-related services to disseminate a notice to all clients stating that every pregnant woman has the right to decide whether to have a child or to obtain an abortion.

We oppose this bill because SB 501 HD1 violates First Amendment Free Speech guarantees by coercing entities and individuals to engage in speech contrary to their own moral and ethical perspectives. On its surface, the bill pretends to want to "regulate" the state's pregnancy centers/clinics, however this unfair legislation may discourage pregnant women from getting the assistance that they need and deserve. In addition, it will expose many of these pregnancy centers/clinics, including its directors and board members, to needless criminal or civil sanctions for failure to comply.

These centers, which provide free care to all clients and help save taxpayer money, offer a wide range of pregnancy related counseling and services to women. While well intentioned, we believe SB 501 HD1 unfairly targets these centers because of their viewpoints, a direct violation of freedom of speech protections.

Furthermore, many of these clinics are operated and staffed by entities and individuals who are opposed to abortion and contraceptive services on religious grounds. The bill effectively requires these clinics and their employees to be accessories in the provision of these services, in violation of their rights to free exercise of religion. Many women in Hawaii receive free care and support from these centers every year. To protect their First Amendment rights, we respectfully request you hold SB 501 HD1 in committee.

Dear Chairmen, Vice Chairmen and Committee Members,

My name is Jim Hochberg and I am a civil rights attorney who has practiced law in Hawaii since 1984 (33 years). I am also an Alliance Defending Freedom attorney in Hawaii and in that capacity serve as legal counsel to Calvary Chapel Pearl Harbor and its ministry A Place For Women In Waipio. We are currently drafting the Complaint to commence litigation to challenge this bill if it becomes law. In advance of that eventuality, I testify in opposition to this bill on the grounds that it would, if passed, violate First Amendment rights and the rights of conscience of those who oppose uttering the words and ideas required by this law. Hopefully, this testimony provides you with the legal arguments to defer the bill from further consideration.

First of all it is critical to understand that whenever you require that a private citizen or group post a notice containing words of any description, you are compelling the person posting the notice to speak the words in the notice. In this country, under the First Amendment free speech protections, when the government compels speech of any kind, it is frowned upon unless it overcomes tough constitutional hurdles. With SB501, the compelled speech concerns a matter of grave public disagreement related to the issue of abortion and contraception. The act of this body to compel speech taking one side of that public disagreement violates the rights of those compelled to speak

the words but who disagree with the words. There are many issues that constitute matters of grave public disagreement. Consider President Trump's current presidency. Imagine your response to him issuing an executive action that requires all legislators to publicly say only positive things about his presidency if the legislator is in any state that receives federal funds. That would be compelled speech that should be anathema to most of the legislators in Hawaii. Hopefully that example brought the issue to light.

SB501 consists of about 75 words the legislature seeks to compel some of its citizens to utter whether or not the citizen agrees with the content. Even for those who agree with every word required by this bill, everyone should oppose the compelling of the speech because once some speech can be compelled against a citizen against his will, other speech can be compelled against other citizens against their will. At the end, all citizens are subject to uttering words they do not desire to say. Some of my friends would think it good for a law to require citizens to pray. My other friend Mitch Kahle would feel assaulted by such a law. Compelled speech always steps on someone's toe.

* SB 501 cannot stand against such U.S. Supreme Court standards protecting the free speech of the pregnancy centers.

The State of Hawaii, including the legislature, cannot constitutionally compel speech in order to take sides in the public debate over the morality and efficacy of contraception and abortion by compelling the proponents of one side of that public debate to publish notices that force them to advocate for the other side in the debate. That issue was settled a few years ago by the Second Circuit court in its case called *Evergreen, Ass'n Inc. v City of New York*, 740 F.3d 233 (2014), where the appeals court held that contrary to the First Amendment, the required abortion disclosures "will change the way in which a pregnancy services center, it if so chooses, discusses the issues"; the court also struck down the law for "requiring pregnancy services centers to advertise on behalf of the City" the abortion services the city provides. SB501 does the same and will meet the same fate.

SB 501 also runs afoul of the constitutional protections that restrict speech the government can impose in the context of abortion or other controversial issues. In 2014, the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals struck down an informed consent law requiring doctors to show women an ultrasound and describe the baby before an abortion. That appellate court held that mere fetal facts have "ideological implications," because they all fall on one side of the abortion debate" and "promote a pro-life message." *Stuart v Cannitz*, 774 F3d 238, 242, 246 (4th Cir. 2014). Likewise, compelling pregnancy centers to provide information on how to obtain a state-funded abortion also "falls on one side of the abortion debate." and is equally unconstitutional. The U.S. Supreme Court insists that "compelled statements of opinion" are constitutionally no different that "compelled statements of 'fact,' since either form of compulsion burdens protected speech." *Riley v. National Federation of*

the Blind of North Carolina, Inc., 487 U.S. 781 at 797 (988). In *Sorrell v. IMS Health Inc.*, the U.S. Supreme Court stated that "[t]he First Amendment requires heightened scrutiny whenever the government creates 'a regulation of speech because of disagreement with the message it conveys." 564 U.S. 552 at 566 (2011) (quoting *Ward v Rock Against Racism*, 491 U.S. 781, 791 (1989). Less than two months ago the Eleventh Circuit, en banc, struck down a content-based restriction on speech of medical providers regarding safety of firearms, *Wollschlaeger v. Governor of Florida*, -- F.2d --, No. 12-14009, 2017 WL632740 (11th Cir. Feb. 16, 2017).

The Constitutions of the United States of America and State of Hawaii prohibit the legislature from enacting laws such as SB 501 that compel speech by those who do not wish to utter the compelled message. The U. S. Supreme Court has explained that the "right to speak and the right to refrain from speaking are complementary components of the broader concept of individual freedom of mind." *Wooley v Maynard*, 430 U.S. 705, 714 (1977) (citing *W. Va. State Bd. of Educ. v. Barnette*, 319 U.S. 624, 637 (1943). The highest court in this country has emphasized that the First Amendment protects not only the right of a speaker to choose what to say, but also the right of the speaker to decide what not to say. *Hurley, v. Irish-Am. Gay, Lesbian, & Bisexual Grp. of Bos.*, 515 U. S. 557, 573 (1995), quoting *Pac. Gas & Elec. Co. v Pub. Util. Comm'n of Cal.*, 475 U.S. 1, 16 (1986). The seminal quote from *Hurley* at page 579 reads:

The very idea that a noncommercial speech restriction be used to produce thoughts and statements acceptable to some groups or, indeed, all people, grates on the First Amendment, for it amounts to nothing less than a proposal to limit speech in the service of orthodox expression. The Speech Clause has no more certain antithesis. While the law is free to promote all sorts of conduct in place of harmful behavior, it is not free to interfere with speech for no better reason than promoting an approved message or discouraging a disfavored one, however enlightened either purpose may strike the government.

The pregnancy centers offer their services pro bono or free of charge. The U.S. Supreme Court held in the context of provision of pro bono provision of professional services, that such speech was entitled to the highest level scrutiny under first amendment jurisprudence, not the lower standard afforded some commercial speech. *In re Primus*, 436 U.S. 412 (1978). Therefore, the pregnancy centers will also be entitled to hold SB501 to that highest level of scrutiny. The state seldom prevails in First Amendment litigation under the strict scrutiny standard. Fifty years ago the U.S. Supreme Court in *NAACP v Button*, 371 U.S. 415 (1963) held that "only a compelling state interest in the regulation of a subject within the State's constitutional power to regulate can justify limiting First Amendment freedoms." at pages 438-39. The Court went on to say that "a state may not, under the guise of prohibiting professional misconduct, ignore constitutional rights." at page 439.

To the extent that a person at a pregnancy center objects to abortion on the basis of religious belief, the compelled speech in support of abortion and related information required by this bill if enacted into law would also violate First Amendment religious liberty. The religion-based pregnancy centers remain the targets of the compelled speech required by this bill. These pregnancy centers are faith based ministries that are prolife and oppose abortion. Such opposition to abortion means that as a matter of religious principle they do not perform or teach about or refer for abortion. This law, if enacted, would mandate that such faith-based ministries violate their religious convictions and become abortion referral agencies.

The disclosure and notice requirements in this bill are somewhat similar, but not identical, to a law passed in 2015 by the California legislature. The California law was challenged on behalf of pregnancy centers in the federal courts in California. For your information, the Petition For Certiorari was filed March 21, 2017 with the U.S. Supreme Court on that California case. The response is due April 20, 2017. It is expected that the high court will accept the appeal due to the split in the circuit courts and, argument on the merits of the law will be made this fall -- probably October. Why pass such an unconstitutional law in advance of that ruling? There is no need for you to do so. It would be much more prudent to wait for the final decision at the U.S. Supreme Court.

In further support of that suggestion, SB501 is more pernicious than the California law by creating a private right of action against the person who objects to making the compelled speech. This private right of action is a battering ram for use by the opposite sides of the abortion debate against the other in an effort to drive the other out of business.

SB501 also fails to advance the purposes for which it purports to be needed. The factual representations upon which this bill is premised in the preamble raise several questions themselves. First of all, what is the evidence that support the preamble? What information that was shared with a pregnancy center client failed to meet the standard which SB501 seeks to implement? Who was the speaker and who was the listener? When did this discussion take place? There actually is no evidence supporting the stated need for the bill. That will be the subject of discovery in the challenging litigation.

In addition, SB501 fails to meet the goal for the Department of Health set out in Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 321-1. That statute requires that the Department of Health to pursue a statewide policy of "health equity". HRS 321-1 defines "health equity" as "assuring equal opportunity for all people in the State to attain their full health potential." In light of that, the legislative findings in SB501 fail to take into consideration several medical facts related to pregnancy which health equity would counsel should be included.

One such medical fact is that abortion can have an extremely negative, long lasting, psychological and emotional effect. While the legislative findings appear to have determined that abortion is the answer for an unintended pregnancy, for many women, abortion leaves in its wake women who are devastated by the emotional toll abortion causes them. Just because abortion providers don't like that medical fact doesn't make it any less factual. Part of the post-abortion counseling services provided to women by a pregnancy center address those negative effects. Pregnancy centers address that toll and women being referred for abortion should be notified of the condition and the available counseling.

Other sound medical information which HRS 321-1 should compel you to require be provided by those subject to SB501 includes that the multi-pill, RU486 abortion drug process, once started, is safely reversible under certain circumstances. In addition, information about the concern about a causal link between abortion and breast cancer should also be shared if health equity as defined in Chapter 321 is the goal in Hawaii. SB 501 violates this statewide health policy by failing to require that abortion providers provide their customers with appropriate, truthful, complete information concerning post abortion, RU486 and breast cancer health issues.

Not only does SB501 seek intentionally to violate the rights of those who operate pregnancy centers targeted by this bill based on the content of the speech this bill compels, the process the Senate and the House used to pass SB501 to your committee violated the Constitutional rights of some of those desiring to testify in opposition. The litigation will ask the court to review the infringement of citizens' rights under the First Amendment to petition their government for the redress of grievances. This bill is greatly flawed.

For the foregoing reasons I oppose the bill and ask that you kill it today in committee. If you have any questions please feel free to call me.

Dear CHAIRPERSON SCOTT NISHIMOTO, VICE CHAIR, JOY SAN BUENAVENTURA AND MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify IN OPPOSITION to SB501 SD1 HD1.

I am the director of operations for a pregnancy resource center that serves the community of Oahu, and I have serious concerns about this bill. Our pregnancy center, A Place for Women in Waipio, is a ministry of Calvary Chapel Pearl Harbor and located in the church building. Being a ministry of a Christian church, our mission is to empower women with knowledge before they make a very difficult decision about their health and the health of their unborn child while showing them the love of Christ.

My religious beliefs and that of the church I serve - adamantly hold that abortion is the killing of an innocent life. So though we have abortion education, it is our policy not to perform or refer for abortions. One of the free services we provide is post abortion recovery classes for women and men wounded by abortions. Asking us to refer women to the exact thing we offer recovery classes for is contradictory and goes against our religious principles. This form of compelled speech is a violation of our First Amendment rights. If this bill becomes law in Hawaii, it could set a disturbing precedence allowing the government to force speech on the churches of America.

Even though this bill should be rejected on the grounds that it is a violation of the First Amendment rights of my church, our volunteers and myself to force us to refer for abortion in any manner, due to inaccurate testimony submitted against us, I feel I need to defend A Place for Women against untrue claims as to how we operate as a limited service pregnancy center.

It needs to be emphasized that all paperwork is clear at every stage of the counseling process including the medical documentation as to what our services cover and who will be providing those services. We in no way deceive clients as to what scope of services we offer.

SETTING THE RECORD STRAIGHT

Legislators, organizations and citizens that are for SB501 have expressed that they want women to get accurate information about their pregnancy options and implied that limited service pregnancy centers are misleading clients. The only testimony previously submitted by an actually Oahu limited service pregnancy center client was against A Place for Women in Waipio. We were very surprised by what





she stated in her testimony against us. The opinion she expressed on her voluntary exit survey the day she received services told a different story from the testimony that supports the need for SB501. It appears that the only testimony supporting the claims against limited service pregnancy centers may have been misleading itself.

CLAIM: At the 2/3/17 hearing for SB501, testimony was submitted by a past client. She painted a very negative picture of her experience at A Place for Women in Waipio.

FACT: At the end of our appointments, we ask the clients if they would like to fill out a opinion exit survey about their experience with us. Since she willingly testified previously that she was our client and her opinion of her experience with us, I have been advised we can legally share information from her voluntary opinion exit survey that she completed the day of her visit so the record can reflect her feelings at that time.

Each client is given guestions that they select an answer ranging from Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree.

She selected **Strongly Agree**, (the highest mark possible), for the following questions.

I found the counseling room comfortable. - STRONGLY AGREE The staff treated me with respect. - STRONGLY AGREE The staff showed concern for me and my situation. - STRONGLY AGREE I felt free to express what I wanted for myself. - STRONGLY AGREE I was given the help I needed and/or referrals I needed. - STRONGLY AGREE I would recommend A Place for Women in Waipio to my friends. - STRONGLY AGREE

She then decided to add extra comments on the blank lines. She wrote: "Debbie and Cindy were amazing! Very understanding and informative. They made my experience very comfortable!"

Now that She is President of Planned Parenthood's Generation Action at HPU her impression of an experience she had with us a few years ago has changed from what she voluntarily expressed the day of service.

CLAIM: A Place for Women in Waipio released Private Health Information about a client.

FACT: This did not happen. We uphold the highest standards of privacy and I can also assure that no client information has ever been released without authorization from the client.

CLAIM: It was stated that we "target" women "without providing clear information about the limits of services offered." (ACOG Testimony, 2/2/17). And ,"These limited service pregnancy centers mislead women into believing that they are licensed health care providers instead of the biased and limited service providers that they are." (Women's Caucus Democratic Party of Hawaii testimony 3/16/17)

FACT: We have a "Limitation of Services" form that every client must sign before any counseling session begins that states the Life Advocate counselors are lay people and if the client wants a professional, we can offer a referral. It also states we provide a urine pregnancy test and the client should consult a physician whether it is positive or negative to confirm the results. The form also states in bold print we do not perform or refer for abortion. Also, our website states that we do not perform or refer for abortion and on the phone anyone seeking abortion information is told we do not perform or refer for abortion. We actually screen our calls to try to verify that only women who meet our scope of services come in for an appointment. If they are not interested in pregnancy options counseling, they go elsewhere.





CLAIM: In the ACOG Testimony dated 2/2/17, it was stated that limited service pregnancy centers "perform medical exams without a licensed or qualified clinician."

FACT: ALL our medical services are provided exclusively by licensed and qualified clinicians. ACOG's statement is absolutely false. The medical services are provided under the direct authorization and supervision of our Medical Director, Dr. Vivien Wong, a board certified radiologist, who authorizes and reviews every ultrasound scan performed on our patients. The licensed clinicians who perform the scans have been thoroughly trained and demonstrated proven competency to perform limited obstetric ultrasounds pursuant to AWHONN (Association of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses) guidelines. The limited obstetric ultrasounds are performed to confirm a viable intrauterine pregnancy, establish gestational age and confirm cardiac activity.

Non-medical volunteers are not allowed to perform any ultrasounds. Before an ultrasound is performed a client must sign the "Medical Services Consent and Release Form." This form makes it clear in writing the purpose of the ultrasound, that a medical professional trained in limited obstetric ultrasound will perform the ultrasound, that a licensed physician will be reading the scans and that no follow-up care will be provided for prenatal care.

CLAIM: "Limited service pregnancy centers in Hawai'i are offering women biased, misleading, and even false pregnancy and health care information ... " (NASW testimony dated 3/15/17) and "Currently, Limited Service Pregnancy Centers, also known as Crisis Pregnancy Centers, often offer misleading pregnancy information to clients seeking information" (Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies testimony 2/23/17)

FACT: This is an unsubstantiated claim that seems to be a common talking point for those who support this bill. To my knowledge no one from NASW's organization or the other groups making this claim have been to our ministry and reviewed our information. We reference the sources of our information on our website and literature. There may be some information that these special interest groups disagree with, but their different opinion does not make our information biased, misleading or false.

In fact, one group, Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies Coalition of Hawaii wrote a testimony making claims of Limited Service Pregnancy Centers offering misleading information (along with the other negative talking points against us) while they include us on their website as a community resource for women. In the testimony, they say their mission "is to improve Hawaii's maternal, child and family health through public education, advocacy and partner development." Since they include us as a referral on their site, they must think we meet their mission goals. It is just another example of testimony put together with talking points from the pro-abortion special interest groups without investigating actual facts of what is happening.

CLAIM: ACOG testimony dated 2/2/1 noted "Visits to limited service pregnancy centers often result in delays."

FACT: ACOG's statement has no basis and, in fact, the opposite is true. We care about women's health and we see women who think they might be pregnant but can't or aren't ready to go to a full service provider. The earlier a woman seeks medical attention in pregnancy, the better. At our Center we confirm pregnancy early so that women can take timely steps in their medical care. If they decide to carry, we get them started on prenatal vitamins and refer them to a prenatal care provider. Our services actual streamline care rather than cause delays.

TESTIMONY MISHANDLING BY THE HOUSE HEALTH COMMITTEE AND SENATE

I feel the Hawaii State Senate and House have already violated my First Amendment right "to petition the Government for a redress of grievances" during the process of hearing SB501. Before the Senate WAM Committee hearing, it was decided without notifying me that my testimony would be censored





and not be distributed to the Senators **before** the vote or be uploaded online publicly. There was no oral testimony allowed at the WAM hearing so that written testimony was my only voice before the vote. This was followed by the House Health Committee where I was given a public warning about my testimony and told yet again it would be withheld from public view. Is this biased censorship normal operating procedure for State of Hawaii's legislative process? I have found it disturbing that a director of an organization directly affected by this bully bill would have their voice snuffed out against the preset rules of the process.

What has been in my testimonies that has been an issue with the State of Hawaii? I have merely been trying to defend our ministry from false accusations brought by special interest groups and individuals. If there was an issue with one or two lines of it, "out of an abundance of caution" could they not have just blacked out that portion. By the censoring of my entire testimony, by both the Senate and House, the State of Hawaii has created a situation where news organizations and others have pulled quotes from the public testimony that is incorrect about us and my testimony disputing that information is not present to refute the false claims. The inaccurate information has been spreading and hurting the name of our ministry. The general public only sees the bias testimonies the State of Hawaii has decided they can see.

Due to citizens directly affected by this bill having their First Amendment rights violated, SB501 SD1 HD1 should be dropped. If the introducers of the bill wish to bring it up in a future session, it would give us the opportunity to a fair and equitable process.

COMMON GROUND:

A common statement made by the supporters of SB501 is "When women are fully informed, they are better able to make the best decisions for themselves about their personal health." We agree 100% with this statement and that is our goal. Some women we see who have gone to clinics such as Planned Parenthood actually tell us that they were NOT educated on all their options and pushed towards abortion. A Place for Women in Waipio actually educate women on ALL their options.

CLIENT OPINIONS OF OUR SERVICES:

At the end of our appointments, we ask all our clients if they would like to fill out a voluntary opinion exit survey about their experience with us. This exit survey contains no private health information, it is simply a questionnaire that asks the client to rank the service that was received. Questions include items like the comfort of the rooms and if the client felt respected and received the help needed. Every survey we have ever received shows overwhelmingly positive and glowing results.

Here are some of the comments we have received from other women who have actually been through our center:

"A great place of encouragement! Thank you so much."

"Great staff! Made me feel very comfortable! Answered all my questions. Very knowledgeable staff."

"Answered all my questions and more, didn't feel judged at all."

"I had people to understand me and be there for me, helping me."

"showed me respect and concern for my situation."

"I felt very comfortable and open to talk. I appreciate a place like this close by. I am very thankful for people like here to help."

"If I didn't come here I wouldn't have made the right choice. Thank you so much."

The comments above demonstrate that women coming through our center appreciated us being available to them in their time of need. Our Center helps a number of women every year with the







struggles of unplanned pregnancy. Whatever their choice, abortion, adoption or parenting, A Place for Women is there to help and all our services are free. Without us, many women would feel like they have no choice but to choose abortion. And whether one is pro-life or pro-choice, we have to all agree there is no freedom to choose if you have no choice.

FISCAL IMPACTS ON THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The State of Hawaii is trying to create a new law that is not only unconstitutional but will cost taxpayers money to regulate the groups classified as limited service pregnancy centers under SB501 SD1 HD1. The bill has grown in scope to include basically all clinics on island that deal with pregnancy. The Department of Health did not have the resources available for the 5 religious non-profit groups the bill originally targeted. How many more resources will they have to come up with to cover all the pregnancy centers in the state? How much will this regulation cost the State of Hawaii?

An appeal has been filed to the United States Supreme Court against a similar California law. If SB501 is enacted, our national affiliate, NIFLA (National Institute of Family & Life Advocates) is prepared to file a lawsuit. Since the constitutionality of this law is in question, it would be wise for Hawaii to not move ahead until the current case is completed and it is determined if the law is constitutional or not.

If this bill becomes law in Hawaii, it could set a disturbing precedence allowing the government to require compelled speech on the churches of America. To my knowledge, there have been no churches directly affected in the other lawsuits to make their way through the courts. It may only affect Calvary Chapel Pearl Harbor today, but it could affect your church next - whatever your religion.

Though the newest language of this bill includes other pregnancy centers, the original intent of the bill was to regulate private religious non-profit groups that most law makers did not even know existed in the community before this legislation was proposed. They have not been doing any harm and in fact have only been a source of hope for the community. Special interest groups decided to send their talking points to Hawaii and try to squash the hope we provide and replace it with a political agenda that does not promote life but promotes death.

I would like to invite every member of the committee to call us for a tour or a meeting to address any concerns you may have about what a pregnancy resource center does for the local community before making any decision on this bill.

Elected officials should be protecting the rights given to the citizens by the Constitution of the United States. Help to protect the First Amendment rights of my church, my volunteers and myself. I urge you to **OPPOSE** SB501 SD1 HD1. Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony.

I am the current president of The Pearson Foundation of HI, Inc. and we all (24 members) stand in strong opposition to this bill.

We were founded in 1970 by Robert Pearson and his wife, Mary Jane who began encouraging young women to give birth to their unborn children as they believed abortion an intrinsically evil act that kills an unborn child and is detrimental to the mother as well. They adopted some of these babies that they saved and they are now successful, contributing members of American society. The Pearsons along with the help of the Knights of Columbus established the Mary Jane Home to provide housing for pregnant women in need of it. When the Pearsons left Hawaii, The Pearson Foundation of HI, became incorporated in 1986 as a private, non-profit 301c , and continued the Mary Jane Home until it came under the auspices of Catholic Charities where it continues today .

We are an all-volunteer organization and accept no funds from any government agencies. We rely on donations from a few churches, the Knight of Columbus and many personal donors who believe and support our cause. Presently we have two centers, one in Pearl City and one in Kalihi.

We have visibly posted in our centers that we are not a medical facility.

Upon entering our Pregnancy Centers, our clients are given a "Limitation of Services" sheet that discloses "we do not perform nor refer for abortion". See attachment.

We provide a **self-administered** free pregnancy test and non-judgmental confidential counseling and **documented** educational materials to our clients as well as referrals to doctors, adoption agencies, and state agencies like Medquest, WIC, Kalihi Palama for prenatal and child health needs and the Mary Jane Home for housing. If they have no insurance, we refer them to Waikiki Health and Kalihi Palama for STD testing or unrecognizable health problems and blood tests to confirm their pregnancy. We have new baby clothing and blankets, diapers and will provide a stroller or infant seat when needed at no charge to clients.

We are there donating our time and energy in order to give our clients the full and truthful information needed to make an informed decision regarding their pregnancy. Abortion clinics, for some strange reason, do not have to disclose the dangerous side-effects that abortion can cause. That is a requirement for all other medical procedures. In this way, we are doing a service to women regarding their overall health. Women's health is not all about contraception and abortion. Many times, these devices are what lead to physical illness and or depression and Post traumatic stress. Abortion has led many women to become alcoholics and/or drug users. There has been independent research and personal testimonies to this. Since abortion has been legalized, there has been more child abuse, not less as it was supposed to prevent, with the disproven theory that a wanted child would not become an abused child. Due to abortion, human life has less value. It has become a commodity that can be disposed of at will. Example fetal organ sales.

This bill to force our organization to advertise where our clients can obtain an abortion is totally against our personal beliefs. It is not advantageous to women but actually harmful. It does not serve the purpose it is intended to. Also, similar legislation forcing anyone to go against their religious or personal beliefs has been proven unconstitutional in the Supreme Court. See Wooley v. Maynard, 430 US 705 (1977).

The organization and businesses you might better be addressing legislation to is Planned Parenthood and other money making abortion clinics. Former managers and personnel of Planned Parenthood have told of their having monthly quotas to meet for abortions; in order to stay solvent. They are rewarded with a pizza party or other prize if they meet or surpass their quota. So they are actually encouraging women to have an abortion. There is no regard to personal health in this. You want us to recommend a client here??

I hope you will look into this matter further before enacting into law something not only detrimental to women's health but unconstitutional as well. I ask you to please oppose this bill.

Testimony in Opposition to S.B. No. 501, SD1, HD1 Relating to Health

Thank you for this opportunity to testify. As Director of the Aloha Pregnancy Care and Counseling Center, one of the centers that would be adversely affected by this bill, we stand in opposition to this measure. We are proud of our record of serving all Hawaii women, regardless of income, and of providing free and meaningful access to effective reproductive health services for Hawaii's families, which is the stated intent of this measure. We believe this measure should be held in committee for the following reasons:

-- This bill amounts to compelled speech which is a violation of the First Amendment. Our government is prohibited from forcing a faith based organization to give a message which violates its fundamental principles.

-- This bill violates First Amendment guarantees of freedom of religion. Our pregnancy centers are faith based ministries that are prolife and oppose abortion. Such opposition to abortion means that as a matter of religious principle we do not perform or refer for abortion. This bill, if enacted, would mandate that we, as faith based ministries, violate our religious convictions and become abortion referral agencies.

-- This bill is currently similar if not identical to a law passed in 2015 by the California legislature. The California law is presently being challenged and is being appealed to the United States Supreme Court. It is expected that the high court will accept the appeal and, if so, argument on the merits of the law will be made this fall -- probably October. Since our legislature would not want to act too hastily, wisdom and prudence would dictate that our State not move ahead on this legislation until the current litigation is completed and the courts have determined the constitutionality of the law.

For these reasons of freedom of speech and freedom of religion, and because a similar law in California is currently facing a United States Supreme Court challenge, please hold S.B. 501, SD1 HD1 and related measures for further study at this time. Thank you.

Chair Nishimoto, Vice Chair San Buenaventura, and Members of the Committee:

My name is Robert Hirokawa and I am the Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Primary Care Association (HPCA), a 501(c)(3) organization established to advocate for, expand access to, and sustain high quality care through the statewide network of Community Health Centers throughout the State of Hawaii. The HPCA appreciates this opportunity to <u>COMMENT</u> on Senate Bill No. 501, House Draft 1, RELATING TO HEALTH.

The bill, as received by your Committee, would, among other things:

- (1) Define a "limited service pregnancy center" (center) as any facility that advertises or solicits clients or patients to provide prenatal sonography, pregnancy tests, or pregnancy options counseling, collects health information from clients or patients, and provides family planning or pregnancy testing, pregnancy diagnosis, reproductive health counseling, or prenatal care;
- (2) Require every center to disseminate on-site written notice in English and other languages of the availability of public programs that provide free or low-cost access to comprehensive family planning services, all FDA-approved methods of contraception, prenatal care, and abortion for eligible women;
- (3) Require the notice to provide an internet address for medical assistance applications and a statewide phone number for medical assistance applications;
- (4) Provide that the notice be posted as signage of specific size and print size in each center's waiting area, and as well as distributed in print or digital form at the time of check-in for services;
- (5) Establish civil penalties of \$500 for a first offense, and \$1,000 for each subsequent offense of noncompliance, and allow the Attorney General to bring a civil action against the center if the violation is not corrected within thirty days; and
- (6) Create a private cause of action for any person aggrieved by a center to enjoin further violations and recover actual damages, and allow the Court to award treble damages in addition to a civil fine of not more than \$1,000 in its discretion.

Community Health Centers serve on the front line providing desperately needed primary care for Hawaii's underprivileged communities. The services Community Health Centers provide include services that would appear to fall within the definition of "limited service pregnancy center" as this bill is currently drafted.

Prior to the bill being amended by the House Committee on Health, Senate Bill No. 0501, Senate Draft 1, included language exempting any facility that "[is] a contracted provider with the department or with the Med-QUEST division or a Medicaid health plan..." [See, Senate Bill No. 501, Senate Draft 1, page 3, lines 10-12] By removing this language, it would appear that the House Committee on Health intended to include Community Health Centers under the auspices of this measure.

However, it is unclear whether the tort remedies offered under this bill, as currently drafted, could be applied to Community Health Centers. The Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), established in 1946, is the legal mechanism for compensating people who have suffered personal injury due to the negligent or wrongful action of employees of the U.S. government. Under section 224 of the Public Health Services Act, as amended by the Federally Supported Health Centers Assistance Act of 1992 and 1995, employees of eligible health centers may be deemed to be federal employees qualified for protection under the FTCA.

By providing medical malpractice protection to health centers that meet annual program requirements, the Health Center FTCA Program saves Health Center Program grantees millions of dollars yearly that they can then invest to increase health care services and fund quality improvement activities. Also, as federal employees, the employees of Community Health Centers are immune from lawsuits. The federal government acts as our primary insurer.

By placing these requirements into Chapter 341, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), it would appear that the Legislature intends to include these new disclosure requirements as part of the scope of health care practice, which would seemingly also involve malpractice insurance and the immunities mentioned above. Yet, arguably, the impetus for this measure would seem to involve truth in advertising and other practices that might not specifically, or directly relate to the manner in which certain medical procedures are conducted.

It should be noted that there are already statutes on the books that may be applicable to address this apparent problem. These include:

- Section 481A-3, HRS, which prohibits deceptive trade practices, including when in the course of a person's business, vocation, or occupation, the person "advertises goods or services with intent not to sell them as advertised", or "engages in any other conduct which similarly creates a likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding."; and
- Section 708-871, HRS, which makes it a misdemeanor for any person, "in connection with the promotion of the sale of property or services," to "knowingly or recklessly [make or cause to be made] a false or misleading statement in any advertisement addressed to the public or to a substantial number of persons." The statute further clarifies that a "misleading statement"

includes "an offer to sell property or services if the offeror does not intend to sell or provide the advertised property or services..."

Because of this, should your Committee be inclined to approve this measure, at a minimum, inquires should be made to determine how, if at all, the provisions of this bill would be applied in relation to these other statutes. This would be needed to mitigate jurisdictional conflicts between the Department of Health, the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and the various County Police Departments.

This bill will require all pregnancy centers to provide information on health services, including abortion.

Several of Hawaii's pregnancy centers are faith based ministries that are pro-LIFE and oppose abortion. These pro-life pregnancy centers offer many LIFE saving services to the community. Pregnancy tests, ultrasound services, women & men's counseling, adoption referrals, baby & mother clothing/supply boutiques and birth education workshops are provided. Testimony of Margaret Johnson, retired attorney and judge, 45-817 Anoi Place, Kaneohe, HI opposing SB 501

I am a retired attorney and judge. I strongly oppose this bill. It is highly unlikely to pass constitutional muster as it violates the protections afforded by both the federal and Hawaii state constitutions to freedom of religion and freedom of speech. And it provides no exception for those who are providing crisis pregnancy care precisely because they firmly hold to the scriptural mandate not to kill and recognize that abortion kills a child. To require such an organization and its owners, managers or staff to advertise killing abortion services to its patrons under the guise of making the public aware of "health" services [abortion is not a health service at all but a death service] is a blatant effort to bypass these constitutional protections which date back to the founding of our country and the establishment of this State's constitution. To even contemplate such legislation is a grave and evil matter. To resist the push of the culture of death in this direction requires courage, a trait I hope some of our legislators and specifically the members of this committee might possess.

A United States Supreme Court case which bears striking similarities to this legislation, <u>Wooley</u> <u>v. Maynard</u>, 430 US 705 (1977), invalidated as unconstitutional a New Hampshire law compelling display of a license plate slogan "Live Free or Die" that offended the Maynards' religious beliefs. The law requiring the display of the license and its slogan also imposed criminal fines on those who covered the slogan. Mr. Maynard was prosecuted three different times for covering the slogan. He was initially fined for covering the slogan, and when he refused to pay the fine, he was jailed. Mr. Maynard sought and obtained an injunction in the federal district court which following a trial which held the ordinance invalid and enjoined the

enforcement of the ordinance against the Maynards and other Jehovah's Witnesses. The Court of Appeals reversed. The Supreme Court reversed the appellate court noting Mr. Maynard's summary of his objection to the license plate:

"I refuse to be coerced by the State into advertising a slogan which I find morally, ethically, religiously and politically abhorrent."

The Court then identified the question to be decided as whether the State may constitutionally require an individual to participate in the dissemination of an ideological message by displaying it on his private property in a manner and for the express purpose that it be observed and read by the public. Noting that the right of freedom of thought protected by the First Amendment against state action includes both the right to speak freely and the right to refrain from speaking at all, the Court held that the State may not constitutionally impose such a requirement. In *Burwell V. Hobby Lobby Stores, Inc.*, 573 U.S. (2014), the Court refused to limit those rights to individuals when the way those individuals was doing business was the only reason the government was claiming that their rights to freedom of speech and religion were not being compromised.

What this bill seeks to compel these private organizations and those who manage and staff them to do is very similar and equally unconstitutional.

This law imposes significant fines on organizations that refuse, because of their religious beliefs, to in any way endorse the killing of babies and victimization of their mothers or to refer women who are often in what appears to be desperate circumstances to abortion services as if suggesting that these poor women should kill their babies. These organizations were set up precisely to offer other wholesome life-affirming alternatives because abortion is morally, ethically, religiously and politically abhorrent to the people who largely volunteer to provide a morally appropriate alternative to abortion. The fact that the law allows abortion does not make it a good or moral option. It is the killing of a very innocent child who has no ability to protect or defend itself and is most at risk in the womb of its own mother due to those laws.

This legislation absent an exemption for organizations that cannot endorse abortion as a matter of faith and conscience is inviting expensive litigation and will waste the limited financial resources of this state. To presume people are unaware of the availability of abortion particularly following the very contentious election this country has endured borders on lunacy. There is no compelling state reason for imposing this burden on faith based private organizations or on the individuals who work there, that would justify violating their constitutional rights to freedom of religion and speech. This is government compelled speech contrary to conscience and faith and contrary to the constitutions of both the United States and the State of Hawai'i.

TPC has been serving men, women and families for 25 years and we are the only pregnancy center on the Big Island. We serve an average of 400 families each year. Our services are 100% free and they include pregnancy tests, ultrasound exams and a vast video and book library of educational resources, with reward gift certificates. This is one way through which we can give small financial help for the low-income families in our communities. Very close to 100% of the families we serve are in that category.

TPC is a small faith-based ministry and it is precisely our faith what motivates us to do what we do: help others. It motivated me to leave a successful career in Brazil, as a doctor, to come here and serve the less privileged among us. We are 100% privately funded, 95% volunteer based and have been doing our job with the sole motivation of helping our communities.

SB501, forcing pregnancy centers to refer for abortion, violates our First Amendment rights of freedom of speech and freedom of religion. The additional regulations this bill creates will have to be monitored and enforced. This will create a cost to the state.

Aloha Chair Nishimoto, Vice Chair Joy San Buenaventura and members of the committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today in STRONG OPPOSITION to SB501. I believe most people understand that this bill is aimed at providing women with information and resources in order to help them make the best decisions for themselves and their families. As a women who experienced an unplanned pregnancy I can testify that the situation is one of anxiety and confusion. I relied on information provided by family, doctors, and abortion providers. I was told that I was unable to provide for a child. I was told what was growing inside me was not a baby yet. I was told abortion was easy and it would solve my problem. I believed all the information I was given at this very stressful time in my life and chose to abort.

Unfortunately, I came to realize that the information I received was incomplete and incorrect. In the years that followed my abortion I felt overwhelmed by depression and regret for what I had done. I realized that I would have had resources and support had I decided to parent my child, and I discovered many families desperately wanting to have children that would have been able to provide my child with a healthy home.

I began to learn about fetal development and realized that while I was told it was not a baby at the time of my abortion, it actually was a child with ten fingers, ten toes, a beating heart, and fingerprints. She could hear muffled sounds and was dreaming. She was a baby. A life. Aborting her was not a solution to my problem. It ended her life and damaged mine in ways no one told me about at the time of the abortion.

The abortion procedure itself was not easy and even though my doctor and abortion provider told me it would be simple, I am still haunted by the details to this day. I was told I would go on with my life and there would be no lasting effects, however I experienced years of pain, regret, nightmares, flashbacks, and depression to the point of being suicidal. I tried to self medicate with drugs and alcohol and made many reckless decisions. Thankfully I finally found hope through counseling and post-abortion support and this is why I am testifying today. To speak up for women who are able to make good decisions WHEN they are actually given all the information available.

I have the privilege of volunteering at A Place For Women in Waipio, one of the pregnancy resource centers that will be affected by this bill. I feel honored to be a part of a caring, selfless group of people who offer free, honest, life affirming information to women who, like I once was, are experiencing a stressful, confusing time in their lives. I was never given the chance to make a decision with accurate

information about abortion procedures and risks. I was never provided with accurate information about fetal development. I was never provided with information about life affirming resources available.

Without this information I made a decision that I regret but at A Place for Women, we are valuing a women's ability to make a decision, with accurate information, that she will not regret. The center does not coerce women in to making any specific decision. Many women take the information they have been given at the center and end up choosing to abort. We will however not refer a women to an abortion facility. That is not a service we feel is in line with what we believe.

Thankfully the Constitution of the United States allows us to make decisions about what we believe and allows protections to our rights to make that decision. Abortion services are not difficult to find and we clearly tell them, through verbal and written form, that we do not provide or refer for such services. They are in no way forced to be at the center and what they do with the information provided is up to them.

At A Place for Women in Waipio, I have had the privilege of helping minister to women who have been hurt by past abortions. The government should not force me to refer out women in any way for the very thing I facilitate recovery classes for. I have seen how the hurt and regret I experienced is not an isolated occurrence. I have heard many women share how they felt pressured to have an abortion, felt that it was their only option, and felt they did not have accurate information when making the decision. Woman after woman has poured out tears before me as they recall the damage abortion caused in their lives. I'm thankful they are able to find healing at A Place for Women, but my heart aches knowing women are being led to believe abortion is their only option every day and post-abortion healing will be a busy ministry until we start to trust women enough to actually make informed decisions.

If transparency is the goal, if we are trying to provide women with accurate complete information and trust them with decisions about their health and the health of their children, then we need a service that provides a balance to the services found through abortion providers. When a women sees an abortion provider, she receives a procedure. If transparency is the goal, should we not also regulate the information provided in those facilities as well? Should Planned Parenthood be asked to offer their clients referrals to a pregnancy resource center? Should facilities providing abortion have to notify their clients about abortion recovery classes in the area? Or, that the Medical Abortion can be reversed and post the hotline number to get help? If transparency is the issue and you want a fair bill, then the answer to these questions is yes!

As someone personally affected by this issue in so many ways, I ask that you VOTE NO on this bill and decide to trust women and honor the Constitution.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify IN OPPOSITION to SB 501 SD1 HD1.

I am a volunteer at A Place for Women in Waipio (APFWIW). We are a faith-based, life affirming center. We provide women faced with an unplanned pregnancy with information about ALL of their options: parenting, adoption, and abortion. Women need to know that there is HOPE no matter what situation they find themselves in. They need to know that abortion is not the only option. The decision is ultimately made by the client; but at least she can make her own WELL-INFORMED decision based on having all the facts.

In my own experience with an unplanned pregnancy, I was not given any counseling as to what my options were, nor was I told that I was carrying a life with a heart that was already beating. Rather, I was told only of what the risks of having general anesthesia were for the abortion and that was it. I regret my abortion. I am upset that I was never provided the information about what my options were and what the consequences an abortion would have on my life. Unlike what I experienced, APFWIW strives to educate our clients about the life of their baby. We also educate our clients about the risks involved with abortion and the possible repercussions that may occur later because of an abortion.

APFWIW is completely donor-funded. We receive no government funding. All of the services provided at APFWIW IS DONE WITHOUT ANY FINANCIAL MOTIVATION. All of our services are FREE of charge. Everyone at APFWIW, including our licensed medical staff, VOLUNTEER our time. We are all invested in this MINISTRY because of our concern for the physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual well-being of each client.

This bill, if passed would FORCE me, as a post-abortive woman, to promote and refer a woman to do the very thing I regret having done. In this day and age, do you really think that a woman wanting an abortion could not find an abortion provider herself?

As a Christian, I believe that life begins at conception and ending that life with an abortion is wrong. Requiring me to hand out any information promoting abortion or compelling me to direct a woman to where she can obtain an abortion, WHILE DOING THIS MINISTRY INSIDE MY CHURCH BUILDING, would not only go against my conscience, but be in direct violation of my First Amendment rights to freedom of speech and freedom of religion.

I strongly OPPOSE this bill for the following reasons, based upon my experience in working with girls and women facing crisis pregnancies:

- 1. By requiring Crisis Pregnancy Centers to publicly disclose abortion as an alternative is counterintuitive to the purpose of these centers, that is, to provide an option that does not include taking a life. That is precisely why these girls go to these centers. They already know abortion is an option and that is not the road they want to take. If the CPC is faith-based it forces staff to counsel against their beliefs, thus stepping on their constitutional right.
- By not offering ADOPTION as an alternative this bill is not giving the full range of services that should be offered. In addition to the CPCs there are organizations that assist in the adoption process from pregnancy through birth. The bill says there are public funds for health services, why is adoption not included? Abortion clinics are not required to post alternatives.
- 3. By removing CPCs as safe havens for young vulnerable teens seeking help on figuring out what to do at one of the most critical junctures in their lives, this bill literally takes away the help that it purports to give. In the past, bills were introduced to create safe havens for other segments of society, yet this this bill seeks to remove CPCs as safe havens.
- 4. By offering education on all health services it fails to include an emphasis on how an abortion is performed and its effects on both the baby and the mother. The bill emphasizes abortion as an alternative via signage and written or digital notice to the mothers-to-be, therefore, they should be informed of ALL aspects of this procedure. Furthermore, this emphasis can be interpreted as coercion to choose an option these girls don't need or want.
- 5. By stating that 16,000 females experienced unintended pregnancies gives a false conclusion that these pregnancies were unwanted. They may have just been unexpected. The bill does not state where these statistics come from. The bill also says that these "unintended" pregnancies "carry enormous social and economic costs to families and the state of Hawaii". The inference is that by getting rid of these babies our society is better off. Have you considered the cost over decades for women who have had abortions? Depression, suicide, divorce, and cancer are some of the consequences and these all take a toll on society, especially for girls who use abortion as a form of birth control.

Please do not pass this bill. It will not help women nor strengthen Hawaii's families; it is punitive to Crisis Pregnancy Centers. Forcing them to comply with this legislation takes away the freedom to offer alternative care for the most vulnerable. They offer a special type of care not rendered at health clinics. Furthermore, the bill favors abortion providers; it is a guise to undermine faith-based centers, and to force them to promote an agenda that favors killing innocent lives.

TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION TO SB501, SD 1, HD1

I respectfully request that the members of the House Committee on Judiciary vote NO on SB 501, SD 1, HD 1 for the following reasons:

- 1) SB501 is discriminatory in its application, making requirements of non-profit, self-funding pregnancy centers that are not similarly imposed on abortion clinics. SB501 requires pregnancy centers to advertise the services of abortion providers, yet Planned Parenthood is not required to inform their clients of the services available at pregnancy centers. They hypocrisy of this bill is evident in the written testimony submitted on 2-2-17 to the Senate by Laurie Field, Hawaii Legislative Director & Public Affairs Manager for Planned Parenthood Votes Northwest & Hawaii, supporting SB501 "to put in place common sense protections to ensure that any woman seeking pregnancy testing services receives the information she needs to make decisions about her reproductive health." Planned Parenthood applies no such "common sense" by withholding information about pregnancy centers.
- 2) Clearly, this bill is not about the quality of care or lack of information being provided women facing unplanned pregnancies. It is an aggressive effort on the part of abortion-providers to increase their turf and protect their profits. Each pregnancy successfully carried to term is one less abortion they can perform for monetary gain. If this bill cannot be enforced, it is a waste of taxpayer money and merely serves as an instrument of harassment by abortion providers.
4) SB 501, SD 1, HD 1 is an assault on freedom of speech and freedom of religion. Pregnancy centers receive no government funding and therefore should not be subject to the government overreach that this bill represents. This bill requires privately-funded, non-profit organizations to publicize services that are in direct opposition and contrary to their mission.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify IN OPPOSITION to SENATE BILL 501 SD1 HD1.

My name is Sophie Fung, and I testify in strong opposition to this Bill on the grounds that if passed, it would violate the First Amendment rights and the rights of conscience of those who oppose the words and ideas required by this law.

SB501 SD1 HD1 states that "The purpose of this Act is to ensure that women in Hawaii are able to make personal reproductive health decisions with full and accurate information regarding their rights to access the full range of health care services that are available."

This Bill in actuality forces pro-life and faith-based pregnancy counseling clinics to violate their liberty and freedom of speech by compelling them to openly post a notice to directing women to abortion services that are in direct opposition to their faith. Don't be misled into thinking that by amending SB501 SD1 HD1 to include all pregnancy counseling clinics that it would make it equal for all. That's just a ploy to sugar coat the bill to make it palatable. Pregnancy centers and those that work there believe fundamentally that ALL ABORTION KILLS a living human being once conception has occurred.

Aloha,

My name is Cassidy Holbrook and I am a student at the University of Hawai'i. This will be my first time testifying in person. I am here on behalf of Young Progressives Demanding Action Hawaii as one of their 568 registered members. I submit to the board the following in support of SB501:

As a person living in Kapolei and as a Kapolei High School graduate, I clearly see the dangers of Crisis Pregnancy Centers. Our school, and many others on island, have horrible sex education. I am a college sophomore and 20 years old, and just last week in one of my Women's Studies classes I had my first experience with someone teaching my class about how to use condoms. Once again, I am 20 years old and never received formal education on condom use at Kapolei High School or Island Pacific Academy, where I attended for a year. I also never received any good sex education in middle school. A Place for Women, a Crisis Pregnancy Center in Waipio, is directed towards pregnant individuals on the west side of O'ahu. Crisis Pregnancy Centers do give honest health care. They have been known to lie to people about how far a long they are in the pregnancy so the patients do not get an abortion. These centers are also known to show people videos dismembered fetuses. They have been showing dishonest commercials (not saying they are religiously affliated) in Consolidated Movie Theaters, directly affecting young people. If we don't have proper sex education, we need to at least have honest health care.

I must acknowledge that A Place for Women does in fact do good things. They offer support groups for people who have gone through abortions and also offer free pregnancy tests. However, there must be some kind of rule stating that Crisis Pregnancy Centers need to tell their patients the truth about the services that are being provided. This bill has nothing to do with shutting down Crisis Pregnancy Centers. SB501 only requires that limited service pregnancy centers tell the TRUTH about their services. I ask the board, is there anything wrong with being honest?

This bill is in interest of the people of Hawai'i. We all deserve to receive medical care that is accurate. Crisis Pregnancy Centers have been known to lie to patients about how far along they are in their pregnancy. They have also been known to spread lies about how danger abortion is. In one of the Women's Studies classes I am taking right now at the University of Hawai'i, we have read a couple of articles about Crisis Pregnancy Centers. According to the article *The Anti-Abortion Clinic Across the Street* by Kathryn Joyce (2010), CPCs are often connected to violent anti-abortion extremists.

• A big name in Crisis Pregnancy Centers is Operation Rescue. Their former senior policy director, Cheryl Sullenger, conspired to blow up an abortion clinic in California. She has also been connected to the murder of abortion provider Dr. George Tiller (her phone number was found in the phone of his murderer).

- Operation Rescue also ran a long campaign against Tiller, in which Scott Roeder (the murderer) took part in.
- There was also Chet Gallagher, who has been arrested several times for trespassing during abortion-clinic blockades organized by Operation Rescue. The founder of the Bowie Crofton Pregnancy Clinic (a CPC) is Michael Bray, a convicted abortion-clinic bomber. He also wrote *A Time to Kill*, which is about justifiable murder of abortion doctors. He and his peers were responsible for many abortion doctors and clinic bombings.
- James Kopp founded a CPC in San Francisco and worked in Good Counsel Homes. He was the convicted murderer of a abortion provider by the name of Barnett Slepian, and is the prime suspect of the murder for four other doctors. He is affiliated with Operation Rescue
- Joan Andrew Bell was the wife of Chris Bell, who ran Good Counsel Homes (note that Kopp worked in one of these establishments). She spent five years in prison for invading and vandalizing a clinic. She has been arrested quite a few times for taking part in clinic blockades

SB501 only has the interest of the people of these islands. Please do not allow for Crisis Pregnancy Centers to continue to be able to lie to anyone coming to them for help.

- We must regulate these centers such that women are aware that they are not receiving actual medical care. It is on this point that we offer the following suggestions:
 - That the penalty for failing to comply with this law be raised sharply. In Hawai'i, a single parent will pay roughly \$172,000 in costs related to child raising in the first 18 years of life. Compared to that, an initial \$500 and later \$1,000 fine for repeat offenses pales in comparison. Though it is not possible to charge them the full cost of a child whose mother has been coerced into giving birth, we strongly recommend that the board impose a stronger monetary deterrent to noncompliance.
 - Consider that the federal penalty for simply illegally downloading a movie can be as high as \$30,000. I think that we are all aware which one of these offenses carries a higher human cost.

In the state of Hawai'i, failure to display a Department of Health food safety placard is up to \$1,000 *per day*.

We need to be creating an atmosphere that allow patients to feel comfortable and safe, and as of now Crisis Pregnancy Centers are not doing that. All patients deserve to know all of their options. Please help Hawai'i head on a path of honesty.

This cost will, in essence, be created to regulate five private religious non-profit organizations that offer all services at no cost to clients and receive no federal or state funding.

Given its obvious disregard for the First Amendment rights of the religious organizations affected, we can only assume they will fight this law to the highest court. Due to the cost of having to defend this unconstitutional bill, we oppose the State of Hawaii using taxpayer's dollars to defend it in the courts solely to regulate a handful of religious organizations doing no harm to society.

The state should not infringe their view on religious organizations and violate their First Amendment rights. Nor should the state waste tax payer dollars to defend unnecessary legislation.

For these reasons, we urge you to OPPOSE SB501.

All Because pregnancy centers are provided for people who is in trauma to go to a safe place without learning about trauma. 1. I most strongly oppose SB 501 SD1 HD1. I have been volunteering with non-medical pregnancy counseling centers since 1989. I am a past President and current Vice-President of Pearson Foundation of Hawaii, Inc and have personally counseled women who found themselves confronted with a possible unplanned pregnancy. Many of those who have visited had already experienced an abortion and were suffering greatly for having made that decision.

2. The women who come to our centers are uncertain and scared. They wanted someone to talk with in a confidential, non-judgmental, and non-pressure environment. We sell nothing and have no sales quota, unlike "full service" centers. We can take as much time as the client desires. All our volunteers are unpaid. We are women who donate our time to help other women find a decision that will be critical to their future physical, emotional, and psychological well-being. Our centers assure their anonymity and privacy. Since we are not a medical facility, we cannot confirm or deny any medical situation. If a pregnancy test is positive we advise the individual to go to a medical doctor for confirmation. The fact that we are not a medical facility is posted at the entrance. Clients know in advance of entering our centers that we cannot provide a medical diagnosis nor confirm any medical situation. In addition, we don't verify any personal information. Therefore, we cannot provide written confirmation of anything or we could be charged with practicing medicine without a license.

3. SB501 SD1 HD1 violates the protected rights of the US Constitution, especially the first amendment. This bill pits the full force of the perceived majority over the rights of a perceived minority -- which is not supposed to happen in this county. Our legislators are supposed to protect the rights of the minority, not infringe on those rights.

4. This bill attacks a particular group -- pro-life advocates that are, for the most part, affiliated with a religious community. I knew of 2 PREGNANCY CENTERS THAT COULD ASSIST MY FAMILY BECAUSE JUST A FEW MONTHS BEFORE OUR SON CALLED REGARDING HIS CRISIS, I WAS IN HAWAI'I VISITING AND WAS CURIOUS OF HOW THIS CENTER FUNCTIONED. I WAS GIVEN A PERSONAL TOUR OF A

PREGNACY CENTER CALLED "A PLACE FOR WOMEN IN WAIPIO". ON ANOTHER NOTE, I HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU ALL GO TO VISIT THIS CENTER. MY QUESTION TO YOU ALL TODAY IS HAVE ANY OF YOU EVER TAKEN THE TIME TO VISIT A PREGNANCY CENTER? PARTICULARLY "A PLACE FOR WOMEN IN WAIPIO? IF NOT, THEN I BELIEVE THAT YOU ALL SHOULD BE DOING THIS FIRST. THE INFORMATION THAT I WAS GIVEN WAS BEYOND MY UNDERSTANDING and yet it was clear to me that it was a safe place for our children or anyone wanting to know more about an alternative to abortion. I experienced that the atmosphere of being in a safe place not only for the unborn child but for the parents. This place was for Men and women and their families and I thought that it would be just for women. It is a place that I experienced that doesn't have any information regarding abortion. Everyone already knows where to go to get that information from planned parenthood, why would anyone who is seeking an alternative from abortion want to be connected to a center who promotes death to their child. Why would a center, any center that believes in the sanctity of life be imposed to promote information about where to go to get an abortion nevertheless experience the trauma of ending your own childs life? The information that "A Place for Women in Waipio gave me was not only informative but they had provided professional help for not only women but for Fathers and families. So, when the drama of the trauma was imposed on my son and his family it therefore affected all of my immediate family, our daughter in laws immediate family's all of our extended family's which is all immediate generations. My family itself in Hawaii we have 5 generations and expecting our 6th generation to come. My grandchildren are the 5th generation and therefore my great grandchildren will be the 6th generation in my life time. Our oldest grandchildren are 21 years old and we are looking for them too whenever they might need it for themselves or to share with others who might need the services from the pregnancy centers that they too will have a safe place to go to for their choice. So it was natural that I immediately thought about this safe place for my family, "A Place for Women in Waipio." There was an Alternative for families and there MUST ALWAYS BE an alternative other than abortion Being Promoted as the First and only choice.

Because of my personal tour of the pregnancy center at "A Place for Women in Waipio" my son and his wife was provided with informative services that they would not find in a Planned Parenthood Clinic.

The Service that was provided for our family was not only professional but it provide our children to experience the peace within them to not only look at their situation from a traumatized view that was first told to them. They doctors said that he would only live to be 2 lbs. and that he will probably not survive in the womb. Our grandson lived through birth. He was 7lbs 11 oz, almost 8 lbs. Big difference from what the drs said. We got to hold him and love on him and see him as a part of our family. He was able to breathe life through out all of this craziness of medical professionals and non medical professionals trying impose abortion or planning his death certificate for him. His destiny was not that he would be another human sacrifice for his family but that his parents would make the ultimate sacrifice to preserve the Life he deserved whether in or out of his mother's womb.

Our grandsons life did not go in vain, the choice of his parents to choose LIFE for him and them was something they were willing to sacrifice to save him from being harmed was not only for him but also for their 4 year old daughter. They made a significant impact for choosing Life. Our children had to not only choose lie for their unborn son but for themselves as well. They are the bravest parents that I know. At that time, Our son was only 24 years old and his wife was 21 yrs old. They birthed to life a beautiful 7lbs 11 oz beautiful baby boy who was able to live life in the womb as well as out of the womb. He was born with abnormalities and his parents knew that they would probably not have him for a long time after birth but they chose to sacrifice everything they had to experience the with their son. They were determined that their son was going to have a name and that he was a somebody and not a nobody. He was somebody's descendant! He was his parents descendant and he was our descendant.

GIOVANNI Tevaihau Kawaikapu'imaikalani Tehotu LIVED BEYOND THE WOMB and STILL LIVING. Sometimes Polynesians name their children based on geneology, circumstances and many other reasons. In this case it was based on the bloodline and the circumstances. Tevaihau means Sa peaceful place. The place at that time was in his mothers womb. Kawaikapu means the sacred waters or a sacred place again in this case it was meant for the womb. I mai ka lani means in the future or in the heavenlies meaning again a peaceful place. No drama and no trauma is found in his name.

All Because pregnancy centers are provided for people who is in trauma to go to a safe place without learning about trauma. A person in trauma who is trying to avoid trauma from abortion will not expect to go looking for a place that provideds information about trauma. No person that believes in Pro-Life will give information about Pro-choice. The pro choice will not give truth about abortion and how it is performed. In our family's case "A PLACE FOR WOMEN" in Waipio. In a time of crisis provided immediate care by allowing our family to share their chaos and they listened and they provided. Our unborn grandson was the center of chaos and our children didnt know of any other professional services who provided an alternative other than abortion.

The center at a PLACE FOR WOMEN IN WAIPIO provided:

- 1. Crisis Support for our family so that they were able to make the best decision for their oldest child who was 4 yrs old at that time and their unborn child.
- 2. Compassionate Resources that gave them hope for their unborn son and his future.
- 3. Professional services that gave them peace, security, trust and confidence because they were finally given the opportunity to provide a safe environment for their family at home and they continued to be able to do their doctor visits despite the opinion of their doctors first choice to abort. They chose to protect their unborn son from prematurely dying. Their unborn son then was finally safe and protected from being destroyed.
- 4. Compassionate care for our family before birth and after birth. They became our family through the process.
- 5. Educational resources for men and women, for our whole family and for future support for one another.
- 6. A safe and healthy environment for their family appts. with the staff.
- 7. Healing through out their crisis and after their crisis. (They were able to feel comfortable to have another child. Since 2011, they have another son named Giovanni and a 7 month old daughter. Because of the counseling they were able to have the peace of having more children.)
- 8. Free Continued education for future clients.
- 9. A safe place for ppl to be comfortable to refer others to benefit the lifetime services
- 10. A Lifetime Relationship with our families. We will never forget what was done for us.
- 11. Eternal healing for our grandson, his parents and their family, before birth and after birth.
- 12. Eternal memories that no one will be able to take from us.

- 13. Our children were able to share their experiences with others who have experienced the same situation as them. And they were able to comfort the parents with their story.
- 14. Hope and strength for everyone and to be able to share many testimonies 6 years later (and still counting)

Our children shared with us that later many ppl who have heard their story confided in them about their pain and trauma and guit that they still ive with because they were never told about another alternative, inface many ppl didn't know about another alternative. Obviously Planned Parenthood Doesn't provide that information. Therefore why should the pregnancy centers have to provide their information against their will.

Our grandson lived 9 months and beyond the womb!!!!

Planned parenthood information is not the PROPER information for a pregnancy center that promotes LIFE. There is NO PLAN IN EXPERIENCING LIFE IN a Planned Parenthood clininc. They should mind their own business and the government monies that they use in promoting abortion, should stay out of the PRO LIFE centers. The pregnancy centers in Hawai'I is not being financially supported nor are they using any monies that are coming from the government or state. Dear Chair Nishimoto, Vice Chair San Buenaventura, and fellow Committee Members:

I am physician working at the University of Hawaii, John A. Burns School of Medicine. I provide comprehensive obstetrics and gynecology services. I am writing in strong support of any bill intended to regulate limited service pregnancy centers (LSPC), however, I have concerns about the revised version of SB 501 and have included suggested changes for this bill.

Limited service pregnancy centers harm women in two fundamental ways. First, LSPCs offer medical services, like pregnancy diagnosis and ultrasonography, without protecting patient privacy under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996. Second, limited service pregnancy centers routinely deceive women about their diagnosis in an attempt to prevent them from exercising their right to terminate a pregnancy. Although some LSPCs may offer ultrasonography that is read by a qualified physician or performed by a qualified clinician, not all do. Furthermore, the fact that these clinicians present themselves as medical providers and collect medical information without being HIPAA complaint should be grounds for criminal prosecution and financial penalties.

I am concerned about the language changes to SB 501 HD1, specifically the revised definition of a "limited service pregnancy center". With this new definition, any Federally Qualified Health Center or physician's office would be legally considered a "limited service pregnancy center". Not only is this false and confusing to the general public, it also defeats the intent of this bill. Using a legal definition that groups these LSPCs with actual medical offices only legitimizes these illegitimate "health" centers.

Therefore, I support SB 501 and urge the Legislature to consider additional language to clearly inform and protect the public:

- Define "limited service pregnancy center" as any center or clinic whose primary purpose is providing pregnancy related services and either does not comply with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 or does not have a licensed medical provider on staff or under contract who provides or directly supervises the provision of pregnancy related services
- Define "pregnancy related services" as: obstetric ultrasound, obstetric sonogram, pregnancy testing, pregnancy diagnosis, pregnancy options counseling, or prenatal care

Dear Honorable Representatives,



Please vote 'No' on SB501 SD1. This will be a superfluous law which our government does not need to spend time, money, and other resources upon. We have many greater needs (within the foster care system, for example).

I work for a local adoption agency and field calls from women who are seeking options for their pregnancies. In the five years I have occupied my job, I have never once had to inform a woman (or her partner, if he is the one who calls in her stead) that abortion exists as an option. Even women who have been referred to me by the local pregnancy centers have already known that abortion is an option (or was, if the pregnancy is beyond that option). Speaking of referrals, I find it interesting that in the past year I have received four referrals to my office from the pregnancy centers in our state, but our agency has no record of anyone ever having been referred to us by Planned Parenthood. This causes me to wonder who really needs to be promoting all the options available to pregnant women. Of note, the pregnancy centers have been very professional in working with our agency; Release of Information forms are completed before sharing client information, etc.

Regarding costs and added administration, a bill such as SB501 SD1 is over the top. Hopefully you have been provided actual numbers by those in a position to do so, thus I speak anecdotally about the following: considering the limited numbers of pro-life centers such as the pregnancy centers located on our islands with their relatively low numbers in terms of foot traffic to those centers (vs. the high volume of traffic through a center such as Planned Parenthood); and the fact that the 40-Days for Life campaign can only find four (4) out of nearly 300 OB-GYNs in Hawaii that call themselves fully pro-life; and the fact that any Google search I could perform re: unwanted pregnancy resulted in 2-3 out of the top for results being referrals to abortion information, the chances of a woman not knowing that abortion is an option are extremely, ultimately very low if not nearly non-existent. I cannot support our government spending money enforcing SB501 SD1 when it could be spent much better supporting families in many other arenas.

The precedent SB501 SD1 sets up is also problematic. To the best of my knowledge, we don't require physicians, or beauticians, or cosmeticians, or physical therapists, or mental health counselors, acupuncturists, or diet centers, etc., to post information about the availability of or enrollment in all the alternatives to their services; why are we isolating this service? Even in an OB-GYN office, I don't see posting about going to a mid-wife or a doula instead of my OB-GYN.

You have no doubt heard much argument about the infringement of free speech, etc., and I support those arguments, too, but I hope my testimony provides additional items for your consideration. The local pregnancy centers provide welcomed and productive alternative services within our community and I in no way see them as a danger to anyone. All clients that have been referred to me from the pregnancy centers (from Oahu, Maui, Big Island) have also already been referred to an OB-GYN or a clinic and/or been assisted in signing up for medical insurance. Once again, I see SB501 SD1 a huge overkill.

I have never received a client from a pregnancy center who was anything other than grateful for all the time, effort, and attention provided (all at no cost to the client) no matter what decision the client ultimately made. Not all of these referrals chose to parent or to place their child for adoption; some have chosen to abort their child, but they have done so after having examined *all* the educational material presented. I suggest to you that the pregnancy centers and others who are willing to offer a woman a full, honest view of a procedure like abortion along with all the other valuable diagnostic and counseling services (which includes referrals) are the entities **already** providing full service to women in our society.

This is evidence enough for me that SB501 SD1 is overkill and unnecessary; this bill also violates some free speech rights etc., therefore let's get rid of this and move on to other more effective and helpful law making. (Note: I am speaking as a private citizen; the views expressed here may or may not be the official views of my agency).

Testimony in Opposition to S.B. No. 501, SD1, HD1 Relating to Health

Thank you for this opportunity to testify. As one of your constituents, I stand in opposition to this measure.

I request that the Committee Vote to Hold or Defer SB501 SD1 HD1 because:

- <u>The bill is unnecessary</u>.
 Limited service pregnancy centers in Hawaii already voluntarily provide the beneficial services that this bill wants to force them to offer under threat of heavy fines and triple damages in court costs, i.e., provide ultrasounds from qualified individuals, provide medical assistance referrals, and protect client/patient private information.
- 2) It is likely unconstitutional. Forcing faith-based pregnancy centers to refer for abortion is a violation of their civil liberties. A similar measure in California will be heard by the US Supreme Court this fall as to whether it poses an unconstitutional restriction on the Freedom of Speech and Freedom of Religion of a protected group; it would be premature for Hawaii to pass this bill prior to learning the outcome of that hearing. In addition, similar bills have already been struck down in Texas, Maryland, and New York.
- 3) It is being promoted based on scare tactics and practices that are not valid in Hawaii. Many of those who testified in support of this measure make vague accusations about the activities of limited service pregnancy centers, or cite studies of such centers that do not apply to Hawaii.
- 4) <u>It is discriminatory and financially burdensome</u>. The bill creates a new chapter in Hawaii law that targets faith-based pregnancy centers for regulation in violation of their right to operate by their faith-based principles and therefore not refer women for abortions or abortion-related services. It also places an undue burden on these centers by forcing them to prepare financially to defend their faith in court, when these centers do not receive federal or state funding and already offer all services to their clients for free. This bill also makes no corresponding regulatory demand on abortion providers and primary care clinics, many of which receive government funding; such a demand would be appropriate if the bill were truly aimed at providing Hawaii's women with "the full range of family planning and prenatal services" that the bill says it does. Instead this bill creates an improper and discriminatory double-standard by government showing preferential treatment to abortion providers and penalizing faith-based pregnancy centers.

5) <u>There is more testimony in OPPOSITION to this bill than in support</u>. Many of Hawaii's citizens have experienced the helpfulness of Hawaii's limited service pregnancy centers and are not in support of this measure that would harm those centers. In one piece of testimony alone before the Senate, there were 513 attached signatures in opposition to this measure.

- 6) It doesn't make sense. As one individual put it, "Would you require a Vegan Restaurant or Health Food Store to post a list of all the Fast Food restaurants or Steak Houses in a prominent place on their premises? It just isn't logical and it undermines the whole reason for these establishments which is to provide healthy alternatives."
- 7) It will add to Hawaii's tax burden. The Hawaii Department of Health has testified that it "does not have the resources nor the capacity to regulate and/or enforce the provisions in this measure" which then will require Hawaii's taxpayers to pay additional taxes to fund those resources. Further, this measure will force many of Hawaii's taxpayers to violate their faith by paying additional taxes to enforce this regulation.
- 8) It encourages lawsuits. With heavy fines, no mandated notice of violation, vague or unclear ability to remedy the alleged problem, a low standard of proof, and a wide variety of potential plaintiffs, this bill declares "open season" on limited service pregnancy centers, encouraging anyone (a natural person or any legal person which includes businesses) with an alleged or manufactured grievance to take limited service pregnancy centers to court to defend themselves against the alleged grievance. Given the limited resources of most limited service pregnancy centers, this measure amounts to an attack on the continued operation and existence of all faith-based pregnancy centers in Hawaii.
- 9) <u>It is confusing</u>. By creating a right for people to sue for an alleged offense under this proposed law, the bill creates confusion as to whether it is the State that should be enforcing the law through the attorney general, or the individual who must seek to enforce the law through a civil lawsuit. It is also unclear how the limited service pregnancy center is to be made aware of an alleged violation since the bill does not mandate that the center be informed of an alleged problem. This lack of clarity violates the legal principle of putting a party on notice of a violation prior to enforcing government penalties upon that party for lack of compliance.
- 10) <u>It creates more problems than it solves</u>. With the inclusion of coercive tactics, compelled speech, encouraging lawsuits, and all the issues listed above, this bill creates more problems than it solves and does not represent us well as the Aloha State.

Since this bill is confusing, burdensome, and unnecessary, the recommendation is that the Committee VOTE to HOLD this proposed measure. Thank you.

My name is Morgen Trube, I am currently a college senior studying Public Health at HPU as well and the President of Planned Parenthood's Generation Action; and I stand in strong support of this bill.

As an out of state college student, when I found out I was pregnant my options were very limited. I tried to get into to multiple OB/GYN's as well as Planned Parenthood and they couldn't see me due to a lack of availability or due to my out of state medical insurance. So I had no other options then to go to a crisis pregnancy center/limited service pregnancy center.

My personal experience is with the center, "A Place for Women Waipio." When I went to this clinic I was under the impression that I was there to get a free pregnancy test, ultrasound and be able to leave. But instead I had to sit through coercive videos and stories before they would even consider giving me a test. Once they gave me a test I then had to sit through another video before they gave me my results.

When I got my results and they told me I was pregnant, they then finally offered me the ultrasound. In the ultrasound room the lady who administered the ultra sound was dressed in scrubs but never mentioned to me that she was a licensed medical professional.

While I was in the ultrasound room, I was signed up for a pregnancy tacking website, without my consent, to track the stages of my pregnancy straight to my email. They used my personal information with out letting me know that's what they were going to be doing. Because I was under the impression that this was a medical facility, I thought my personal information had to remain confidential.

Everyone, including women, deserves not only access to healthcare, but to unbiased and factual care that is free of manipulative facts and tactics. All I wanted was somebody who could help me, but instead it felt like the only thing they cared about was the baby. It was never about my health, what I wanted for myself in life, or how I was feeling.

Please support this bill to regulate crisis pregnancy centers. Women have the right to know that these places aren't actual medical facilities providing fact base care, their privacy is not protected and their only interest is to persuade you out of making choices for yourself. If I would have seen a sign stating where I could find the resources that I needed and wanted I would have turned around and left.

Anyone seeking health care should receive comprehensive, accurate, unbiased information in a confidential setting. Reproductive health care is no different. When women are fully informed, they are better able to make the best decision for themselves about their personal health. Senate Bill 501 will put in place common sense protections to ensure that any woman seeking pregnancy testing services receives the information she needs to make decisions about her reproductive health. These bills will require LSPCs to protect the privacy of health care information collected, provide women with information on their full range of reproductive health options, and disclose that they do not provide all options for clients. I would even encourage the requirements go further to require these facilities to inform clients and patients that they are not medical facilities. Many of these centers look like clinics, their staff wear medical scrubs, and they provide ultrasounds and other medical services. This leads women to believe they are receiving the same services they would in a medical facility.

Speaking as a Catholic, I do not believe that any of the requirements of this bill, which seek to ensure safe and accurate care is accessible to all people, violate my first amendment rights. When the Church chooses to engage in the provision of healthcare to the community as a whole, they should be subject to the same care standards, which are in place to ensure the safety and health of all members of our society regardless of faith. I deeply appreciate the care and compassion that many young women have found in crisis pregnancy centers, but that is simply not the experience of all patients. Young women, especially in extremely vulnerable moments, should be receiving complete information, which would be required through informed consent at any other healthcare facility. There is no reason at all that HIPAA requirements of confidentiality should not also apply.

Please consider voting against this legislation. The term "limited" is misleading. This bill assigns it to pregnancy centers that do not receive federal money so, indeed, we may not have ultrasound machines. We do not believe abortion, which ends life, is a good way to assist someone facing an unplanned pregnancy. Issues of Freedom of Speech and Religion may be involved here.

The centers the Pearson Foundation funds do not have paid employees. We give a free pregnancy test, use caring and personal counseling, and we present information as well as options to the women who come to us. Some are under the age of consent. Hawaii does not have a parental involvement clause so that 12, 13, 14 and 15 year olds are at times deprived of the wisdom and love of their parents to help them. Many are panicked at their situation.

They need our calming approach and learn about various types of adoption. Hawaii Catholic Charities even funds the Mary Jane Home (originally begun by the Pearson Foundation) which offers a place to live during their pregnancy. They may need to see a doctor (medical condition or STD that has caused the cessation of menses) if the pregnancy test is negative. We refer them to public health clinics for confirmation of the pregnancy test and a medical exam if necessary.

I am a retired public high school teacher in Hawaii. I have personally encountered the emotional throes of a young girl finding out she is pregnant. I have witnessed the aftereffects and change of personality and depression. I endorse the approach of "limited" pregnancy centers because they give "unlimited" kindness and help.

As a parent I want my child to have available that love, understanding and wisdom. I would like to be the one to help but if I can not, then my next choice is a Pearson Foundation pregnancy center where the first choice is for the life of a human being in gestation.
