SENATE BILL NO. 771 RELATING TO IRRIGATION

Chairperson Gabbard and Members of the Committee:

Thank for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 771 relating to irrigation. The department supports the intent of this bill provided it does not impact the Department's priorities submitted in the Executive Budget.

Many of the State's irrigation systems are approaching or have been in operation for ever a century. These systems, when operated by the plantations, were labor intensive. Upon the demise of the plantations and the subsequent transfer of some of the irrigation systems to the State, years of neglect must be addressed. The Hawaii Department of Agriculture (HDOA) continues to make improvements on these systems by making them more efficient transporters of water and reducing the daily maintenance requirements; however, much more continues to be necessary. The HDOA respectfully requests that \$13,200,000 be inserted into section 2, line 12 to address the department's expected needs for the 2017-2018 fiscal year.

Aloha Chair Gabbard, Vice Riviere, and Members of the Committee:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawaii Farm Bureau strongly supports SB 771, authorizing the director of finance to issue general obligation bonds to finance capital improvements to various irrigations systems.

Since the demise of plantation operations across the islands, we have seen the erosion of irrigation systems. Ditches that carried water fell into disrepair with major leaks in the system, and in cases such as Kau, cracks in tunnels created enough losses that there is no longer significant flow of water. The Legislature continues to advocate for increased self-sufficiency and sustainability. Agriculture must play a key role in the process and for there to be agriculture, water is important.

As time passes, these systems continue to degrade. Timely funding is needed to restore these systems to increase the opportunities for viable farm and ranch operations.

For these reasons, Hawaii Farm Bureau respectfully requests your **strong support of SB 771**, authorizing general obligation bonds to finance the restoration of irrigation systems. Thank you.
