TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL NO. 651 RELATING TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

TO THE HONORABLE KAIALI`I KAHELE, CHAIR, THE HONORABLE LORRAINE R. INOUYE, CHAIR, THE HONORABLE MICHELLE N. KIDANI, VICE-CHAIR, THE HONORABLE DONOVAN M. DELA CRUZ, VICE-CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEES:

The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department") appreciates

the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 651, Relating to Post-Secondary Education.

My name is Bobbi Lum-Mew, Program Administrator for the Department's Hawaii Post-

Secondary Education Authorization Program ("HPEAP"). HPEAP offers the following

comments with concerns on this bill.

The purpose of Senate Bill No. 651 appears to be to provide a mechanism for a

Administration, to obtain state approval of its operations. Because this school does not offer associate or baccalaureate degrees, it does not come under HPEAP's jurisdiction. Under Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") Chapter 305J, HPEAP only authorizes private college or universities that offer these types of degrees.

The Hawaii Department of Education licenses private trade, vocational or technical schools which do not offer degrees. Although there is an exception for flying schools qualified under the Federal Aviation Administration, the Hawaii Department of Education has the discretion to regulate any school which falls under an exception. Hawaii Revised Statutes §302A-424 states as follows:

[§302A-424] Regulation of other schools and classes. The department, at its discretion, may regulate schools, classes, or courses excepted from the definition of "private trade, vocational, or technical school". [L 1996, c 89, pt of §2]

As such, there already is a mechanism in place for a flight school to obtain state approval without making any changes to existing law. The Department notes that there is another bill, Senate Bill No. 652, Relating to Private Flight Schools, that has been introduced to specifically address the Hawaii Department of Education's responsibilities.
