Chairperson Gabbard and Members of the Committee:

Dear Chair Gabbard, Vice Chair Riviere and members of the committee,

My name is Anne Frederick and I am the Executive Director for the Hawai'i Alliance for Progressive Action (HAPA). HAPA is a statewide environmental, social and economic justice organization. HAPA emerged out of the community-led movement on Kaua'i to enact greater regulations around pesticide use and disclosure, which led to the passage of Bill 2491. HAPA's fair and sustainable food systems work focuses on protecting Hawai'i's environment and the health of its residents from the potentially harmful pesticide impacts. HAPA engages over 10,000 local residents annually through our work.

I am writing in strong support of SB778 which appropriates \$3 million in general revenues to implement the findings of the Kauai Joint Fact Finding study group (JFFSG). These recommendations are the result of a year and a half in-depth exploration of the literature on the impacts of pesticide exposure. The report's recommendations are intended to guide Hawai'i lawmakers and leaders in their work to advance much-needed reforms.

The data gathered during the JFFSG process indicate that Kauai west side residents suffer from numerous health conditions at higher rates than residents living anywhere else on Kauai.

These health conditions/indicators include: Developmental Delay (3 to 8 year olds), ADHD, Easter Seals Enrollment (age 0 to 3), Infant Mortality, Mothers Pre-Existing Health Conditions, Cancer Mortality, Stroke Mortality, Admissions for Bacterial Pneumonia, COPD or Asthma (elderly), Dialysis Patients (per 1,000) and other disabilities.

These are all conditions or health indicators in which the incidence of occurrence by people living on the west side exceed all other Kaua'i communities.

It is important to note that due primarily to the presence of 4 large research based agrochemical companies, the annual pesticide use both in terms of quantity and variety is greater on the West Side of Kauai than in any other community in Hawaii.

The JFFSG's report urges the Hawai'i Governor, state lawmakers, and several state

agencies to work in collaboration to better protect residents from exposure to harmful chemicals in the air and water, and to improve the monitoring of both pesticides and chronic illnesses associated with pesticide exposure. The report also calls for the implementation of a consistent, no-spray buffer policy around sensitive areas like schools to protect children from pesticide drift, and mandatory public disclosure of pesticide use by large agribusinesses throughout the state. We feel these regulatory actions should be the priority of this initiative as only regulation will adequately protect the families who live, work, and play next to these operations

This is why it is critical that the JFFSG recommendations actually be funded and implemented by the State. The comprehensive and regular testing of soil, air and water is essential to determining the potential health risk associated with the pesticide use and drift that we know is occurring.

SB778 is a critical component necessary in fulfilling the objectives and recommendations contained within the State sponsored JFFSG and I strongly encourage this committee to pass this measure and other related measures today.

The passage of S.B. 778, S.B. 779, and S.B. 804 are necessary (1) to determine by the collection of environmental and human data (e.g., urine testing) if residents living near agricultural operations (e.g., west side Kauai residents) are at risk from exposures to pesticides and (2) to provide adequate buffer zones for pesticide applications as adopted by the State of California. As the former senior health and science advisor for U.S. EPA in Chicago, I led or participated in more than 150 federal investigations regarding human exposures to toxic chemicals and pesticides working directly with agencies such as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and health and environmental departments in the States of Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, and Ohio. In 2015-2016, I served as a pro bono liaison expert for the JFF committee.

Only a portion of the 2016 JFF recommendations has been fulfilled by State agencies to address public health issues. *Passage of these bills will fund critical data collection (soils, dusts, air, and human biological) to assess if unsafe pesticide exposures are occurring and to prevent future potential pesticide exposures as strongly recommended in the 2016 JFF report.* The JFF properly concluded there is inadequate pesticide data to determine if residents most proximal to agricultural operations (e.g., Waimea area) are at risk. It is not technically difficult to collect the proper data to assess risks to public health as such information has been collected and evaluated in numerous published studies (see references).

Peer reviewed literature indicates associations with adverse health effects (e.g., autism, autism spectrum disorders, ADHD, fetal defects) and proximity (up to 0.9 mile) to California agricultural fields or known pesticide exposures within ¼ mile. Some of these California studies directly measured the amount of pesticides in the human biological samples (e.g., urine, blood) finding strong statistical correlations with adverse health effects in children. There are numerous areas in Hawaii where residential properties are within ¼ mile of major agricultural operations using highly toxic pesticides. *The JFF report strongly recommended the collection of urine samples to assess human exposure, but no funding mechanism has been established by the State. Without environmental and urine data from communities nearest agricultural fields it will not be possible to assess the risks of agricultural pesticides to public health and put the proper measures (e.g. buffer zones) into place that will protect public health.* 

On Kauai and at other Hawaiian locations a number of restricted use pesticides, with known adverse human health effects documented in the literature, are frequently applied to fields. Chlorpyrifos, associated with adverse health effects in children, is heavily used, as is glyphosate, now classified by IARC as a probable human carcinogen. It has been well documented that dusts and soils are transported from fields into nearby residential properties. A comprehensive review of 35 publications (published 1995–2013) found that

agricultural drift, as measured by proximity to treated farmland, was associated with higher detection rates and concentrations of common agricultural pesticides in residential indoor dust. Photographs of some Waimea agricultural operations have shown wind blown dusts from fields and photographs document deposited soils/dusts (e.g., found on window sills) on nearby residences as well as interior dust accumulation possibly emanating from proximal fields.

The historical incidents at Waimea Canyon Middle School (WCMS) and the 2016 chlorpyrifos pesticide exposure case involving workers for Syngenta resulting in a \$5 million EPA fine, demonstrates that serious pesticide safety issues remain. For the record, there is no technical evidence to support the invalid conclusion that stinkweed caused the adverse health effects among children at Waimea Middle School. Data from an unpublished UH study clearly shows that methyl isocyanate, a toxic air component of stinkweed, was 230 times below a California Air Health Criteria and 12 times lower than at at active stinkweed site on Maui. Some have suggested that mass hysteria (psychogenic illness) as the probable cause of the WCMS events. In my 30 years investigating chemical-related health cases in conjunction with state and federal health agencies we never came across a mass psychogenic event. The repeated events at the Kauai school, the severity of the symptoms, and no such determination of hysteria by attending health providers make the psychogenic hypothesis unlikely.

Definitive conclusions could have been more readily drawn in the WCMS episodes and in the recent 2016 Syngenta case if blood and urine samples had been analyzed for pesticides. Pesticide residues may have been missed during the WCMS analytical testing because comprehensive pesticide analyses were not conducted. Field test kits to assess pesticide exposure (cholinesterase depression) should be provided at health care centers near major agricultural operations and a State funding mechanism is needed to test blood and urine in unusual, acute pesticide episodes. Human samples should be sent to CDC for testing and environmental samples to EPA certified mainland laboratories to verify results obtained by State laboratories. *At this time, it is unclear if HDOH and HDOA will fund and implement these much needed approaches as routinely done in California.* 

The concentrations of pesticides in air, soils, and exterior/interior dusts in Hawaiian residential areas nearest agricultural operations are unknown. Based upon my experience and a review of the west side Kauai situation, an environmental sampling study of residential properties and testing of urine samples, should be undertaken by State agencies in conjunction with national pesticide experts, especially those at the University of California at Berkeley. The passage of bills S.B. 778, S.B. 779, and S.B. 804 will fund those studies as recommended in the JFF report. Without passage of these bills, pesticide issues will continue to arise and it will not be known if the public is adequately protected.

My name is Dr. Ashley Lukens and I am the Director for the Hawaii Center for Food Safety (CFS). CFS is a nationwide public interest, sustainable agriculture nonprofit organization whose mission centers on furthering the public's right to know how their food is produced, through labeling and other means. We have over 800,000 farmer and consumer members across the country, including nearing 10,000 in Hawai'i. On behalf of CFS and our members, I thank you for the opportunity to testify regarding this important bill.

CFS has been dedicated to addressing the human health and environmental impacts of our increased reliance on pesticide use in food production, both in the State of Hawai'i and nationally. We were instrumental in providing legal and communications support in the passage of numerous ordinances relating to pesticide use and disclosure, such as Kaua'i's Bill 2491. Since 2014, as the inaugural director here in Hawai'i, I have worked closely with community members across the state, in all counties, and have played an instrumental role in the passage of Maui's moratorium on GE production until companies submit environmental and public health impact assessments.

I am also a former adjunct professor of Political Science at UH Manoa and UH West O'ahu, where I have taught classes on food, agriculture, and policy from 2006-2016.

Children can be exposed to pesticides applied on school grounds, pesticides that drift onto school grounds from neighboring agricultural lands, or from pesticide residues.<sup>i,ii</sup> **It is critical that the state take action to reduce childhood pesticide exposure because toxic exposure to pesticides during fetal**,<sup>iii</sup> **neonatal**,<sup>iv</sup> **and infant life can disrupt critical developmental processes.**<sup>v</sup> Early life exposure has been linked to long-term health effects including cancer,<sup>vi</sup> decreased cognitive function,<sup>vii,viii,ix</sup> behavior problems,<sup>x,xi</sup> birth defects and other adverse birth outcomes,<sup>xii,xiii</sup> and asthma.<sup>xiv</sup>

Specifically, according to a 2012 report by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) entitled "Pesticide Exposure in Children," children exposed to chronic, low-level restricted use pesticides are at risk of neurodevelopmental disabilities like autism and ADHD<sup>xv,xvi,xvii,xviii</sup>, leukemia<sup>xix,xx,xxi</sup>, and asthma<sup>xxii,xxiii,xxiii</sup>.

Nine of the ten studies examining pesticides and brain cancer that have been conducted since 1998 demonstrated an **increased risk estimate of brain tumors with maternal and/or paternal exposure to pesticides**, though not all achieved statistical significance. One study, which involved 321 cases, demonstrated that **maternal exposure to insecticides before or during pregnancy was associated with a 90% greater risk of astrocytoma** (a type of brain cancer) in the child, as well as a trend to higher risk in exposed fathers<sup>xxv</sup>.

The direct, indirect, and cumulative impacts on public health regarding the long-term intensive commercial agriculture and associated use of pesticides have not been properly or independently evaluated. Existing federal oversight of pesticide exposure do not take into account chronic exposure to local pesticide use. Information pertaining to the intensive use of pesticides in large-scale commercial agriculture within the state is not readily available to the public. Thus, the public is unable to evaluate the full extent of negative impacts accruing to the residents and environment of Hawai'i.

The people of Hawai'i have the right to decide that the risks associated with the use of toxic pesticides in commercial agriculture are unacceptable, and take action to reduce and prevent the potential negative impacts of such use. The state has spent \$200,000 studying this issue in order for it to take informed action. THE TIME FOR THAT ACTION IS NOW.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony, and I am happy to provide further analysis or respond to any follow-up questions from the Committee.

I fully support the appropriation of sufficient funds to fully implement the recommendations made in the Joint Fact Finding Task Force (JFFTF) report on pesticide use by large agri-businesses on Kauai.

It is my belief that the people of Kauai were strongly in support of the attempts the County took to address some of the impacts of pesticide use by large agri-businesses in 2014, including the recommendation that an independent assessment be made of probable impacts of pesticide use by these operations on the health of those who live, go to school and/or work in or nearby the fields where pesticides are applied. Fortunately, this work was initiated before the Federal court struck done the County Ordinance/Bylaw. The scientific literature compiled and reviewed by the JFFTF was extensive, but mostly addressed studies of individual pesticides on specific aspects of human health and wellbeing. The Task Force found very little solid data on the human health impacts of pesticide use by large agribusinesses on Kauai – and that can be described as a product of benign neglect on the part of government and industry. This situation is no longer acceptable to the people of Kauai.

SN778 represents needed action by the State of Hawaii to ensure that the results and recommendations of the JFFTF receive the follow-up they warrant. This is a matter of public trust. The courts have spoken; it is up to the State to appropriately regulate the use of pesticides on behalf of its citizens and those who visit Hawaii. The actions recommended by the JFFTF are but one step that the State should take to protect the people of Hawaii from the unintended consequences of large scale pesticide use.

The enactment of SB778 is necessary. I urge all State Legislators to support this Bill.

As you know, the JFF report urges the State of Hawai'i to protect residents from pesticide exposure, and to improve the monitoring of pesticides and the illnesses related to pesticide exposure. The report also calls for buffer zones around sensitive areas like schools as well as mandatory disclosure of pesticide use by large agribusinesses throughout the state. I believe that these regulatory actions should be the priority of this initiative, to sufficiently protect the families who live, work, and play next to these operations. Buffer zones around sensitive areas such as schools and hospitals makes sense as a place to begin protecting the public. The JFF report also concluded that the public health impacts regarding long-term exposure to pesticides associated with large scale commercial agriculture have not been properly or independently studied. This is because information pertaining to the use of these pesticides is not available to the public or to health care professionals. Kept in the dark, doctors and scientists have been unable to evaluate the full extent of negative impacts occurring to both residents and to the environment. Disclosure of what is being sprayed and in what quantity is required in order to analyze the impacts. It is time for the State to take action to reduce and prevent the potential negative impacts of such use. The Dept. of Agriculture has been woefully underfunded in this area and this appropriation will allow this action to finally take place. I urge you to support SB778. I would like to relate an incident that I personally experienced where the state of Hawaii has not done it's job in protectin from pesticide exposure. In 1985 after a request from the parents at Haiku School on Maui to have the drinking water tested, the acting health director from Honolulu came with the results of a test for several known pesticides used in the pineapple industry. The PTA was told that no traces of pesticides were found. We had been tipped off that the test was only done to detect parts per million even though the EPA standards were in less than 5 parts per billion. When questioned about the honesty of testing when you're only testing 1000th of the amount the response was that they didn't have month enough money to test parts per billion. It's hard to underestimate the negligence of such a statement from the then highest official of Hawaii's Health Department. This is by far not the only experience that I've personally been witness to. In the past, testing of air or water could not be done because the list of pesticides used by both the pineapple and sugar industries were secret. Please support this bill.

Children can be exposed to pesticides sprayed on school grounds and those that drift from neighboring agricultural lands, as has happened in Waimea and Kekaha. Children exposed to restricted use pesticides are at a risk of disabilities like autism and ADHD, leukemia, and asthma. Toxic exposure to pesticides from while in the womb to early years has been linked to long-term health effects including cancer, behavior problems, birth defects and asthma. My best friend has two daughters who have most likely been affected by exposure: the 16 year old has severe asthma and the 12 year old has serious learning disabilities; she is currently a 7th grader at Waimea Canyon School and can barely read. Studies suggest an increased risk of brain tumors and brain cancer. Buffer zones around sensitive areas such as schools and hospitals is essential. The JFF report also concluded that the public health impacts regarding long-term exposure to pesticides associated with experimentation and research on seed corn have not been properly or independently studied. This is because information pertaining to the use of these pesticides is not available to the public or to health care professionals. Children can be exposed to pesticides sprayed on school grounds and those that drift from neighboring agricultural lands. Children exposed to restricted used pesticides are at a risk of disabilities like autism and ADHD, leukemia, and asthma. Toxic exposure to pesticides from while in the womb to early years has been linked to long term health effects including certain behavior problems, birth defects and asthma. Studies suggest an increased risk of brain tumors and brain cancer. Buffer zones around sensitive areas such as schools and hospitals makes sense as a place to begin protecting the public. The state of California requires a minimum of 1/4 mile buffer zone from any school and day care center, from Monday through Friday between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. They require growers and others applying pesticides at these locations to notify schools and daycare centers 48 hours before the application actually occurs. Schools and daycare centers would also have to be told the names of pesticides being used; where, when and how they'll be applied; and be given a map of the location. In some counties in California growers have been encouraged to grow organic in these buffer zones.

The JFF report also concluded that the public health impacts regarding long-term exposure to pesticides associated with large scale commercial agriculture have not been properly or

independently studied. This is because information pertaining to the use of these pesticides is not available to the public or to health care professionals.
