1 **Fiscal Implications:** None to the Department of Health.

2 **Department Testimony:** DOH appreciates the intent of this measure and emphatically agrees with the importance of meningococcal vaccination among school and college students in 3 4 accordance with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices 5 (ACIP). DOH appreciates the legislature incorporating the Department's request to assure 6 students and parents are informed about the importance of all vaccinations, including but not 7 limited to meningococcal disease. DOH is willing and continues to collaborate with the 8 Department of Education, Hawaii Association of Independent Schools, the University of Hawaii, 9 and other secondary and post-secondary educational institutions, to assure our students and 10 parents are informed about the importance of all vaccinations recommended for adolescents, including but not limited to meningococcal disease. Such information will be included in any 11 educational materials and campaigns intended for students and parents statewide. According to 12 ACIP, children between ages 11 and 12 years should also receive two additional vaccines: 13 human papillomavirus (HPV) and tetatus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (Tdap), as well as an 14 annual influenza vaccine. Rather than focusing exclusively on meningococcal vaccines, an 15 approach that includes the promotion of all preteen and adolescent vaccinations is consistent 16 with current medical practice and national recommendations by ACIP, the American Academy 17 18 of Pediatrics (AAP), and the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP).

- 1 The promotion of information regarding meningococcal disease and other vaccine-preventable
- 2 diseases has been a priority of DOH. DOH has coordinated several campaigns and educational
- 3 courses with partners to promote meningococcal and other vaccinations—for example, the
- 4 Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine Preventable Diseases Course on January 10 and 11,
- 5 2017, in which CDC experts discussed various vaccine preventable diseases, including
- 6 meningococcal disease and vaccines.
- 7 The Department looks forward to continuing to work with Department of Education, Hawaii
- 8 Association of Independent Schools, the University of Hawaii, and other partners in education to
- 9 provide information and recommendations promoting the awareness of vaccines in the
- 10 prevention of disease.

The Hawaii Immunization Coalition (HIC) <u>supports SCR157 with amendments</u>. HIC appreciates the intent of this resolution, especially regarding the importance of meningococcal vaccination among school and college students in accordance with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP).

According to ACIP, children between ages 11 and 12 years should also receive two additional vaccines in additional to meningococcal vaccine: human papillomavirus (HPV) and tetatus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (Tdap), as well as an annual influenza vaccine. To increase the opportunity to reduce vaccine preventable diseases among students in Hawaii, *HIC strongly recommends that in addition to meningococcal disease and vaccines, information on all vaccinations recommended for adolescents should be included in any educational materials and campaigns intended for students and parents statewide.* T

The promotion of all preteen and adolescent vaccinations is consistent with current medical standards of care and national recommendations by ACIP, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), and the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP). Timely and updated information on vaccinations for students will protect children who are most vulnerable to vaccine preventable diseases:

- More than 732,000 American lives were saved by childhood vaccination in the past 20 years.
- School health requirements for attendance/registration that include vaccination are a valuable strategy for keeping our schools safe for children who **can** get vaccinated and for those who **cannot** because of medical reasons.
- School immunization regulations rely on *herd immunity* that at least 93% of the school population is vaccinated to protect students.

HIC has had a longstanding collaboration with Department of Health (DOH) for many years, and we know that it has the experience and commitment to collaborate with stakeholders—including the Department of Education, Hawaii, the Association of Independent Schools, the University of Hawaii, and other partners in education—to provide information and recommendations promoting the awareness of vaccines in the prevention of disease for our students and parents in Hawaii.
