# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 312-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

"§312-2 Powers of board; special fund. The board of education may:

(1) Except as provided in section 312-3.9, make arrangements or contracts as are approved by the governor, with any county, city, association, society, person, or persons, for the purpose of benefiting the libraries and increasing their facilities and use;

(2) Subject to section 26-12, enter into ~~such~~ an arrangement or contract as is approved by the governor, with the Friends of the Library of Hawaii, affiliates of the Friends of the Library of Hawaii, and any tax-exempt nonprofit organization recognized under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code whose primary purpose is to support a state library branch, for the purpose of obtaining the use of the books and property and income of the Friends of the

3       (3)   Cooperate by exchange and otherwise with libraries now  
4           existing or hereafter to be formed;  
5       (4)   Receive, use, manage, or invest moneys or other  
6           property, real, personal, or mixed [~~which~~] that may be  
7           given, bequeathed, devised, or in any manner received  
8           from sources other than the legislature or any federal  
9           appropriation for any or all purposes of the  
10          libraries;  
11       (5)   Deposit with the director of finance in [~~a~~] the  
12          library special fund all moneys donated to the board  
13          for library services;  
14       (6)   Unless otherwise provided for by the terms and  
15           conditions of the donation, convert, at [~~such~~] the  
16           time as the board may at its sole discretion  
17           determine, any or all donations of property, real,  
18           personal, or mixed, into money to be deposited into  
19           the special fund; and



(7) Expend the moneys in the special fund in accordance with the terms and conditions of each donation for the purposes of the libraries.

The board shall be the trustee of the special fund and all moneys therein shall be deemed to have been appropriated to the use and for the purposes of the Hawaii state public library system in providing library services. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the powers and duties of the board hereinbefore expressed, or to empower the board to obligate the State financially in any sum ~~[which]~~ that shall not have been appropriated by the legislature for the use of the board."

SECTION 2. Section 312-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

"§312-3.5 Detention of ~~[books and other]~~ public library materials; penalty. (a) A person who detains ~~[a book, newspaper, plate, picture, photograph, engraving, painting, drawing, map, magazine, document, letter, government record, microform, sound recording, audio visual materials in any format, magnetic or other tapes, artifacts, or other documentary (written or printed)]~~ any public library materials belonging to any community, school, or public library ~~[or similar institution]~~



1 ~~controlled by the State~~] for one day after the due date of the  
2 public library materials, shall be subject to a nominal charge  
3 established by the board of education.

4 (b) A person detaining [~~such books or~~] any public library  
5 materials thirty days or more after the due date of the  
6 materials shall be subject to a charge commensurate with the  
7 replacement value of the [~~books or~~] public library materials."

8 SECTION 3. Section 312-3.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
9 amended to read as follows:

10 "§312-3.7 [~~Hawaii state library foundation trust~~] Friends  
11 of the library of Hawaii program fund. (a) There is  
12 established as a separate fund of the [~~Hawaii state library~~  
13 ~~foundation,~~] Friends of the Library of Hawaii, a Hawaii  
14 nonprofit corporation, the [~~Hawaii state library foundation~~  
15 ~~trust~~] friends of the library of Hawaii program fund. All  
16 [~~funds~~] moneys contributed to the [~~trust~~] fund, including income  
17 and capital gains earned therefrom, shall be used exclusively  
18 for state library programs as defined in the articles, bylaws,  
19 resolutions, and other instruments executed on behalf of the  
20 [~~Hawaii state library foundation~~] Friends of the Library of  
21 Hawaii or by the state librarian. The [~~trust~~] fund may receive



1 any and all types of private contributions, and the income and  
2 capital gains earned by the fund; provided that [~~funds~~] moneys  
3 or properties donated for library use and patrons' deposits  
4 shall be deposited and accounted for in accordance with rules  
5 adopted by the comptroller. The [~~trust~~] fund shall be subject  
6 to the following restrictions:

7 (1) All [~~funds,~~] moneys, and the income and capital gains  
8 earned by investment of those [~~funds,~~] moneys, shall  
9 be expended only for the support of state library  
10 programs; and

11 (2) Other restrictions imposed by the legislature with  
12 respect to the transfer or appropriation of [~~funds,~~]  
13 moneys.

14 (b) Any [~~funds~~] moneys deposited in the [~~trust~~] fund, and  
15 any income and capital gains earned therefrom, not used for  
16 state library programs, shall be invested in accordance with the  
17 provisions of the articles, bylaws, resolutions, or other  
18 instruments executed on behalf of the [~~Hawaii state library~~  
19 ~~foundation,~~] Friends of the Library of Hawaii, and in a manner  
20 intended to maximize the rate of return on investment of the  
21 fund.



1 (c) If the ~~[trust]~~ fund is terminated or the ~~[Hawaii state~~  
2 ~~library foundation]~~ Friends of the Library of Hawaii is  
3 dissolved, all ~~[funds,]~~ moneys, including the income and capital  
4 gains earned by the investment of ~~[funds,]~~ moneys, shall be  
5 distributed in accordance with the articles and bylaws of the  
6 ~~[Hawaii state library foundation.]~~ Friends of the Library of  
7 Hawaii.

8 (d) The ~~[Hawaii state library foundation]~~ Friends of the  
9 Library of Hawaii shall require an annual audit of the ~~[trust]~~  
10 fund, the results of which shall be submitted to the board of  
11 education and the legislature not more than thirty days after  
12 receipt by the ~~[foundation.]~~ Friends of the Library of Hawaii.  
13 The ~~[foundation]~~ Friends of the Library of Hawaii shall retain  
14 for a period of three years, any documents, papers, books,  
15 records, and other evidence that is pertinent to the ~~[trust]~~  
16 fund, and permit inspection or access thereto by the board of  
17 education, the state librarian, the department of accounting and  
18 general services, state legislators, and the state auditor, or  
19 their duly authorized representatives.

20 (e) The purpose of this section is to create by statute a  
21 private charitable ~~[trust]~~ fund to financially support state



1 library programs. The [~~trust~~] fund shall be subject to the  
2 terms and conditions provided in this section. The [~~trust~~] fund  
3 shall not be placed in the state treasury and the State shall  
4 not administer the fund nor be liable for its operation or  
5 solvency. The fund shall be a private charitable [~~trust fund~~  
6 ~~administered by a private trust company as trustee.~~] account in  
7 a federally insured financial institution with such account  
8 being held in the name of the Friends of the Library of Hawaii."

9 SECTION 4. Section 312-3.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
10 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

11 "(b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all net  
12 proceeds received by the Friends of the Library of Hawaii from  
13 the operation of any concession, vending machine, or other  
14 activity through a state-wide contract within, or on the grounds  
15 of, any state library facility shall be deposited into the  
16 Friends of the Library of Hawaii [~~trust~~] program fund. All  
17 funds deposited into the [~~trust~~] program fund, including income  
18 and capital gains earned therefrom, shall be used exclusively  
19 for state library programs."

20 SECTION 5. Section 312-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
21 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:





1       "(a) The state librarian shall:

2       (1) Provide for the establishment and ongoing operation of  
3       a fee for enhanced [~~service~~] services program, which  
4       includes but is not limited to the planning,  
5       programming, and budgeting of operating, research and  
6       development, and capital investment programs; and

7       (2) Administer a special fund to be known as the "library  
8       fee for enhanced services special fund".

9       (b) Notwithstanding [~~sections~~] section 312-3.6 [~~and 312-~~  
10   4], all moneys collected through the fee for enhanced services  
11   program shall be deposited into the library fee for enhanced  
12   services special fund established under section 312-22."

13       SECTION 6. Section 312-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
14   amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:

15       "(b) The special fund shall be administered by the state  
16   librarian who[, ~~after consultation with the library advisory~~  
17   ~~committee,~~] shall determine the annual amount that each public  
18   library shall receive. Allocations shall be based on the  
19   balance in the special fund on the first day of each fiscal year  
20   and made in quarterly installments not more than thirty days  
21   after the close of each fiscal quarter.



1 (c) Moneys allocated from the special fund shall be used  
2 by each community, school, or public library to operate its fee  
3 for enhanced services program. Each library shall post in a  
4 conspicuous place a list of expenditures made by the library  
5 from the special fund during the preceding fiscal quarter."

6 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.


