Chair Keith-Agaran and members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary and Labor, thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of Senate Bill No. 855. The purpose of this bill is to require an applicant for a driver's license or civil identification card to choose to register to vote or not before their application is processed and to decide whether they wish to be a permanent absentee voter.

The Office of Elections believes that this bill will increase the opportunities for members of our community to register to vote, as it requires the applicant to directly address the question of whether they wish to be automatically registered to vote or to opt out as part of the driver's license and state identification card application process.

Similarly, this bill will make voting more convenient by ensuring that every applicant will be mailed a ballot, unless they opt out and would prefer to vote in person. Without this change, we will be left with the current situation in which many voters do not take advantage of the opportunity to request a permanent absentee ballot when they register to vote and many of those do not subsequently vote in person.

Finally, this bill ensures the accuracy of the voter registration rolls by electronically transmitting voter registration data between the driver licensing/ state identification card database and the statewide voter registration system. This includes the ability to update the voter file based on updates to the driver's license/ state identification card file, such as name or address change. The electronic sharing of data between driver licensing officials and election officials

will help to ensure timely compliance with the National Voter Registration Act and the Help America Vote Act. 52 USC § 21083(a)(5)(B) & 52 USC § 20504.

Dear Chair Keith-Agaran and Committee Members:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony in support of Senate Bill No. 855. This Bill would require an affidavit on the application for voter registration to be included as part of the application for driver's licenses and civil identification cards. Additionally, the Bill would establish an affirmative opt-out automatic voter registration and permanent absentee ballot application process, and allow for the electronic transmission of voter registration data to election officials.

Incorporating a voter registration application into all driver's license and identification card applications, and establishing an affirmative opt-out automatic voter registration and permanent absentee ballot application process will create a seamless and much more convenient process, and will eliminate another impediment that hinders participation in Hawai'i's elections.

Providing for the electronic transfer of voter registration information ensures that the respective election officials receive voter data in a timely manner and reduces data entry errors, thereby increasing the overall integrity of the voter file.

We wish to thank the Legislature for hearing this Bill and respectfully request support of this measure. Additionally, please feel free to contact the County of Kaua'i's Elections Division if we can assist in clarifying issues pertaining to automatic voter registration, the electronic transmission of voter data, or related matters.

TESTIMONY / SUPPORT with COMMENTS Corie Tanida, Executive Director, Common Cause Hawaii

Dear Chair Keith-Agaran, Vice Chair Rhoads, and members of the committee:

**Common Cause Hawaii supports SB855 with comments.** Under SB855 applications for civil identification cards or driver's licenses would not be processed until the applicant declined to register to vote or completed the registration affidavit. It also authorizes the electronic transfer of voter registration information from the counties and Department of Transportation, to election officials and the statewide voter registration system.

This proposal, commonly known as Automatic Voter Registration (AVR) is a critical step toward modernizing our elections system. With AVR:

- Elections will be more secure. The electronic transfer of data in real time will lead to fewer typos, duplicates, and lost forms, thus our voter rolls will be more accurate and the chances of voter fraud will be reduced.
- The state will save money. States that have upgraded their systems estimate it costs approximately 30 times less to process an electronic application than a paper application.<sup>1</sup>

In order to protect applicants who may mistakenly register to vote we suggest including the following language:

Unless an ineligible individual willfully and knowingly takes affirmative steps to register to vote knowing that he or she is not eligible to do so, the record and signature of an ineligible individual that is transmitted through an electronic system by a government agency to any elections or voter registration authority shall not constitute a completed voter registration form, and that individual shall not be considered to have registered to vote. Therefore if such registration is processed by the state, it shall be presumed to have been effectuated and officially authorized by the state and the individual cannot be subject to any penalty under any relevant laws.

Automatic Voter Registration works. Oregon was the first state to implement this system in 2016. Over 270,000 were registered via Automatic Voter Registration, of those 42.73% (or 97,184) voted in the 2016 General Election, which helped Oregon set a new state record for number of votes cast.<sup>2</sup>

As a state that consistently ranks last in the nation for voter participation, we commend your consideration of this important step to use existing technology and pathways to improve the process for registering eligible voters.

**TESTIMONY** Janet Mason, Legislative Co-Chair, League of Women Voters of Hawaii

Chair Keith-Agaran, Vice-Chair Rhoads, and Committee Members:

The League of Women Voters of Hawaii strongly supports SB 855 which provides that all applicants who are eligible to vote and apply for a driver's license will be automatically registered to vote (if not already registered to vote) unless the applicant affirmatively declines to register to vote.

This is excellent, much-needed legislation, if Hawaii is to make significant progress in improving its voter turnout. We will not be able to make inroads with voter turnout until we boost the number of persons registered to vote as a percent of those eligible to vote. One recent estimate is that about 36% of those eligible haven't registered.<sup>1</sup> Of course the League acknowledges motivating registered voters to vote also remains a challenge, and we are committed to working on this effort as well.

We are pleased that the actual affidavit for voter registration would be included as a part of these applications., . This should satisfy provisions of the National Voter Registration Act that require an "opt out" clause. Likewise, we support automatically registering an application for registration as a permanent absentee voter.

The bill makes clear that information from County departments of motor vehicles should be transmitted electronically to the clerk of the county on a real-time basis and permits the counties to electronically share the voter registration data with the statewide voter registration system, so applications to vote can be processed in a timely way.

The bill also makes clear that databases operated by the counties or department of transportation should be electronically accessible to the statewide voter registration system. Though not the express purpose of this measure we fully expect these steps will also support quality voter registration data.

There are however two issues I see with the bill in it's current format. 1) There is an exemption to a driver having proof of financial responsibility (insurance) for drivers allowed with outstanding traffic citations or failures to appear in court, if a judge decides you need you car to get to work (§286-109c). EVERYONE should have insurance! This should not be at a judges discretion to allow someone has driving citations to continue to drive (poorly) and be exempt for carrying insurance; I don't want to pay for their bad driving if there is an accident. 2) There seems to be no provision for verifying US citizenship when accepting the voter affidavit; this should be a requirement if this is going to be included on the application. I'm don't think citizenship should be a requirement for a license or id card, but it should checked for the voter portion of the application. My name is T. J. Davies Jr. I am 82 years old, retired and live in Kakaako. I am writing in STRONG SUPPORT of SB 855, Relating to Elections, Voter Registration and; Permanent Absentee Voter Status.

We no longer have to stick to traditional paper forms which require staff to literally have to take the forms from one agency to the next and then manually enter data. Updating and modernizing our system will lead to increased processing efficiency and productivity.

States that have switched to electronic systems have reported that it costs about 30 times less to process an electronic application than a paper application.

Due to the increased accuracy of voter rolls—thanks to real time data transfers, fewer typos, fewer duplicate records, no more lost forms, etc. the chances of voter fraud will be reduced. The use of an encrypted system rather than paper forms to transfer data, will also make our elections more secure.

Privacy and the right to choose to participate is assured, as those who do not want to register to vote can opt-out and their information will not be shared with the Office of Elections.
