## In consideration of S.B. 590 RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

The HHFDC <u>opposes</u> S.B. 590 because it constrains the use of preferences to select purchasers of affordable studio and one-bedroom condominium units that participate in our affordable sales program, and may have the effect of favoring higher income households.

Our sales preferences are intended to satisfy the statutory criteria for our programs set forth in Section 201H-31, HRS, as follows:

[T]he corporation shall give preference to those applicants most in need of assistance in obtaining housing, in light of the amount of moneys available for the various programs. In doing so, the corporation shall take into consideration the applicant's household income and number of dependents; the age of the applicant; the physical disabilities of the applicant or those living with the applicant; whether or not the present housing of the applicant is below standard; whether or not the applicant's need for housing has arisen by reason of displacement of the applicant by governmental actions; and other factors as it may deem pertinent. (emphasis added.)

HHFDC already uses a lottery system to select qualified residents to purchase units in affordable for sale projects within each preference category. If the intent of this measure is to streamline HHFDC's sales program, we would be happy to work with the Committee to do so. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.
