A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, among other things,
- 2 Act 230, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, established a legislative
- 3 oversight working group to develop and recommend legislation to
- 4 improve the medical cannabis dispensary system in the State to
- 5 ensure safe and legal access to medical cannabis for qualifying
- 6 patients. The working group is tasked with addressing issues
- 7 related to the medical cannabis dispensary program in the State,
- 8 including operations, edibles, and any issues the working group
- 9 finds relevant to the medical cannabis dispensary program.
- 10 The legislature further finds that one of the topics
- 11 considered by the working group was the potential for medical
- 12 cannabis to be reimbursable via health insurance. However,
- 13 because the issues surrounding the topic of insurance
- 14 reimbursement for medical cannabis are extremely complex, the
- 15 legislature concludes it is prudent to establish a separate
- 16 working group specifically tasked with addressing this topic.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a 2 working group to address reimbursement by health insurance for 3 medical cannabis for qualifying patients. 4 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the medical cannabis 5 insurance reimbursement working group to address the 6 complexities surrounding the topic of making medical cannabis 7 reimbursable by health insurance. The working group shall 8 explore options and make recommendations on the following 9 issues: 10 (1)Actions taken in other states; 11 (2) Potential parallel reimbursement models for other 12 types of non-prescription therapies; 13 (3) Associated liability issues for health plans; 14 The potential impact on insurance premiums; (4)15 Insurance riders for alternative therapies, which (5) 16 could serve as a model for medical cannabis 17 reimbursement; and 18 Other relevant issues that may arise, at the (6)

discretion of the working group.

- 3 (c) The working group shall be officially convened at the
- 4 pleasure of the chairs of the working group, but no later than
- 5 August 1, 2018.
- 6 (d) The working group may request assistance and feedback
- 7 from subject matter experts and other stakeholders, as needed,
- 8 to enable the working group to carry out its work.
- 9 (e) The working group shall provide periodic updates to
- 10 the legislature and shall make recommendations for any
- 11 legislative or administrative action the working group deems
- 12 appropriate to address issues surrounding health insurance
- 13 reimbursement for medical cannabis. The working group shall
- 14 submit a final report, including recommendations for further
- 15 action, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 16 the convening of the regular session of 2019.
- 17 (f) The legislative reference bureau is requested to
- 18 provide assistance, including research and drafting, to the
- 19 working group.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
