A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HEALTH IMPACT OF PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and			
3	to read as follows:			
4	"PART . PESTICIDE BUFFER ZONES AROUND SCHOOLS			
5	§321-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the			
6	context clearly requires otherwise:			
7	"Certified pesticide applicator" has the same meaning as in			
8	section 149A-2.			
9	"Commercial pesticide applicator" has the same meaning as			
10	in section 149A-2.			
11	"Department" means the department of health.			
12	"Experimental use pesticide" means a pesticide whose use is			
13	authorized by an experimental use permit by either the			
14	Environmental Protection Agency or the department.			
15	"General use pesticide" has the same meaning as in section			
16	149A-2.			
17	"Health" means physical and mental health.			



1	"Outdoor application" means an application of a pesticide			
2	made outside of a building or enclosed structure. The term			
3	excludes indoor applications of pesticides and structural or			
4	termite application of pesticides, regardless of whether such			
5	applications are applied inside or outside of a building or			
6	enclosed structure.			
7	"Pest control operator" has the same meaning as in section			
8	149A-2.			
9	"Pesticide" has the same meaning as in section 149A-2.			
10	"Public school" has the same meaning as in section 302A-			
11	101.			
12	"Restricted use pesticide" has the same meaning as in			
13	section 149A-2.			
14	§321-B Pesticide buffer zones for schools. (a) Beginning			
15	on July 1, 2018, any entity or person that uses or purchases in			
16	excess of pounds or gallons of pesticides annually			
17	shall restrict the outdoor application of all pesticides,			
18	including restricted use, general use, or experimental use			
19	pesticides, to no closer than feet from the property line			
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1	(b)	If a more restrictive standard is set forth in the	
2	informatio	on contained on the label of the pesticide, or by other	
3	regulatior	ns, including county ordinances or rules, the more	
4	restrictiv	ve standard shall apply.	
5	(c)	Any entity or person subject to this section shall	
6	ensure that	at prior to any outdoor application of pesticides	
7	pursuant t	to subsection (a), the application site is positively	
8	identified using a unique and verifiable method, including:		
9	(1)	An onboard, geo-referenced electronic mapping and	
10		navigation system, such as the Global Positioning	
11		System;	
12	(2)	Effective site markings visible to the pesticide	
13		applicator; or	
14	(3)	Other methods approved by the department.	
15	(d)	Any entity or person that is subject to this section,	
16	prior to a	any application of pesticides, shall provide the	
17	certified	pesticide applicator, commercial pesticide applicator,	
18	or pest co	ontrol operator with a site plan that includes a site	
19	map that:		
20	(1)	Delineates the boundaries of the application area and	

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the property lines;

6	§321-C	Exemptions. Notwithstanding the provisions of this		
7	part, any er	ntity or person subject to section 321-B may obtain		
8	from the dep	partment a single-use exemption from the prohibition		
9	on outdoor a	applications of pesticides in pesticide buffer zones		
10	for public schools, as provided in section 321-B(a). The			
11	department shall issue a single-use exemption if it determines			
12	that:			
13	(1) Tł	ne pest situation poses an immediate threat to human		
14	he	ealth and the environment; and		
15	(2) Th	nere is no viable alternative to the use of the		
16	pı	roposed pesticide.		
17	§321-D	Rules. The department of health shall adopt rules		
18	pursuant to	chapter 91 necessary to effectuate this part.		
19	§321-E	County authority. Nothing in this part shall be		
20	construed to	o prohibit or preempt the authority of a unit of		
21	local govern	nment in the State of Hawaii, including counties and		



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any other political subdivisions created under article VIII,
section 1, of the Hawaii State Constitution, to regulate
pesticide disclosure, notification, and use in a manner that is
equivalent to or more restrictive than the provisions contained
in this part."

6 SECTION 2. If any provision of this Act, or the 7 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 8 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 9 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the 10 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 11 of this Act are severable.

SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section 13 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 14 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 15 the new sections in this Act.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.17
