I. OVERVIEW OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

This proposal seeks to amend chapter 396, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), by amending (A) section 396-11.5, HRS, by adding an additional means of serving chapter 91 notices of hearing by electronic service through a company designated by the HLRB; and (B) section 396-12, HRS, by adding new language to require that a party appealing a HLRB decision to bear the costs of transcripts, except as provided by law.

II. CURRENT LAW

Section 396-11.5, HRS, allows service of hearing notices by first class mail. There is no current law in chapter 396 related to requiring appealing parties to bear the the cost of preparing a transcript.

III. COMMENTS ON THE HOUSE BILL

HLRB supports SB981 and urges passage of the bill.
