HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, AND JUDICIARY TO PERMANENTLY ESTABLISH AND PARTICIPATE IN THE HAWAII INTERAGENCY STATE YOUTH NETWORK OF CARE TO BETTER SERVE YOUTH AND FAMILIES WITH COMPLEX NEEDS IN THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Education, Department of Health, Department of Human Services, and Judiciary are responsible for 2 serving the multiple needs of children, youth, and families; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, many children, youth, and families, particularly 6 those with complex educational, behavioral, and social-emotional needs, experience significant challenges and hardship navigating 7 8 the State's child-serving system; and 9 WHEREAS, children and youth with complex needs who do not 10 receive services face numerous negative consequences, including 11 lower educational achievement, increased likelihood of 12 involvement in the juvenile justice system, and fewer stable and 13 longer-term placements in the child welfare system than their 14 15 peers; and 16 WHEREAS, to better serve children, youth, and families, the 17 Department of Education, Department of Health, Department of 18 Human Services, and Judiciary have committed to the goals of the 19 20 Child and Adolescent Service System Program, including to: 21 Promote the development of a wide array of services to (1) 22 meet the needs of identified children; 23 24 Integrate multiple services into a well-coordinated 25 (2) 26 system of care to make sure children are receiving the most appropriate services; and 27





1 (3) Increase the ability of parents and professionals to work together for the benefit of the children; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, a seamless system of care has numerous positive 5 outcomes for children and youth, including the improvement of school attendance and grades; increasing stability of living 6 7 situations; and decreasing behavioral health challenges, suicide rates, substance abuse, and involvement in the juvenile justice 8 9 system; and 10 WHEREAS, the Department of Education, Department of Health, 11 Department of Human Services, and Judiciary formed the Hawaii 12 13 Interagency State Youth Network of Care (HISYNC) to increase 14 collaboration among state agencies and to develop a system of 15 care for children, youth, and families; and 16 17 WHEREAS, representatives of children, youth, and families 18 are included as valued HISYNC members and regularly attend 19 meetings to give recommendations and to ensure that the childserving system is responsive to the needs of children, youth, 20 and families; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the HISYNC members primarily work to improve outcomes for Hawaii's children, youth, and families through: 24 25 26 (1)The continuous review and analysis of data to identify areas for system and service improvement; 27 28 29 (2) The recommendation of policies to address barriers 30 within the child-serving system; 31 32 (3) Collaboration, coordination, and integration of state programs, services, and resources; 33 34 35 (4)Planning on joint treatment and management of specific 36 youth; and 37 Stakeholder problem-solving around multi-agency 38 (5) challenges; and 39 40 WHEREAS, HISYNC has implemented and supported several 41 42 multi-agency initiatives to promote interagency collaboration, 43 including:



(1)A multi-agency memorandum of operation to formalize 1 2 partnership of the state agencies comprising the interagency committee and to firmly establish the 3 4 committee's mission and vision; 5 6 (2) A multi-agency consent form for information sharing 7 that streamlines the process for parents to access 8 care, thus alleviating the often duplicative and numerous forms that parents need to complete and sign; 9 10 (3) A jointly-funded independent facilitator position to 11 carry out the daily activities of HISYNC and the 12 13 Hawaii Interagency Local Youth Network of Care (HILYNC) committees; 14 15 16 (4) An annual interagency report with data on youth served, costs, and outcomes, which brings together the 17 story of youth in Hawaii with respect to how they are 18 being served and supported by child-serving agencies; 19 and 20 21 (5) Facilitating the development of local and regional 22 HILYNC groups, also known as HILYNC committees, to 23 24 promote interagency collaborative work on the local level; now, therefore, 25 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 28 29 of 2017, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education, Department of Health, Department of Human Services, 30 31 and Judiciary are urged to permanently establish HISYNC; and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education, 33 34 Department of Health, Department of Human Services, and 35 Judiciary are urged to participate in HISYNC and HILYNC; and 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any additional child-serving 37 38 agencies not currently members of HISYNC are urged to 39 participate in HISYNC's interagency forum and send local 40 representatives to each of the regional HILYNC committees; and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that HISYNC is urged to coordinate the complex landscape of the child-serving system to better 43 44 serve children, youth, and families; and HCR10 HD1 HMS 2017-3027
