Hui Pono Holoholona -HPH founded in 2007, is 100% dedicated volunteers to decrease animal overpopulation, animal abandonment, and high euthanasia at the Kea'au Humane Society by making available low cost/no cost spay/neuter for dogs and cats. On the East side of the big Isle, approx. 10 to 1 more cats are being euthanized per month than Kona and Waimea humane society facilities, showing that the need for multiple mash spay/neuter clinics are in extreme need. The organization Animal Balance -AB that does mash clinics is a global 501-C3 comprised of Veterinarians, Vet Techs, and professional Trappers. In 2016, we volunteered with their first mash clinic in Kea'au. Seeing first hand their professional and caring for the animals. In July 2017, we sponsored their organization in Hilo for 6 day mash clinic where 683 cats were successfully sterilized. HPH's financial contribution, enabled AB to exceed their original plans of 500 cats. We had hundreds of people in line every day, as proof if you make these types of mash clinics available people will bring in their unaltered animals. The included Memorandum of Understanding between HPH and AB for the July 2017 clinic, is included. Our working partnership with AB is to bring more of these much needed services to Hawai'i Island.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request

The goal is to reduce animal overpopulation humanely. Current numbers of euthanasia on Hawai'i Island is staggering-See included HIHS monthly reports. Every low cost/no cost spay/neuter opportunity needs to be pursued more to decrease the horrific numbers of healthy animals being euthanized daily. Round up to kill over decades has proven unsuccessful, and overall more costly. Also, unwanted litter births leads to animal abandonment when the community is aware of the high euthanasia at the humane society. Although local animal s/n groups holding one day a month clinic's is slowing declining the amount of animals being turned in to HIHS daily, a bigger push for S/N mash clinics are needed. The team proven that can do this is Animal Balance. Following the July 2017 clinic, the Hawai'i Island Humane Society – HIHS monthly statistical reports showed from July to October a crucial reduction in cat intake/euthanasia. The euthanasia rate for the East Hawai'i – Keaau HIHS site is 80% for cats. To humanely reduce

Hawai'i Island to a no kill society, would be to increase four to six s/n mash clinic's a year, such as AB could provide. An estimated 12 return clinics, doing 700 cats each time, over the next 3 years could achieve this goal.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

Statistically, we can show over decades that round-up to kill dogs and cats does not decrease animal overpopulation, and overall is more expensive. It causes an opposite effect, as the public awareness of the high euthanasia at the humane society facility and unable to afford the cost to S/N, are preferring to abandon animals in the false belief they have a better chance to survive.

Our organization was formed to provide low cost/no cost spay/neuter because people told us over and over that they were not able to afford the high cost of that service which can be over \$200 per animal at private Veterinarian businesses. Cost of living in Hawai'i is difficult because of low paying jobs, high cost of rent, food, medical, leaves little or nothing left. People of Hawai'i love their animals, and willing to feed and care. It was proven every day during July 2017 Mash AB six day clinic, where hundreds of people lined up with their animals, so much so that we had to ask they return the following day. Each day was the same!

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

All persons feeding and caring for community cats, that are not spay/neutering. In July 2017, 98 people brought in one or two cats. 30 people brought in three to five cats. Six or more cats were brought in by 38 people. We are planning a series of targeted trap, neuter and release programs for the islands' community cat population in 2018. This will humanely reduce the cat population and dramatically reduce the intake and subsequent euthanasia of non-socialized cats to HIHS. These cats are deemed not adoptable as they have not been socialized, or 'tamed', and cannot live in a home. These cats live outside, in a well-managed and monitored colony.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

July 2017 Mash AB clinic compiled worksheets showed 49% of the participants were Hilo residents, 43% Puna, 8% from other parts of the island. These participants ranged from caregivers of T-N-R-Manage of colony cats, to pet owners like senior citizens and traveling up to 60 miles or more round trip distance to Hilo from Kalapana, Volcano, Laupahoehoe, etc.,. showing a huge turnout of community support with compassion to spay/neuter the feral population, not to kill no matter where they exist through the AB Mash clinic.

Hui Pono Holoholona is the host organization, securing a clinic location, accommodations, transportation, promotion, general supplies and much more. , The Volunteer AB team of Veterinarians, Vet Techs and Trappers; arrives one day before surgery to hold orientation / training with local volunteers and to set up clinic site. The 2017 Memorandum of Understanding between HPH and AB is included.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

When funding is secured; clinic dates and site are determined. The AB team reservations are made for travel, transportation and accommodations. Supplies and equipment are ordered and acquired. Community notices are prepared and distributed. Local volunteers will complete as much clinic prep work as feasible. AB staff will arrive one day prior to surgery for local volunteer training and clinic surgery setup. Each clinic day is expected to see between 100 to 140 cats for surgery. With full funding 4 weekly clinics could be possible in 2018 on Hawai'i Island.

- 3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; The AB Coordinator is the clinic leader, working closely with the Professional Veterinarians, HIHS, HPH and other organizations. The Animal Balance Medical Standards and Operating Procedures Manual is followed to insure the safety and wellbeing of humans and animals involved in this service.

A statistical summary of clinic participants will be prepared from each Patient Registration Form (no names, address, or other confidential info. will be disclosed). After each AB Mash Clinic, HIHS monthly animal statistical reports will be monitored for cat intake activity. The effectiveness of the AB Mash July 2017 clinic, showed a dramatic drop in HIHS intake numbers over the last five months, thus indicating lives were saved. <u>See included HIHS reports</u>. Specifically, the June 2017 Kea'au HIHS intake of strays/feral cats was 415, by comparison the July intake dropped to 297. This was a decrease of 118 cats being turned in and without doubt as a direct result of AB 6-day clinic saving lives via S/N by preventing unwanted litter births

Hui Pono Holoholona received Hawaii County Council Contingency Funds Grant of \$2,500.00 to apply to Animal Balance clinic for March 2018.

Met with Hawai'i County's Mayor Kim to thank him for supporting the July 2018 AB clinic with grant funding of \$15,600 to cover AB accommodations, vehicles and supplies. Asked for continued clinic support, and received a 1st Quarter of 2018 Letter of Commitments for \$15,600 from Hawaii County Research & Development for Animal Balance March clinic.

Applying for Grants with Petco, Alley Cat Allies, and other animal charities for s/n funding. Local donations and fundraising activities are in the works.

Hui Pono Holoholona applies each year for a County of Hawai'i County Council Nonprofit Grant to hold small local s/n clinics. We have fortunately received partial funding for these clinics each year since 2011.

In 2018 the Big Island and Kauai are their focus. With 5 Hawaii Licensed Veterinarians, Vet Techs, and professional Trappers who are highly trained and experienced in high volume, high standard spay/neuter clinics. This means that Animal Balance can legally hold temporary sterilization clinics on Hawaiian island and utilize the fastest and most experienced surgeons in the USA to perform the operations.



Memorandum of Understanding

This is an agreement between Animal Balance, a non-profit organization TAX ID # 68-0630714 and Hui Pono Holoholona, TAX ID # 20-8567302. On this day, June 12, 2017, we enter into a free and voluntary agreement to work together to reach the following goal:

Goal:

To work together to create a sustainable program to humanely reduce the cat populations on the Big Island of Hawaii.

Strategy:

Hold a 6-day targeted trapping and sterilization campaign for community cats from July 15th 24th, 2017.

Animal Balance will safely render each cat permanently sterile so they cannot reproduce, thereby humanely reducing the population.

In addition:

- Each owned cat will receive a microchip and FVRCP vaccination
- Each community cat will receive a microchip and FVRCP and their ear will be tipped

Animal Balance agrees to:

- Provide surgery supplies for 500 cats for the July clinic
- Provide 50 traps and 50 transfer cages for safely capturing community cat
- Provide cat trap training and tips for colony management, to the local NGO's (non-governmental organizations) and community caretakers.
- Provide an efficient and experienced high-volume, high-quality, medical team of volunteers. These volunteers are expected to purchase their own airfare.
- Provide all Medical, Clinic, Trapping, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP's) and the Volunteer and Staff Behavior Code.
- Ensure that the Animal Balance Medical Director holds a valid Hawaii License and NED license.
- Safely sterilize as many cats and dogs as our team is capable of in 6 days
- Equip the dinic with an anesthesia machine and 30 surgical instrument packs
- Provide clinic paperwork ensuring that all processes are tracked, recorded and signed off on by a veterinarian
- Provide all spay and neuter data to HPH at the end of the campaign or shortly after.
- Offer training to local volunteers and staff in any aspect of the sterilization clinic
- Solicit as many donations as possible from our network and from our contacts at the pharmaceutical companies

- Work in conjunction with community volunteers in a positive way; building trust and providing empowerment to team mates.
- Cover all expenses related to any post-operative complications, after consultation with Animal Balance's Medical Director, Dr. Amanda Bruce.

Hui Pono Holoholona agree to:

- Provide local volunteers for the clinics for non-medical tasks, per Animal Balance's team requirements
- Provide a logistics coordinator for Animal Balance's Field Operations Director to work with to plan the clinic. (Frannie Pueo)
- Upon availability, transfer County grant funding to Animal Balance to utilize for volunteer accommodation and transportation during the week of the campaign.
- Allow the medical team to use the HPH pressure cooker/autoclave during the campaign so we can sterilize our surgical instruments in accordance with the AVMA guidelines.
- Permit community caretakers to bring as many cats as they can each day.
- Identify the target population of most 'at risk' cats, using the most logical methods locally
- · Recruit well suited local volunteers and prepare them for the campaign
- Provide necessary public outreach before, during and after, such as fliers, radio, television and internet notices, depending on what is most popular locally
- Safely hold the traps and transfer cages before and after the clinic. We would like for the traps and transfer cages to be utilized in the community through a centrally located and free 'trap library'.

Animal Balance and Hui Pono Holoholna agree that: -

- All volunteers and staff (local and visiting) will follow Animal Balance's protocols for a field MASH clinic and for volunteer and staff behavior while on location.
- Ensure that all media and outreach documents specify this campaign as HPH and Animal Balance, plus any additional local partners such as HIHS, Alley Cat Allies, and Rainbow Friends' are working together to humanely reduce the dog and cat populations. Emma Clifford and Meredith Hippert of Animal Balance and Frances Pueo will approve all media and outreach materials, prior to their release. This includes all media and **all social media** posts by all team members.

This is a voluntary agreement that all parties have entered into, as each understands the critical importance of humanely reducing the dog and cat populations on Hawaii Island. The dogs and cats will be brought to the clinic, sterilized and treated for any ailments affecting individual animal welfare, including internal and external parasites. They will then be tattooed to identify that they have been sterilized. They will be released to a caretaker after they have sufficiently recovered from anesthesia. Animals will only be euthanized if they are so sick or injured that they have no chance of recovery and it is deemed in their best interest by the Animal Balance Medical Director, the Director of Animal Balance, and the caretaker (if applicable).

If one party should not be able to provide the above, then a written statement shall immediately be given to other parties.



A 'MASH unit' for cats: 'Trapped in Paradise' a massive spay-neuter operation

HILO — Trapped in Paradise, a massive free spay and neuter campaign for cats, will take place in Hilo from July 17-22, 2017.

Animal Balance, a Portland, Ore.-based global nonprofit organization dedicated to creating community-based population management programs for dogs and cats, will join forces with Hui Pono Holoholona, Rainbow Friends Animal Sanctuary and the Hawaii Island Humane Society to sterilize up to 700 felines and provide vaccinations for free. The main focus will be strays but cat lovers are welcome to bring in their domesticated feline friends, as well.

The six-day operation will take place at the former Alii Ice Factory at 860 Piilani St., next door to Mardiart arts and crafts store. Cat drop-offs are from 8-9 a.m. and pickups between 5 and 6 p.m. daily. Call Hui Pono Holoholona at 968-8279 to make an appointment. "Walk-ins are welcome, but we also need to get the word out of no food after midnight (for cats). Water is OK until the morning. And if there's food left in humane traps (for strays) please leave it alone. We'll deal with it when the cats come to us," said Frannie Pueo, Hui Pono president, who added that for cats to be sterilized, they must weigh at least 2 pounds and be in good general health. "And if they're not, Hui Pono is going to take them in until they're healthy enough to get spayed and neutered," she said.

Originally, the goal was to sterilize about 500 cats. Pueo's organization obtained a county grant of \$15,631.46 to cover lodging, ground transportation and a portion of the medical supplies. Alley Cat Allies, the largest cat advocacy organization in the U.S., kicked in \$10,255.36 to cover the remainder of the medical supplies bill. Airfare and food will be donated, as will the time and talents of veterinarians, veterinary technicians, assistants, cat trappers and other volunteers. If all were paid for, the total estimated budget would be in excess of \$116,000.

"Because we think this is so fantastic for our community, we cancelled two of our standard clinics for cats and gave \$2,000 of our spay-neuter clinic fund to increase the number of cats to be done for free from 500 to hopefully 700," Pueo said. "I use the analogy of Animal Balance as being 'Veterinarians Without Borders.' It's just unbelievable how committed they are."

Janet Snyder, spokeswoman for Mayor Harry Kim, agrees. "This is a great program that is extremely humane and effective. We strongly support this kind of initiative," Snyder said.

Emma Clifford, founder and director of Animal Balance, said there will be 22 people flying in for the mission, which she likened to "a military operation, essentially." "Five of those are cat trappers. They will be working the evening and nighttime shift, going out and mapping the areas," Clifford said. "We've been talking with the people who've been feeding the cats in the areas, getting an idea of how many cats there are in each colony that they're feeding. We've been mapping that into Google maps ... so we can see where the large numbers are. We call that 'targeted trap, neuter and return.' We're coming in and trapping where we know that there's a high density."

Clifford said local volunteers who routinely trap strays for spay-neuter clinics will help. She continued the military analogy for the veterinary component of the operation, which she called a "MASH unit." "We call it a 'mobile animal sterilization hospital,' so we play off the name," she said. "We bring in teams of veterinary techs and helpers and we create temporary animal hospitals. And that will vary in what it looks like. Sometimes, people give us old discos or old restaurants. Sometimes, we use churches. This time, we're using the old ice factory in Hilo. And we have three high-volume spay-neuter veterinarians flying in. These vets are incredible."

She said they should have the capacity to do well over 100 cats a day and added that Mayor Kim has donated the hotel for the team and our on-island transport for cats and humans and the community is pulling together to provide the team with food and drinks.

Clifford stressed that Trapped in Paradise "is a community event." "We want people to feel comfortable coming by and talking to us about the cats and what we're doing," Clifford said. "We're here for six days and we have a wealth of knowledge and experience, and we just want to share it with everybody and encourage more of these clinics in the future."

Animal Balance Brings 'Trapped in Paradise' to the Big Island, Hawaii

Animal advocates volunteering for Animal Balance will be flying to Hilo from around the world on July 15th, 2017, to join forces with Hui Pono Holoholona, Rainbow Friends and Hawaii Island Humane Society to trap, sterilize and return up to 500 community cats. The goal is to humanely reduce the community cat populations, collaborate with local organizations, and provide needed resources to increase local capacity for this strategy, often called Trapped, Neuter and Return, or TNR for short.

Together with the community, we will be holding a FREE cat clinic at: 860 Piilani Street Hilo, HI 96721 **From:** July 17th to 22nd, 2017 *Cats are to be brought to the clinic between 8-9am. Call (808) 968-8279 to make an appointment.*

Mayor Harry Kim and the County of Hawaii are kindly supporting this project through a generous donation to cover the veterinary team's accommodation and transportation. The Hilo community is very kindly coming together to donate lunches, coffee, cold drinks, coolers and other non-medical supplies that are critical to this program's on-going success.

The largest cat advocacy organization in the United States, Alley Cat Allies, is also providing support for these efforts to providing resources to community cats and caretakers on Hawaii Island. Through their generosity and dedication to the welfare of cats globally, Animal Balance will be able to provide the medical resources required to sterilize hundreds of cats. In addition, Alley Cat Allies and Animal Balance have shipped 50 humane box traps and 50 transfer cages to be utilized for the safe transport of community cats. This life-saving equipment will remain on island following our campaign, so that it may be utilized by the public for care of the cats.

Animal Balance's Team will consist of professional cat trappers, licensed veterinarians, licensed veterinary technicians, and veterinary assistants. The team will be offering trapping and sterilization services at the old Ice Cream Factory for 6 days. Animal Balance invites everyone to bring in their cats for free sterilization and free vaccinations.

Animal Balance in 2016 brought their team of Veterinarians, Vet techs and trappers eagerly prepared to service 500 animals for our community. This was held at the HIHS Kea'au location, where only 360 surgeries were done. The 28% short fall to meet their quota was due to a lack of public awareness.

July's 2017 turnout exceed 500 surgeries! 683 feline operations were performed, an increase of 37%. This increase was a result of local

animal groups working together in finding and preparing the site for the clinic, mapping out trapping sites, logistics to publicizing with radio announcements, posters, newspaper and other social media.

The Clinic was scheduled for six days to meet their quota of 500 felines. Animal Balance Team could do as much as 200 more cats, within the same time frame but they lacked those additional funds. Knowing Animal Balance could do more cats and were set up to do so, Hui Pono Holoholona cancelled one of their clinics, and transferred their spay/neuter monies to Animal Balance. That strategy was perfect as 183 more cats were done to their 500 quota for a total of 683 feline surgeries.

The great public turnout was unexpected, showing if you make no cost spay/neuter available people will come. Unfortunately, the sixth clinic day was cancelled because of running out of medication and medical supplies.


Please see the Statistical data summary sheet attached with more details. In summary 49% of the participants were from Hilo, 43% traveled from Puna, and 8% from other areas. Of the 166 participants: 98 were with 1 or 2 cats, 30 people with 3 to 5 cats, and 38 caregivers with 6 or more cats.

Over a hundred-people stood in line each day, meeting the daily surgery quota, others were asked to return the following day. This happen each day of the clinic, but good spirits prevailed. A few participants became volunteers filling the need with donations of food, newspapers, and trash hauling.

204 cats came in from the surrounding street areas near Piilani Street where the clinic was held. Emphasis to spay/neuter the cats in the Banyan area, was successful by connecting with the colony caretakers. Mahalo to Jon owner of the Ali'i Ice Company for allowing us to have the clinic at his property.

A small glitch happened when Uncle Billy's unexpectly closed, jeopardizing Animal Balance hotel reservations. Fortunately, a generous spirit of "can do Aloha" came from the Hilo Hawaiian Hotel by stepping in to honor those reservation dates at the same price at their facility.
