A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AND WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the number of women graduating with degrees in computer science has decreased nationwide from thirty-seven percent in 1985 to eighteen percent in 2015. Women currently comprise only twenty-four percent of the computing workforce. At the same time, computing jobs in the
- 6 United States are growing at three times the rate of overall job
- 7 creation. In 2015 there were more than a half million open
- 8 computing jobs in the nation, but only forty-thousand computer
- 9 science graduates.
- 10 The legislature also finds that Hawaii has the goal of
- 11 increasing the number of technology jobs in the state and will
- 12 require a well-trained and competent workforce to fill these
- 13 positions. Increasing the number of women earning degrees in
- 14 computer science allows women to enter this growing job market
- 15 and increase their quality of life.
- 16 The legislature also finds that while progress has been
- 17 made in certain subjects through successful implementation of

- 1 the STEM initiatives, there are fewer advanced placement exams
- 2 taken in computer science than in any other STEM subject area.
- 3 In Hawaii thirty-three percent of advanced placement computer
- 4 science exam takers were female.
- 5 The legislature also finds that other higher learning
- 6 institutions have taken measures that have successfully
- 7 increased the number of women majoring in computer science by
- 8 providing a learning environment that is supportive of women.
- 9 Higher learning institutions that have made the effort to market
- 10 and tailor courses in computer science to women have seen an
- 11 increase in women enrolled in these degree programs.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 13 center for women in technology within the University of Hawaii
- 14 department of information and computer sciences.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 §304A- Center for women in technology; establishment. (a)
- 19 There is established at the University of Hawaii, within the
- 20 department of information and computer sciences, the center for
- 21 women in technology. The center for women in technology shall:

- 1 (1) Advise and assist to develop marketing and outreach to
- 2 build interest in the computer science program among women.
- 3 (2) Review current curriculum and adopt teaching methods
- 4 that are female friendly and guard against gender-based
- 5 stereotypes.
- 6 (3) Set measurable goals to increase the number of women
- 7 enrolled in the department of information and computer sciences
- 8 and to build interest in the field among current and future
- 9 female students.
- 10 (4) Coordinate programs with middle and high schools such
- 11 as mentoring, summer workshops, after-school courses, and
- 12 similar programs in computer science.
- 13 (5) The center shall serve as the clearinghouse for matters
- 14 involving women in computer science in the state.
- 15 (b) The affairs and operations of the center for women in
- 16 technology shall be administered by a director appointed by and
- 17 responsible to the chancellor of the University of Hawaii. The
- 18 center for women in technology shall draw on existing personnel
- 19 within the state government as much as possible for necessary
- 20 supplementation. Where demand for programs and services exceeds
- 21 the capabilities of the permanent staff as supplemented,

1	additional	personnel	resources	may be	e acquired	on	a	contract

- 2 basis without regard to chapter 76. Permanent staff shall be
- 3 covered by chapter 76 or section 304A-1002 as may be
- 4 appropriate.
- 5 (c) The center for women in technology shall receive the
- 6 full cooperation of all state agencies in the use of staff
- 7 members, facilities, and other resources necessary to accomplish
- 8 the purposes of this subpart.
- 9 (d) The director shall prepare an annual report to the
- 10 legislature on the status of the program and overall
- 11 achievement. The annual report shall be submitted no later than
- 12 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular legislative
- 13 session
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
