Re: Hearing on Senate Bill 909 Relating to Energy Assurance

Aloha Chair Inouye, Chair Nishihara and Chair Baker,

Island Energy Services, LLC (IES) purchased the assets of the formerly owned and operated Chevron on November 1, 2016, and continues to operate as a key supplier of petroleum products to the Hawaii market and economy. As a key supplier, IES agrees with the intent of SB 909 and supports the State's objective in being prepared if an emergency hits the State and preserving energy and fuel security for all the residents of the State of Hawaii.

IES has and continues to work with DBEDT on energy issues, including emergency preparedness and assurance. IES would comment that any time a statute is being amended that calls for the providing of petroleum business information, IES is concerned in 3 areas:

(1) that information provided by IES, much of which is proprietary and confidential in nature, that the statute keep the information confidential and that DBEDT use the confidential information for its intended purpose of emergency preparedness and for no other purpose;

(2) DBEDT/Governor will need to make certain public pronouncements about fuel security, and while keeping the individual company names confidential, will discuss certain items and data in the aggregate. However, because Hawaii has a small number of petroleum operators in Hawaii, aggregation might not be possible, without disclosing confidential information, and possibly causing harm to operator. DBEDT has given IES assurances that if this means not being able to aggregate certain detailed information in order to maintain its confidentiality, then that information cannot leave the possession of DBEDT, and will be handled accordingly; and

(3) that the requested information by DBEDT is not overly broad and that it does not unduly burden IES and other fuel companies, and it does not hinder the
