RELATING TO CHAPTER 453, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that one of the goals of
medical licensure should be to establish access to quality
medical care and overcome geographic barriers.


The legislature further finds that additional barriers such as availability and access may exist which can impede licensure in Hawaii of qualified physicians, surgeons, and osteopathic physicians. The legislature additionally finds that licensure by endorsement will provide an expedited and efficient process for a qualified physician, surgeon, or osteopathic physician to become licensed and provide quality medical care in Hawaii.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish requirements for the licensure by endorsement of physicians, surgeons, and osteopathic physicians to practice in Hawaii. SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

5		<u>(A)</u>	Files an application and pays fees as prescribed

8			a jurisdiction that requires qualifications
9			substantially equivalent to or greater than the
10			qualifications for licensure in this State as
11			specified in section 453-4; and
12		<u>(C)</u>	Submits proof satisfactory to the board that the
13	•		applicant has actively practiced medicine in
14			another jurisdiction for at least two of the
15			immediate preceding five years; and
16	(2)	The l	ooard determines that no disciplinary action has
17		been	taken by any medical licensing authority and the
18	· ·	appl	icant has not been the subject of adverse
19		judgi	ments or settlements resulting from the practice
20		of me	edicine that the board determines constitute
21		evide	ence of a pattern of negligence or incompetence.

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1	(b) The board may require an applicant seeking licensure			
2	by endorsement to take and pass the Special Purpose Examination			
3	(SPEX) or the Comprehensive Osteopathic Medical Variable-Purpose			
4	Examination - USA (COMVEX-USA) to assist the board in			
5	determining the applicant's ability to safely and competently			
6	engage in the practice of medicine."			
7	SECTION 3. The department of commerce and consumer affairs			
8	may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76,			
9	Hawaii Revised Statutes, to assist with the implementation and			
10	continuing functions of this Act.			
11	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the compliance			
12	resolution fund established pursuant to section 26-9(0), Hawaii			
13	Revised Statutes, the sum of \$104,000 or so much thereof as may			
14	be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for purposes of			
15	implementing this Act.			
16	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of			
17	commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act.			
18	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.			
19	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018;			
20	provided that section 2 shall take effect on December 31, 2018.
