# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that abandoned vehicles
- 2 on public roads are a widespread environmental disaster that can
- 3 adversely impact human health and safety.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the counties to
- 5 remove and dispose of abandoned vehicles on public roads within
- 6 ten business days of abandonment.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 290-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 9 "(a) The counties [may] shall cause vehicles that have
- 10 been abandoned to be taken into custody [and disposed of.]
- 11 within ten business days of abandonment. For the purposes of
- 12 this subsection, a vehicle is "abandoned" if it is defined to be
- 13 abandoned by an ordinance of the county in which the vehicle is
- 14 located. In the absence of such an ordinance, a vehicle is
- 15 "abandoned" if it is left unattended for a continuous period of
- 16 more than twenty-four hours and it is unlawfully parked on any
- 17 public highway or other public property or private lands defined

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- 1 as a setback, shoulder, easement, or right of way that is
- 2 adjacent to or part of a public highway. The mayors of the
- 3 several counties may designate an agency within their counties
- 4 to carry out the functions and requirements of this section.
- 5 [The term] For the purposes of this subsection, "agency" means
- 6 any office, department, or other governmental unit of the
- 7 county."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 290-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "\$290-2 Notice to owner. (a) Upon taking custody of any
- 11 abandoned vehicle, a written notice shall immediately be sent by
- 12 registered or certified mail to the legal and registered owner
- 13 of the vehicle at the address on record at the vehicle licensing
- 14 division. The notice shall contain a brief description of the
- 15 vehicle, the location of custody, and intended disposition of
- 16 the vehicle if not repossessed within ten days after the mailing
- 17 of the notice, or in the case where the address of the
- 18 registered owner on record at the vehicle licensing division is
- 19 an out-of-state address, within twenty business days after the
- 20 mailing of the notice. A notice need not be sent to a legal or
- 21 registered owner or any person with an unrecorded interest in

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- 1 the vehicle whose name or address cannot be determined. Absent
- 2 evidence to the contrary, a notice shall be deemed received by
- 3 the legal or registered owner five days after the mailing.
- 4 (b) The county agency designated by the mayor to carry out
- 5 the functions and requirements of section 290-1 and this section
- 6 shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 regarding notification
- 7 of vehicle owners.
- 8 [(b)] (c) For purposes of this section, "business days"
- 9 shall exclude Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays."
- 10 SECTION 4. Section 290-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "§290-3 Public auction. If the vehicle is not repossessed
- 13 within the time limits provided in section 290-2, the vehicle
- 14 [shall] may be disposed of by public auction, through oral
- 15 tenders, or by sealed bids, after public advertisement has been
- 16 made once in a newspaper of general circulation; provided that
- 17 the public auction shall not be held less than five days after
- 18 the publication has been made. Where no bid is received, the
- 19 vehicle may be either sold by negotiation, disposed of or sold
- 20 as junk, or donated to any governmental agency."

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	SECTION 5. Section 290-6, nawall kevised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"\$290-8 Derelict vehicle. A vehicle shall be deemed a
4	derelict vehicle by the administrative head of the county agency
5	designated to carry out section 290-1, or by the executive
6	director or a representative of the executive director of the
7	Hawaii public housing authority in the case of a vehicle that
8	has been abandoned on property owned, managed, or administered
9	by the authority, if [major parts have] a part has been removed
10	or material damage to the vehicle has rendered the vehicle
11	inoperable and one of the following conditions exists:
12	(1) The vehicle is registered for the current registration
13	period and the registered and legal owners no longer
14	reside at the addresses on record with the county
15	director of finance;
16	(2) The vehicle has been registered for the current or
17	previous registration period and the registered and
18	legal owners disclaim ownership $[+]$ , or a notice of
19	transfer has been submitted by the registered and
20	legal owners and recorded with the director of finance
21	and the new owner has not transferred the title or

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1		registration into the new owner's name within thirty
2		days of release;
3	(3)	The vehicle identification number and license plates
4		have been removed so as to nullify efforts to locate
5		or identify the current registered and legal owners;
6	(4)	The vehicle has not been registered for the [current
7		er] previous [registration periods;] twelve month
8	•	period; or
9	(5)	The vehicle registration records of the county
10		director of finance contain no record that the vehicle
<b>11</b>		has ever been registered in the county.
12	Prior to	authorizing the removal of a derelict vehicle, the
13	administr	ative head of the county agency designated to carry out
14	section 2	90-1 or the executive director or a representative of
15	the execu	tive director of the Hawaii public housing authority in
16	the case	of vehicles that have been abandoned on property owned,
17	managed,	or operated by the authority, shall notify the county
18	chief of	police only if the vehicle is reported stolen or
19	otherwise	needed for police investigation."
20	SECT	TION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
