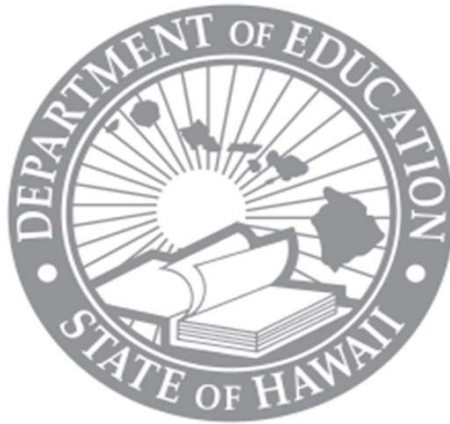

Senate Concurrent Resolution 59, S.D. 1, 2017

URGING ALL STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES TO DULY CONSIDER WOMEN-, VETERAN-, AND NATIVE HAWAIIAN-OWNED BUSINESSES WHEN AWARDING STATE CONTRACTS, AND REQUESTING ALL STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES TO SUBMIT TO THE LEGISLATURE A LIST OF STATE CONTRACTS AWARDED IN THE LAST TWO YEARS TO WOMEN-, VETERAN-, AND NATIVE HAWAIIAN-OWNED BUSINESSES.

SCR 59 SD1 (2017) was adopted by the Hawaii State Legislature to request the Department of Transportation, Department of Accounting and General Services, Department of Education, and the University of Hawaii to submit a list of state contracts issued by the respective agency to women, veteran, and Native Hawaiian owned business in the past two years.

This report includes the Department of Education's response to SCR 59 SD1 (2017). It covers the period of October 1, 2015 through October 1, 2017. All professional services contracts in the report were issued to organizations owned by women. All construction contracts were identified as Native Hawaiian owned. No veteran owned contracts were reported.

The Department of Education does not maintain data on ownership of our vendors regarding their affiliation with the groups in question. The report was compiled based on personal knowledge of our contractors by project management staff. Based on Hawaii procurement law, the Department of Education does not seek to qualify awards based on ownership affiliation and has made efforts to remain agnostic to selection criteria other than those provided for under the Hawaii Procurement Code. The Department of Education is cautious of employing discretionary criteria that could be the basis for litigation in challenging awards.

The information contained in this report pertains to A&E and construction contracts. The parameters of the report were unclear, but it appears to pertain to A&E services and the report captures construction and design contracts for the period in question.
