A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION I.	The	registature	Ilnas	tnat	President	Barack

- 2 Obama issued Presidential Proclamation 9478 on August 26, 2016,
- 3 expanding the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument to
- 4 provide critical protections for more than seven thousand marine
- 5 species, including whales and sea turtles listed under the
- 6 Endangered Species Act and the longest-living marine species in
- 7 the world, black coral, which live longer than four thousand
- $oldsymbol{8}$ five hundred years. Additionally, as ocean acidification,
- 9 warming, and other impacts of climate change threaten marine
- 10 ecosystems, expanding the monument will improve ocean
- 11 resilience, help the region's distinct physical and biological
- 12 resources adapt, and create a natural laboratory that will allow
- 13 scientists to monitor and explore the impacts of climate change
- 14 on these fragile ecosystems.
- 15 The expanded monument area also contains resources of great
- 16 historical and cultural significance. The expanded area,
- 17 including the archipelago and its adjacent waters, is considered

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- 1 a sacred place for the Native Hawaiian community. It plays a
- 2 significant role in Native Hawaiian creation and settlement
- 3 stories, and is used to practice important activities like
- 4 traditional long-distance voyaging and wayfinding.
- 5 Additionally, within the monument expansion area, there are
- 6 shipwrecks and downed aircraft from the Battle of Midway during
- 7 World War II, a battle that marked a major shift in the progress
- 8 of the war in favor of the Allies.
- 9 The legislature further finds that Proclamation 9478
- 10 directs federal agencies to work together with the State to
- 11 create a joint management plan by August 26, 2019, and adopt
- 12 implementing regulations, as appropriate, that address any
- 13 further specific actions necessary for the proper care and
- 14 management of the monument.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to establish the
- 16 Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program to coordinate
- 17 and fulfill the State's role and responsibilities in co-managing
- 18 the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument.
- 19 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 20 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 21 as follows:

1	"CHAPTER
2	PAPAHANAUMOKUAKEA MARINE NATIONAL MONUMENT PROGRAM
3	§ -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to
4	establish the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program
5	to coordinate and fulfill the State's role and responsibilities
6	in co-managing the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument.
7	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
8	"Board" means the board of land and natural resources.
9	"Department" means the department of land and natural
10	resources.
11	"Monument" means the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National
12	Monument as established by Proclamation 8031 of June 15, 2006
13	(71 Fed. Reg. 36443), as amended by Proclamation 8112 of
14	February 28, 2007 (72 Fed. Reg. 10029), and as expanded by
15	Proclamation 9478 of August 26, 2016 (81 Fed. Reg. 60225), under
16	the authority of title 54 United States Code Annotated section
17	320301.
18	"Program" means the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National
19	Monument program.
20	§ -3 Lead agency. The department is designated as the
21	lead agency of the State to co-manage the monument in accordance

- 1 with Proclamation 8031 of June 15, 2006 (71 Fed. Reg. 36443),
- 2 and expanded by Proclamation 9478 of August 26, 2016 (81 Fed.
- 3 Reg. 60225), and the December 8, 2006, memorandum of agreement
- 4 between the department; United States Department of the
- 5 Interior, United States Fish and Wildlife Service; and the
- 6 United States Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and
- 7 Atmospheric Administration. The State of Hawaii, office of
- 8 Hawaiian affairs, United States Secretary of Commerce, and
- 9 United States Secretary of the Interior formalized an agreement
- 10 on January 12, 2017, which adds the office of Hawaiian affairs
- 11 as a co-trustee of the monument.
- 12 As the designated lead agency, the department shall
- 13 exercise its stewardship responsibility for managing,
- 14 administering, and exercising control over lands, waters, and
- 15 natural resources within the State's jurisdiction. As the lead
- 16 agency for the State, the department shall also collaborate with
- 17 the office of Hawaiian affairs in the perpetuation of Hawaiian
- 18 cultural resources within the monument, including the customary
- 19 and traditional rights and practices of native Hawaiians
- 20 exercised for subsistence, cultural, and religious purposes
- 21 under section 7 of article XII of the state constitution.

2	(a) Ther	e is established the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National
3	Monument	program to be placed within the department's division
4	of aquati	c resources to coordinate and fulfill the State's
5	managemen	t responsibilities for the monument.
6	(b)	The department may:
7	(1)	Issue permits as part of the co-trustee monument
8		permit process consistent with applicable state laws,
9		the Proclamation 8031 of June 15, 2006 (71 Fed. Reg.
10		36443), as expanded by Proclamation 9478 of August 26,
11		2016 (81 Fed. Reg. 60225) and title 50 Code of Federal
12		Regulations part 404;
13	(2)	Provide advice and recommendations to the governor,
14		the department, and other state departments and
15		agencies on any matter relating to the management of
16		the monument;
17	(3)	Solicit and accept grants, donations, and
18		contributions to support the purposes of this chapter;
19	(4)	Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to effectuate this
20		chapter; and

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1	(5)	Take other actions as the department deems necessary
2		to effectively manage the natural and cultural
3		resources of the monument.
4	(c)	The department may charge fees that are proportional
5	to the na	ture and complexity of the projects or services
6	performed	by the program, such as the issuance of permits;
7	provided	that:
8	(1)	Fees shall be charged in accordance with a schedule
9		approved by the board;
10	(2)	The proposed fee schedule shall be posted on the
11		department's website at least forty-five days prior to
12		the board meeting at which adoption will be
13		considered;
14	(3)	The board shall consider and adopt the fee schedule at
15		a regular meeting after taking public testimony; and
16	(4)	The setting of fees shall not be subject to chapter
17		91.
18	(d)	Except as otherwise provided by law, the board or its
19	duly author	orized representative may impose general administrative
20	penalties	for any person violating this chapter or any rule
21	adopted u	nder this chapter, including any term or condition of

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- 1 any permit issued under this chapter, as provided by section
- 2 187A-12.5."
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 6 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 7 year 2018-2019 for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 9 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
