Aloha Senators,

This is in regards to SB 785. I am in strong support of this measure.

When the hospital in Ewa closed, HI Medical Center West, a number of years ago my medical records were locked in. I had been admitted to that hospital twice and had extensive records with them including surgery information, x-rays, MRI images, medicine allergies, and more.

I felt I had no choice but to pay \$50 to obtain my records for my new doctor after the hospital closing. Not getting this records seemed to be a life and death choice.

What is more, we had to pay an additional \$50 to get my husband's records, since he had also been treated for a car accident at HI Medical Center West, and my son who had records on file with them as well.

We were blown away---\$150 to get records that should belong to us anyways??!?

I can't say how strongly feel that this bill should pass immediately. Unfortunately it is too late for what happened to us.
