TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL 968 RELATING TO SERVICES PERFORMED BY CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES

My name is Dayton M. Nakanelua, State Director of the United Public Workers, AFSCME, Local 646, AFL-CIO (UPW). The UPW is the exclusive bargaining representative for approximately 14,000 public employees, which include blue collar, nonsupervisory employees in Bargaining Unit 01 and institutional, health and correctional employees in Bargaining Unit 10, in the State of Hawaii and various counties. The UPW also represents about 1,500 members of the private sector.

SB 968 proposes to increase the civil service position count of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority with additional 34 positions including construction, labor, maintenance and trade skills. No funding is being requested. The UPW fully supports this request by the HPHA; the department needs these resources to increase the availability of state public housing to needy and qualified residents of Hawaii.
