## SB 961 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION

Aloha Chair Ing and members of the Committee:

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands strongly supports this bill that amends the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act to reduce the number of commissioners that are residents of the city and county of Honolulu and adds a commissioner from the island of Lanai. This bill is part of the Governor's administrative package by request of our Department.

The Hawaiian Homes Commission is currently composed of nine members, and at least one member is a resident of each island on which the department has land with the exception of Lanai. The department acquired 50 acres on Lanai in 1999, and the department has awarded 29 leases on Lanai, and there are 66 applicants awaiting lease awards on Lanai. However, there is no provision for a member of the commission to be a resident of Lanai.

This proposal provides for a more direct connection for native Hawaiian beneficiaries on Lanai to the Hawaiian Homes Commission by requiring at least one member of the Commission be a resident of Lanai. This member will better understand the interests, needs, and concerns of beneficiaries as well as land management matters on Lanai.

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) <u>SUPPORTS</u> SB961, which proposes to amend the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act (HHCA) by reducing the number of Hawaiian Homes Commissioners residing on O'ahu from three to two, and adding a Commissioner from the island of Lāna'i. This measure would ensure that Lāna'i homesteaders have more meaningful representation on the Hawaiian Homes Commission, through a Lāna'i Commissioner who may better understand the unique needs and concerns of their island.

As currently written, the HHCA appears intended to require the Hawaiian Homes Commission to include Commissioners from each of the islands on which Hawaiian home lands are located. However, in describing the specific Commission composition, the HHCA does not include a Commissioner for Lāna'i, on which fifty acres of land were acquired by Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) in 1999. Notably, 29 leases have since been awarded for DHHL's Lāna'i lands, with an additional 66 lease applications currently pending. This measure would recognize the need to ensure that Lāna'i's homestead communities have their own representative on the Hawaiian Homes Commission, consistent with the HHCA's apparent intent to ensure representation from each island on which Hawaiian home lands are located.

OHA supports the principle that all islands with Hawaiian home lands should have representation on the Commission. We take this opportunity, however, to also note the significant needs of O'ahu. In its January 11, 2017, testimony to the Senate Ways and Means Committee, DHHL identified O'ahu as having the greatest demand (i.e., the longest waiting list) for residential property (10,511 residential lease applications as of November 30, 2016). Additionally, O'ahu has substantial homestead communities, including in Kapolei, Nānākuli, Princess Kahanu Estates, Papakōlea, Kewalo, Kalāwahine, Waimānalo, Waiāhole, Kumuhau/Kaka'ina, Wai'anae, Kaupuni Village, and Lualualei. It is our expectation that the Commission and DHHL will continue to address DHHL's challenges on O'ahu, even with this measure's proposed reduction of the number of Commissioners representing the island.
