A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MINIMUM WAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 387-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:

12	paroled from the Hawaii youth correctional facility,

14	[such] wages lower than the applicable minimum wage
15	and subject to [such] limitations as to time, number,
16	proportion, and length of service as the director
17	shall prescribe[; and

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1.	(2)	Of individuals whose earning capacity is impaired by
2		old age or physical or mental deficiency or injury,
3		under special certificates issued by the director, at
4		such wages lower than the applicable minimum wage and
5	·	for such period as shall be fixed in the
6		certificates].
7	(b)	The director [may], by rule, may prescribe standards
8	and requi	rements to ensure that this section will not create a
9	substanti	al probability of reducing the full-time employment
10	opportuni	ties of persons other than those to whom the special
11	minimum w	age rate authorized by this section is applicable.
12	(c)	No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
13	each regu	lar session, the department shall submit an annual
14	report to	the legislature of its findings and recommendations,
15	including	any proposed legislation, relating to:
16	(1)	The sustainable employment opportunities of
17		individuals working at a subminimum wage prior to the
18		effective date of Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2018;

20	(2)	Efforts by the department to increase employment
21		opportunities for individuals with disabilities."
