A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 Judiciary Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2018.

3 SECTION 2. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, is
4 amended by amending part II to read as follows:

"PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

5
6 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
7 be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
8 herein, are appropriated or authorized from the sources of
9 funding specified to the judiciary for the fiscal biennium
10 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The total
11 expenditures and the number of permanent and temporary full-time
12 equivalent positions established in each fiscal year of the
13 fiscal biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position
14 ceilings indicated for each year, except as otherwise provided
15 in this Act or as provided by general law.

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1 SECTION 3. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part III to read as follows:
3 "SECTION 7.1. Provided that of the general fund
4 appropriation for administration (JUD601), the sum of \$450,000
5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019
6 shall be expended for general civil legal services for indigent
7 residents; provided further that general civil legal services to
8 indigent residents shall be provided by legal service providers:
9 (1) With clients whose income levels do not exceed 250 per
10 cent of the applicable federal poverty level for
11 Hawaii;
12 (2) With current and valid IRS 501(c)(3) status;
13 (3) That can demonstrate that it has in place and utilizes
14 guidelines that effectively screen for income
15 eligibility and type of cases accepted;
16 (4) Whose essential mission is the provision of general
17 civil legal services and may not have as its central
18 mission the provision of specialized types of legal
19 services; and
20 (5) That complete the requisite detailed application
21 requesting funding from the governmental entity or its



1 designee responsible for the allocation of this
2 funding."

3 SECTION 4. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, is
4 amended by amending part IV to read as follows:

5 "PART IV. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

6 SECTION 8. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AUTHORIZED. The
7 sums of money appropriated or authorized in part II of this Act
8 for capital improvements shall be expended for the projects
9 listed below. Several related or similar projects may be
10 combined into a single project if such combination is
11 advantageous or convenient for implementation; provided that the
12 total cost of the projects thus combined shall not exceed the
13 total of the sums specified for the projects separately. The
14 amount after each cost element and the amount of total funding
15 for each project in this part are listed in thousands of
16 dollars.

1 SECTION 5. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, is
2 amended by amending part V to read as follows:

3 "PART V. ISSUANCE OF BONDS

4 SECTION 9. General obligation bonds may be issued, as
5 provided by law, to yield the amount that may be necessary to
6 finance projects authorized in part II and listed in part IV of
7 this Act; provided that the sum total of the general obligation
8 bonds so issued shall not exceed [~~\$9,350,000.~~] \$16,250,000."

9 SECTION 6. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, is
10 amended by adding two new sections to part VI to read as
11 follows:

12 "SECTION 11.1. All unrequired balances in the general
13 obligation bond fund, after the objectives of part II
14 appropriations for capital improvements program purposes listed
15 as projects in part IV of this Act have been met, shall be
16 transferred to the judiciary project adjustment fund.

17 SECTION 11.2. If the amount allocated from the general
18 obligation bond fund for a capital improvement project listed in
19 part IV of this Act is insufficient, the chief justice may make
20 supplemental allotments from the project adjustment fund,
21 provided that supplemental allotments shall not be used to
22 increase the scope of the project."



1 SECTION 7. If any portion of this Act or its application
2 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
3 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
4 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
5 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
6 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
7 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
8 extent possible.

9 SECTION 8. If any manifest clerical, typographical, or
10 other mechanical error is found in this Act, the chief justice
11 is authorized to correct the error. All changes made pursuant
12 to this section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
13 regular session.

14 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.


