A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SAFETY HELMETS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The department of health advocated in its
- 2 Hawai'i Injury Prevention Plan for 2012-2017 for a universal
- 3 moped and motorcycle helmet law to increase traffic safety. The
- 4 plan cited a study that concluded that helmets reduced the risk
- 5 of death by forty-two per cent and the risk of head injury by
- 6 sixty-nine per cent for riders involved in an accident.
- 7 Between 2007 and 2011, motorcycle deaths were the sixth
- 8 leading cause of fatal unintentional injuries in Hawaii. During
- 9 that same period, fifteen bicyclists died.
- 10 The legislature finds that a universal safety helmet law
- 11 would increase traffic safety in Hawaii.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require all operators and
- 13 riders of motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and bicycles to
- 14 wear protective or safety helmets.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 286-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:

15		For	the purpose of meeting the requirements of this

19	(2)	Leas	e or rent a motorcycle or motor scooter to another
20		pers	on unless the person furnishes:

1	(A)	Safety glasses, goggles, or a face shield, in the
2		case of a motorcycle or motor scooter that is not
3		equipped with windscreens or windshields; [and]
4	(B)	A safety helmet that has a chin strap; provided
5		that any person to whom a motorcycle or motor
6		scooter is leased or rented may furnish a safety
7		helmet for the person's own use; and
8	[(B)]	(C) Any other protective devices required by the
9		rules adopted by the director for the use of the
10		person or persons intending to operate or ride as
11		a passenger on the motorcycle or motor scooter;
12		provided that any person to whom a motorcycle or
13		motor scooter is leased or rented may furnish for
14		the person's own use the protective devices
15		required by this part.
16	For	the purposes of meeting the requirements of this
17	para	graph, a required device shall meet the
18	spec	ifications and requirements established by rules
19	adop	ted by the director; or
20	(3) Sell	or offer for sale or furnish any safety helmet,
21	safe	ty glasses, goggles, face shield, windscreen,

1	windshield, or other protective devices represented to
2	meet the requirements of this part unless the device
3	meets the specifications and requirements established
4	by rules adopted by the director.
5	[(b) No person less than eighteen years of age shall
6	operate or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor scooter
7	on any highway in the State unless the person wears a safety
8	helmet securely fastened with a chin strap.
9	(c) A] (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) to the
10	contrary, a safety helmet shall not be required for any person
11	who operates or rides as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor
12	scooter; provided that the motorcycle or motor scooter:
13	(1) Has three wheels;
14	(2) Is powered by an electric motor;
15	(3) Has a full body enclosed cab; and
16	(4) Has a seat belt assembly or a child restraint system
17	for the driver and passenger;
18	and the operator and passenger uses the seat belt or child
19	restraint system pursuant to sections 291-11.5 and 291-11.6."
20	SECTION 3. Section 291C-150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended to read as follows:

1	[+] \$291C-150[+] Bicycle Helmets. (a) No person [under
2	sixteen years of age] shall operate a bicycle upon a street,
3	bikeway, or any other public property unless that person is
4	wearing a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet that has
5	been tested by a nationally recognized agency such as the
6	National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the National
7	Safety Council, or the Children's Safety Network, and is
8	designed to fit the user and protect against head trauma. This
9	requirement also applies to a person who rides upon a bicycle
10	while in a restraining seat that is attached to the bicycle or
11	who rides in a trailer towed by the bicycle.
12	(b) A person who provides bicycles for hire shall not rent
13	a bicycle to any person unless every person [who is under age
14	sixteen] is wearing a bicycle helmet, as required in subsection
15	(a), while operating the rented bicycle, occupying a restraining
16	seat that is attached to the rented bicycle, or riding in a
17	trailer towed by the rented bicycle.
18	(c) A violation of this section is punishable by a fine of
19	not more than \$25[-]; provided that:
20	(1) A person who provides bicycles for hire shall not be

in violation of subsection (b) or liable for the

T	amount of the fine if the person demonstrates that the
2	person to whom the bicycle was rented was wearing a
3	safety helmet at the time the bicycle was rented; and
4	(2) The parent or legal guardian having control or custody
5	of an unemancipated minor whose conduct violates this
6	section shall be liable for the amount of the fine
7	imposed pursuant to this section.
8	(d) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the fines
9	collected for a violation of this section shall be paid into the
10	state treasury to the credit of the state general fund."
11	SECTION 4. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
13	"(a) No person less than fifteen years of age shall drive
14	a moped on a highway, street, roadway, or any other public
15	property in the State. No person [less than eighteen years of
16	age] shall drive a moped unless the person wears a safety helmet
17	securely fastened with a chin strap. The safety helmet shall
18	meet the specifications and requirements established by rules
19	adopted by the director."
20	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
