### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LICENSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that under existing law, 2 audiologists must be licensed as an audiologist under chapter 3 468E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and as a hearing aid dealer and 4 fitter, pursuant to chapter 451A, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 5 However, the legislature notes that an applicant for an 6 audiologist license must meet education, examination, and 7 training requirements that far surpass the licensing requirements for a hearing aid dealer and fitter. 8 The 9 legislature further finds that requiring audiologists to hold 10 dual licensure as an audiologist and a hearing aid dealer and 11 fitter is redundant and burdensome, as audiologist licensing 12 requirements are more stringent than hearing aid dealer and 13 fitter licensing requirements.

14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

15 (1) Clarify that the licensing requirements for hearing16 aid dealers and fitters shall not apply to

17 audiologists licensed pursuant to chapter 468E, Hawaii

17	(2) Satisfactory proof that the person has fulfilled all
