

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACANCIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 17-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

3 "§17-3 State senator. (a) Whenever any vacancy in the

4 membership of the state senate occurs, the term of which ends at

the next succeeding general election:

calendar days following the first day of vacancy to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term by selecting a person from a list of three prospective appointees submitted by the same political party as the prior incumbent. The appointee shall be at the time of appointment, and for at least six months immediately prior to the appointment, a member of the political party. The appointee shall, at the time of appointment, be a resident of the same senate district as the prior incumbent. The political party shall submit the list of prospective appointees to the

- If the prior incumbent was not a member of any 3 (2) political party, the governor shall, within sixty 4 calendar days following the first day of vacancy, 5 appoint a person who is at the time of appointment a 6 7 resident of the same senate district as the prior 8 incumbent and who is not, and has not been for at 9 least six months prior to the appointment, a member of 10 any political party.
- (b) In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not end at the next succeeding general election:
- If it occurs not later than on the tenth day prior to 13 (1) the close of filing for the next succeeding primary 14 15 election, as specified in section 12-6, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next 16 succeeding general election. The chief election 17 18 officer shall issue a proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy. Notwithstanding any 19 law to the contrary, all candidates for the unexpired 20 21 term shall file nomination papers not later than the

1	date and time specified in section 12-6 for the next
2	succeeding primary election. All candidates for the
3	unexpired term shall be nominated and elected in
4	accordance with this title. Pending the election, the
5	governor shall make a temporary appointment to fill
6	the vacancy, and the person so appointed shall serve
7	until the election of the person duly elected to fill
8	the vacancy. The governor shall make the appointment
9	from a list of three prospective appointees submitted
10	by the same political party as the prior incumbent.
11	The appointee shall be, at the time of the
12	appointment, and shall have been, for at least six
13	months immediately prior to the appointment, a member
14	of the political party. The appointee shall, at the
15	time of appointment, be a resident of the same senate
16	district as the prior incumbent. If the prior
17	incumbent was not a member of any political party, the
18	governor shall appoint a person who is at the time of
19	appointment a resident of the same senate district as
20	the prior incumbent and is not and has not been, for

1		at least six months immediately prior to the
2		appointment, a member of any political party;
3	(2)	If it occurs later than on the tenth day prior to the
4		close of filing for the next succeeding primary
5		election but not later than [on the sixtieth day prior
6		to] the close of filing for the next succeeding
7		primary election, or if there are no qualified
8		candidates for any party or nonpartisan candidates
9		qualified for the primary election ballot,
10		notwithstanding any law to the contrary, nominations
11		for the unexpired term may be filed not later than
12		4:30 p.m. on the [fiftieth day prior to the next
13		succeeding primary election.] tenth day after the
14		vacancy occurred, but if the day is a Saturday,
15		Sunday, or holiday, then at 4:30 p.m. on the first
16		working day immediately thereafter. The chief
17		election officer shall issue a proclamation
18		designating the election for filling the vacancy.
19		Pending the election the governor shall make a
20		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
21		person appointed shall serve until the election of the

1		person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The governor
2		shall make the appointment from a list of three
3		prospective appointees submitted by the same political
4		party as the prior incumbent. The appointee shall be,
5		at the time of the appointment, and shall have been,
6		for at least six months immediately prior to the
7		appointment, a member of the political party. The

1	there are no qualified candidates for any party or
2	nonpartisan candidates in the primary, the vacancy
3	shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next
4	succeeding general election. The chief election
5	officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
6	election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates
7	for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by
8	the county committees of the parties and the county
9	committees of the parties shall notify the chief
10	election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the
11	[fortieth] seventy-fifth day prior to the general
12	election; provided that each nominated candidate fills
13	out an application for nomination papers and signs the
14	proper certification on the nomination paper and takes
15	either an oath or affirmation as provided by law;
16	nonpartisan candidates may file nomination papers for
17	the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m. on the
18	[fortieth] seventy-fifth day prior to the general
19	election with the nonpartisan candidate who is to be
20	nominated to be decided by lot, under the supervision
21	of the chief election officer. The candidates for the

	unexpired term shall be elected in accordance with
	this title. Pending the election, the governor shall
	make a temporary appointment to fill the vacancy, and
•	the person appointed shall serve until the election of
	the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The

12		senate district as the prior incumbent. If the prior
13		incumbent was not a member of any political party, the
14		governor shall appoint a person who is at the time of
15		appointment a resident of the same senate district as
16		the prior incumbent and is not and has not been, for
17		at least six months immediately prior to the
18		appointment, a member of any political party."

matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
